EXPLANATION OF THE REQUEST

This is a request to rezone one .53 acre tract currently zoned R30 (Residential Low Density) to AR (Agricultural Residential). If a rezoning is granted, the property will then be recombined into an adjacent 22 acre tract for future subdivision under an estate.

PROPERTY INFORMATION

LOCATION: 739 Hicksboro Rd, Tax parcel ID# 0405 02022

EXISTING LAND USE: The parcel is currently zoned R30 (low density residential) Property is a vacant .53 acre tract.

SIZE: The tract consists of .53 acres or 23,086 square feet. The tract has approximately 161ft. of road frontage along Hicksboro Rd.

SURROUNDING LAND USE: The immediate area consists of AR and R30 zoned property. The area is rural and consists of single family homes and farm land.

ZONING HISTORY: All parcels in this area are zoned as they were since countywide zoning was established in November 2011.

IMPACTS

This rezoning will not change the use for the property or those adjacent. Rezoning the property will allow the heirs to recombine the lot into a larger AR zoned tract, which they plan to then divide under an estate division.

STAFF COMMENTS

The lot currently meets or exceeds the road frontage requirement for R30, but does not meet the acreage requirement of 30,000 sq. ft. Rezoning and then recombining the lot would more than satisfy the minimum lot size and lot width requirement for AR.

The planning board should consider the following factors in deciding this case:

- A. The proposal will place all property similarly situated in the area in the same category, or in appropriate complementary categories.
- B. There is convincing demonstration that all uses permitted under the proposed zone classification would be in the general public interest and not merely in the interest of an individual or small group.

- C. There is convincing demonstration that all uses permitted under the proposed zone classification would be appropriate in the area included in the proposed change. (When a new zone designation is assigned, any use permitted in the zone is allowable, so long as it meets zone requirements, and not merely uses which applicants state that they intend to make of the property involved.)
- D. There is convincing demonstration that the character of the neighborhood will not be materially or adversely affected by any use permitted in the proposed change.
- E. The proposed change is in accord with the County Land Use Plan and sound planning principles.

Staff believes it is reasonable for the property to be rezoned from R30 to AR to meet the neighborhood needs.

PLANNING BOARD RECOMMENDATION:

The planning board voted unanimously to recommend the rezoning request with the condition that the additional heirs sign both the plat and the application.

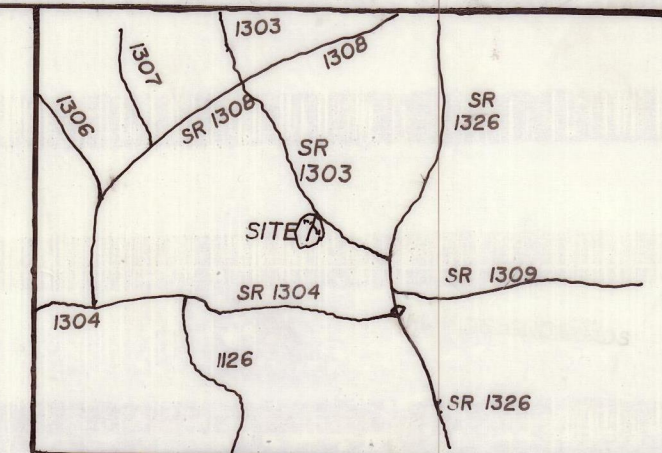

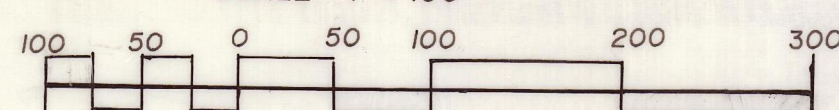

EXPLANATION OF THE REQUEST

This is a request to rezone 62.51 acres, known as Huntstone Pines, Tax Parcel # 0412 02001, from R20 (Residential Medium Density) to R10 (Residential High Density). Some lots within the newly proposed phase of Huntstone Subdivision do not meet the minimum lot size requirement of 20,000 sq. ft., or the minimum lot width of 80' for the R20 zoning. In order to comply with the R20 lot size requirement, several lots would have had to be eliminated. Rezoning the tract to R10 would allow the applicant to meet the lot size and the lot width requirements for R10 zoning (10,000 sq. ft., 75' minimum width) and would also eliminate the need for a previously proposed pump station under R20.

