The Vance County Board of Elections has responsibility for conducting Federal, State, and local elections within the County. The North Carolina General Statutes Chapter 163 and other applicable statutes govern the Vance County Board of Elections. The department has responsibility for managing the voter registration information within Vance County.

FAQ's

- Q.** Where do I get a Voter Application Form?
A. You can download the Form from our county web site by clicking this link to our county ON LINE FORM and print out the North Carolina Voter Registration Application Update Form or click on to the State Board of Election and print the North Carolina Voter Registration Application Update Form.
- Q.** How do I change my voter information?
A. You will fill out the same North Carolina Voter Registration Application Update Form as above and send it to the Vance County Board of Elections.
- Q.** How do I know if I'm registered or not?
A. You will need to call the Vance County Board of Elections office at 252-492-3730.
- Q.** How do I know where to I would go to vote?
A. When you register or make an address change, the Vance County Board of Elections will send you a new voter card. Your precinct name, polling place (where you vote) is printed on that card. Also, printed on that card are your County Commissioner District, School Board District, NC State House District, NC State Senate District, Congressional District, and Judicial District.
- Q.** When is the deadline to register to vote in any Election?
A. If mailed, the registration form must be postmarked at least twenty-five days prior to the election. If it's hand-delivered, the registration form must be received by the Board of Elections office no later than 5:00 PM on the 25th day prior to the Election.
- Q.** If I'm a felony and have completed my time, what do I need to do to be able to vote?
A. Once you have completed your time, including probation period, you must fill out a North Carolina Voter Registration Application Update Form and send it to the Board of Elections.