LOCATION: Hwy 158 Business

EXISTING LAND USE: The parcel is currently zoned R20, requiring 20,000 sq. Ft. per parcel and 80' of lot width/road frontage. One single family dwelling is allowed per lot.

SIZE: The tract consists of 62.51 acres. Applicant is proposing 119 lots under an R10 Zoning.

SURROUNDING LAND USE: The property is bordered on the west by property zoned AR, and on the east property zoned R20. Property to the north zoned GC1, or General Commercial, and property to the south is zoned R20 and is known as Huntstone Subdivision, consisting of phases I, II and III. These were established prior to Vance County adopting a zoning ordinance in 2011.

ZONING HISTORY: All parcels in the previous Huntstone Subdivision phases were established prior to Vance County adopting a Land Development Ordinance and may or may not meet the current zoning of R20.

IMPACTS

This rezoning will not change the use for the property or those adjacent. Rezoning the property will allow the developer to meet the zoning requirements for R10, 10,000 sq. ft. per lot, 75' minimum lot width. Per the Vance County Subdivision and Zoning Ordinance, lots served by cul de sac will be allowed to meet the 75' lot width requirement at the setback line versus the right of way line. (Section 3, 3.2, E., VC Zoning Ordinance)

STAFF COMMENTS

Applicant has demonstrated the ability to comply with an R10 zoning, evidenced by presentation of a preliminary plat on which lot size and lot width measurements are displayed and meet the requirements set forth by the GC Subdivision Ordinance and the VC Zoning Ordinance.

The planning board should consider the following factors in deciding this case:

- A. The proposal will place all property similarly situated in the area in the same category, or in appropriate complementary categories.
- B. There is convincing demonstration that all uses permitted under the proposed zone classification would be in the general public interest and not merely in the interest of an individual or small group.
- C. There is convincing demonstration that all uses permitted under the proposed zone classification would be appropriate in the area included in the proposed change. (When a new zone designation is assigned, any use permitted in the zone is allowable, so long as it meets zone requirements, and not merely uses which applicants state that they intend to make of the property involved.)
- D. There is convincing demonstration that the character of the neighborhood will not be materially or adversely affected by any use permitted in the proposed change.
- E. The proposed change is in accord with the County Land Use Plan and sound planning principles.

Staff believes it is reasonable for the property to be rezoned from R20 to R10 to meet the neighborhood needs.

PLANNING BOARD RECOMMENDATION:

The planning board recommended in two motions the request by the applicant to rezone this portion of Huntstone Subdivision. The first motion was to recommend the rezoning, with the condition of having a boundary survey done of the area to be rezoned and to exclude lots 166, 167 and 195 from the rezoning request, to remain R20. The motion carried by a majority of the voting members.

The second motion was to recommend that lots 218, 217, 71 and 70 be included in the R10 rezoning. The second motion carried by a majority of the voting members.

Potentially. Lots were previously approved with lot areas less than R-20 zoning (20,000 sf)

The existing recorded and constructed lots at Huntstone are zoned as R-20 however they do not meet the UDO criteria for R-20 zoning. A number of these lots are recorded at less than the 20,000 sf area. Additionally, the un-recorded lots we are requesting to be R-10 were also previously approved at areas less than 20,000 sf. By default, these lots (both constructed and proposed) were previously as R-10.

3. What factors justify the proposed amendment?

See comment 2. Additionally, in order to have this plan re-approved under the R-20 standards, a number of the lots would need to be increased in size to meet the 20,000 sf minimum area. This would result in a substantial loss of lots. Additionally, the previously approved preliminary subdivision plat included a pump station that can be eliminated with R-10 zoning. Given the changes in the ordinance it is not financially feasible to build the remaining phase under the new R-20 zoning criteria, however it is financially feasible with R-10 zoning.

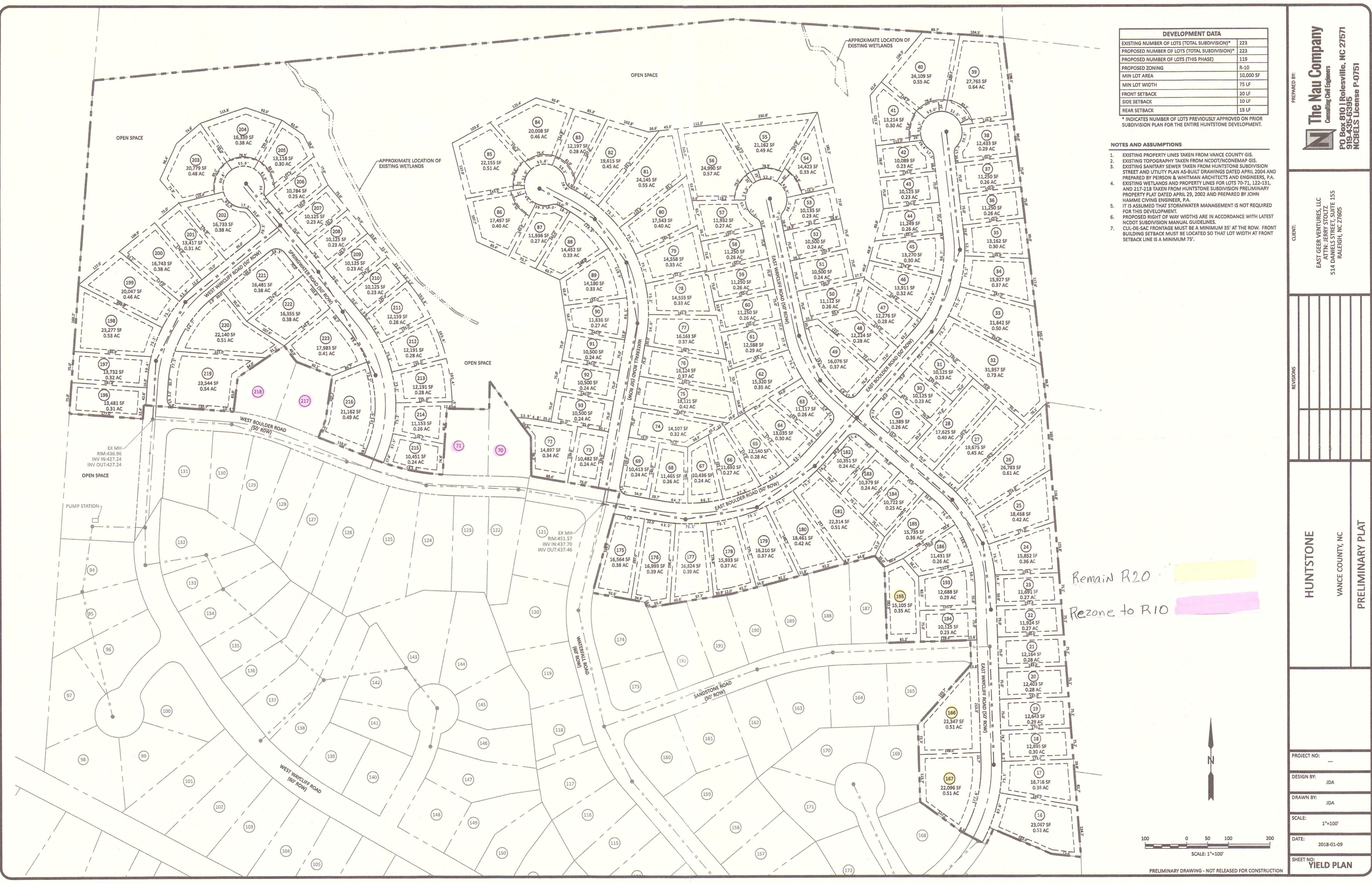

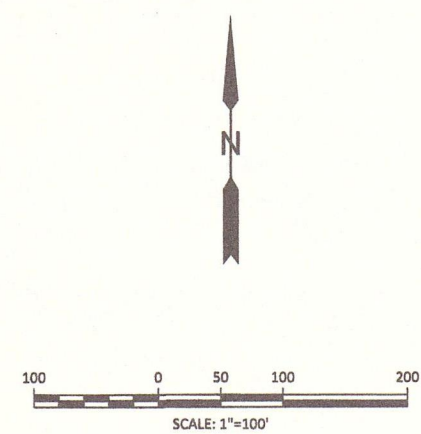

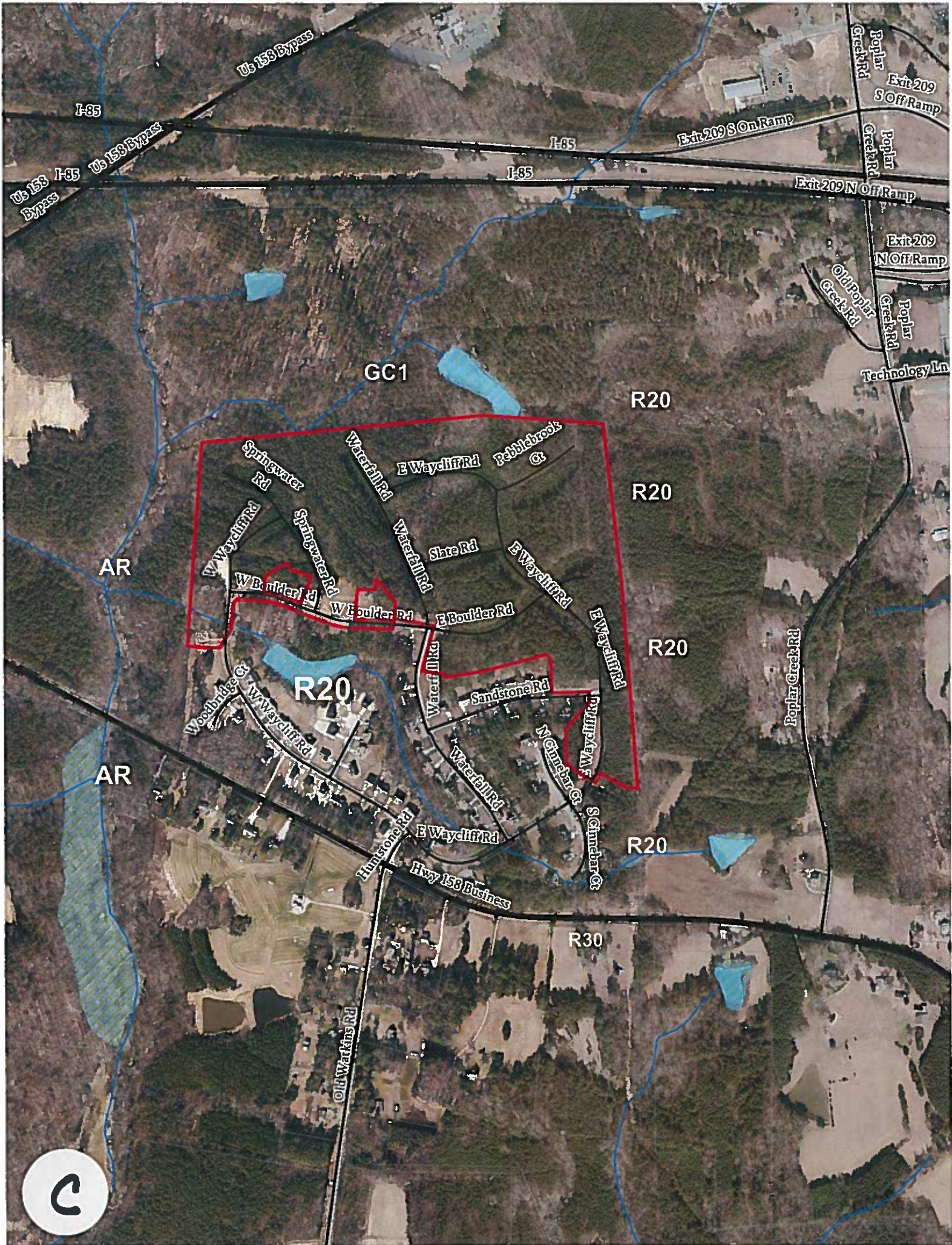

Committee Report

Phase III Update. The committee (Wilder[C], Brummit, & Taylor) met on Monday, February 28, 2018 and reviewed the updated project schedule, prepared by LKC Engineering. The committee was informed that the project is currently fifteen (15) days behind schedule, pending final construction permits and USDA review, but should be back on schedule by June 2018. Barring any setbacks from USDA or the LGC, construction is scheduled between July and November of this year. The schedule is enclosed for your information. *For your information.*

Water Customer Referral Incentive Program. The committee endorsed the referral incentive program at their meeting in February and reviewed language detailing the program at their March meeting. The committee recommended proceeding with the incentive program and provided input to staff on a marketing postcard to publicize the program. The language to be added to section 5G of the water rules and regulations are as follows: *Existing water customers are eligible to receive a \$50 credit toward their water bill for every new active metered customer referred to the water system. The new customer must become a metered user of the system and remain an active customer on the system a minimum of three (3) billing cycles prior to the referring customer's account receiving the fifty dollar (\$50.00) credit. Only one water account is eligible for the credit for each new customer. The credit will be applied to outstanding amounts due of the referring customer and shall not be provided as a cash payment, nor shall be available for refund after applied to the water account. In order to receive the incentive, the referring customer and new customer will both need to be identified at the opening/creation of the new water account. This program is active from April 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019 and may be extended by the VCWD water board. Recommendation: Approve amendment to water rules implementing the water customer referral program and allowing a \$50 credit as outlined in the program.*

Review/Discussion of Revenue Options. The committee reviewed various revenue options for reaching self-sustainability for the water system. The options consisted of the following: 1) a rate adjustment, 2) a water district tax, and 3) an annual assessment. The options presented included various subsets of options to include reducing the base fee, providing an allowance of water in the base fee and eliminating the \$30 base fee. The committee was in favor of postponing the revenue options until further notice. *For your information.*

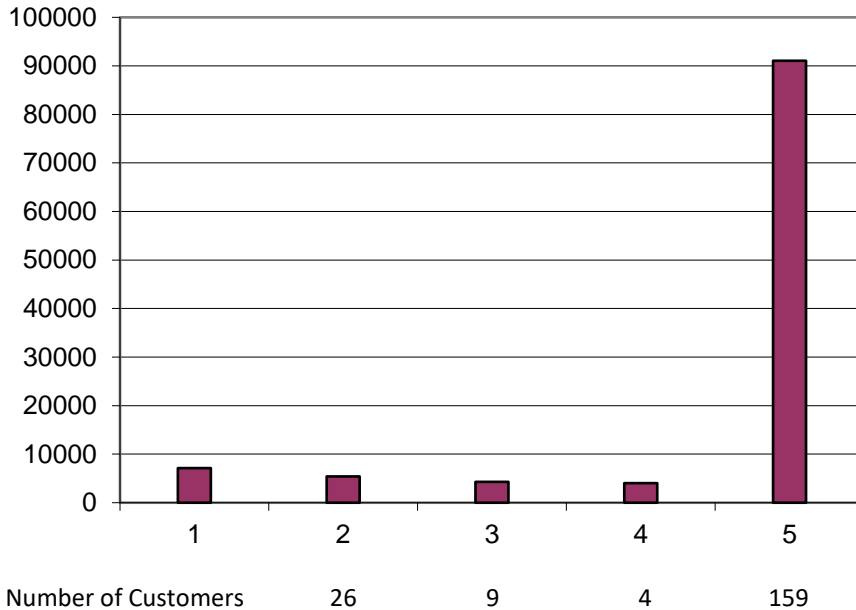

Availability Aging Report for Vance County



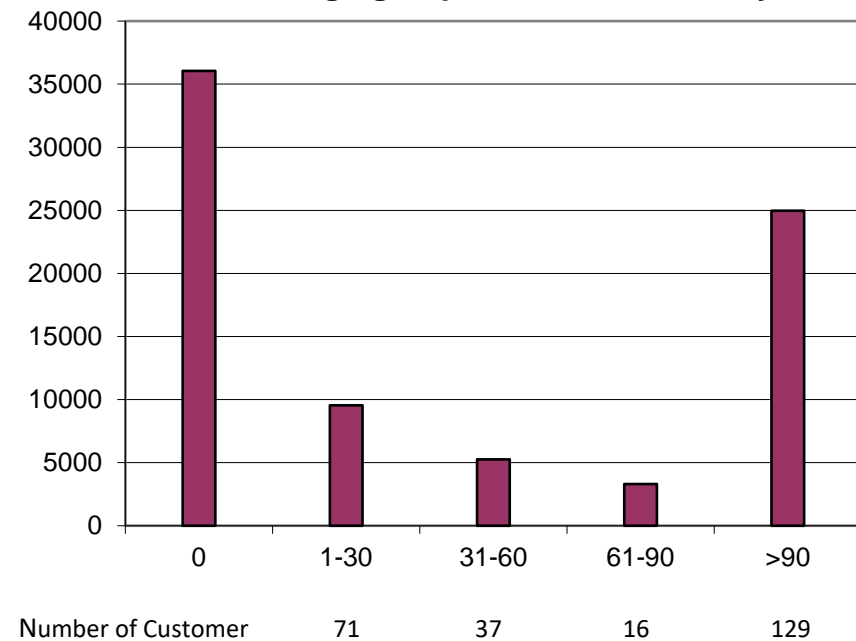

Committee Reports and Recommendations

March 15, 2018

Properties Committee

REO Properties – Offers to Purchase. The committee (Brummitt[C], Taylor, & Wilder) met Tuesday, February 13, 2018 and reviewed the following offers to purchase county owned properties:

- Wintergreen Road (Parcel 0426B03007) - \$750 offer – USA Land, LLC
- Burning Tree Drive (Parcel 0426B03004) - \$750 offer – USA Land, LLC
- Burning Tree Drive (Parcel 0426B01005) - \$750 offer – USA Land, LLC
- Burning Tree Drive (Parcel 0426B01004) - \$750 offer – USA Land, LLC
- 406 Tower Lane (Parcel 0531A02001) - \$750 offer – USA Land, LLC
- Erica Lane (Parcel 0358A01020) - \$750 offer – USA Land, LLC
- Oak Tree Lane (Parcel 035901008A) - \$750 offer – USA Land, LLC

The committee discussed the offers and expressed concerns with the wooded lots being able to pass the health department's perc test. The committee requested that staff send the list of surplus properties to realtors in the Henderson-Vance County area. The committee recommended proceeding with the upset bid process for all seven properties. ***Recommendation:*** *Approve the offers to purchase, and proceed with the upset bid process for the sale of Wintergreen Road (tax parcel 0426B03007), Burning Tree Drive (tax parcel 0426B03004), Burning Tree Drive (tax parcel 0426B01005), Burning Tree Drive (tax parcel 0426B01004), 406 Tower Lane (tax parcel 0531A02001), Erica Lane (tax parcel 0358A01020), and Oak Tree Lane (Parcel 035901008A).*

Administration Building Elevator Modernization Update. The committee met with the county's elevator consultant (Mike Barham with Wagner Consultant Group) and discussed replacement of the underground jack (cylinder & piston) for the administrative building elevator. The board previously authorized the committee to approve change orders related to this project in order to expedite completion of the repairs. The committee reviewed the change order proposal from Southern Elevator and was made aware the jack replacement would cost \$43,822 with the potential for it to increase to \$81,422 if the existing well-hole caves in or is altered requiring additional drilling and cleaning. The committee was informed that after jack replacement, all parts of the elevator would essentially be new with the exception of the car and interior of the car. The committee was informed an additional \$10,000 would allow for an upgraded car interior. The committee authorized proceeding with the jack replacement in an amount not to exceed \$81,422, did not proceed with the upgraded car interior, and requested that the consultant be on site on the date of removal and replacement. The jack replacement work will begin in 5-6 weeks when all parts are received by the contractor. ***For Your Information.***

Public Safety Committee

EMS Update. The committee (Wilder[C], Brummitt, & Faines) met with EMS Director, Javier Plummer, and the medical director, Dr. Michael Smith, on Tuesday, February 27, 2018. Mr. Plummer and Dr. Smith informed the committee of short and long term needs and priorities for the EMS Department. These priorities as presented in order of importance include the following: 1) a second Quick Response Vehicle (QRV), 2) a captain position for each of the three shifts (three total positions), 3) changing to a 24/72 work schedule to help improve retention, 4) addition of a fifth ambulance, and 5) a new EMS substation building in the northern part of the

county. The committee discussed the large cost implications for these items and acknowledged that Vance County paramedics and EMS employees while competitively compensated go above and beyond on a daily basis. The committee discussed call volumes and was informed that this has increased from 6,888 in 2015 to 6,904 in 2016 to 7,160 in 2017. *For your information.*

Fire Engine Purchase Update. The committee was informed that fire department staff recently completed the pre-build inspection of the new fire engine and along with management staff has made minor changes within the amount previously approved by the board. A complete listing of changes was reviewed by the committee which results in a total savings of \$294 lowering the truck price to \$474,706. *For your information.*

Mobile Cascade System Purchase. Fire Marshal, Keith Duncan brought a recommendation forward from the Fire and Rescue Association requesting purchase of a mobile cascade system with proceeds from the fire fund balance. The fire marshal and the association believe the equipment would increase the safety of fire and rescue personnel and increase efficiency at emergency scenes. The equipment includes a mobile breathing trailer that houses a generator and a compressor which serves as a fill station for recharging breathing air bottles. The current fire fund balance is approximately \$442,000 and the cascade system costs \$145,173.60. The fire marshal informed the committee that the rescue squad was willing to take on housing the unit, making it available to all departments and annual maintenance costs, if they were the owners. Due to procurement requirements for the county and the legal structure of the fire fund, the committee recommended distributing the purchase cost equally among the eight volunteer fire departments for the purchase subject to the condition that they convey it to the rescue squad at no cost. *Recommendation: Approve a total conveyance of \$145,173.60 from the fire fund to be split among each of the eight volunteer fire departments, subject to their agreement to purchase a mobile cascade system and convey it to the rescue squad at no cost.*

Fire Commission Guidelines. The fire marshal informed the committee that the Fire and Rescue Association is requesting an update to the fire commission guidelines which were created in 1960. The committee reviewed the guidelines and made note that the guidelines require the fire commission to review and recommend to the Board of County Commissioners amendments or changes which the commission may deem advisable. The committee referred the matter to the fire commission. *For your information.*

Volunteer Fire Department Funding and Response. Staff reviewed information from the annual retreat indicating a need for additional funding (recurring and capital) and part time assistance for the volunteer fire departments. The fire and rescue association presented a document recommending the following changes:

1. Introduce part-time employees to every volunteer and rescue department from 7AM – 7PM, 5 days a week.
2. Increase to volunteer fire departments and rescue squad funding.
3. Suggest swapping county department out of fire tax funding and rescue squad into fire tax funding.
4. Formally move all administrative functions (hiring, training, pay, etc.) of part-time positions at volunteer stations from county fire department to fire marshal's office.

Committee members indicated a need for part-time employees at the volunteer stations to improve response times and mentioned there may be ways to restructure the current county fire department to better accommodate this without adding to the fire tax. The committee reiterated

that if this option were used, they would not intend to eliminate any current county jobs, but could change duties and job reporting locations. The committee indicated a desire to take a comprehensive and wide-open approach, looking at all costs with the intention of improving quality of service and response times around the county. The committee recommended that staff prepare a comprehensive set of options and costs for addressing all issues raised. *For your information.*

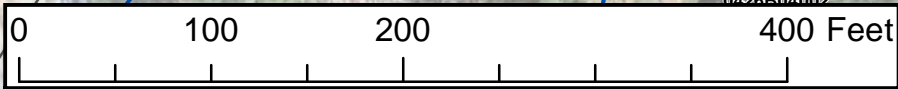

Southern Elevator will provide the necessary labor and materials to perform the following scope of work on the elevator referenced above. A test was performed on this elevator to confirm that the underground cylinder/piston has been comprised and will not hold pressure. The elevator has been shut down until this repair is completed. The scope of work for removal and replacement of the cylinder is detailed below, and can take between 10 days to complete. Equipment will be ordered upon only your signed approval purchase order. Material lead time is 4-6 weeks, but could be longer dependant on when the order is placed and the production cue. Southern Elevator will coordinate engineering, ordering, contracting subcontractors, and permitting for the following:

Scope of Work:

1. Field survey and order cylinder/piston assembly.
2. File for required elevator work permits.
3. Manufacturing time and delivery lead time of 4-6 weeks.
4. Suspend car and frame in overhead of hoistway.
5. Shut off and secure oil in system.
6. Remove piston from hydraulic cylinder.
7. Remove old cylinder from hoistway. Cylinder may require cutting to assist removal from the elevator hoistway.
8. Utilize an environmental clean-up company to clear and remove spoils from in-ground bore hole.*
9. Furnish and install new PVC liner. (Per ASME A17.1 code)
10. Furnish and install new hydraulic cylinder. All welding (if required) shall be performed by a certified welder.
10. Reconnect hydraulic oil line and add necessary oil to system.
11. Clean pit and machine room to remove remaining spoils.
12. Reconnect elevator car to hydraulic piston assembly and verify operation.
13. Perform full load pressure test as required by code.

This price does not include any other work, which may be required due to the unsatisfactory performance of the elevator equipment during testing other than the new installed equipment.

Payment is as per the requirements of the state of North Carolina. Southern Elevator will warrant against parts defect, the piston packing seal for a one year period beginning when the elevator is returned to service.

WELL-HOLE DRILLING

* Hydraulic jack replacement can contain the potential for additional unknown costs. During excavation of the hole, should the existing hole have caved or altered, additional drilling/cleaning will be needed. Included in our base cost is preparation of the well hole to replace the existing cylinder, however, if a drill subcontractor is required for this project additional charges will apply. Additional costs due to unknown conditions include but are not limited to the following:

1. Extracting the cylinder from a concrete footing.
2. Containment and disposal of underground water, if needed.
3. Provide casing in order to stabilize the in-ground bore hole.
4. Removal of materials from the in-ground bore hole other than oil and sand back fill.
5. Removal of existing casing and enlarging the in-ground bore hole, if needed.
6. Increasing the depth of the in-ground bore hole, if needed.

Our proposal, which provides the jack replacement, is based upon the removal and cleaning of the existing in-ground bore hole with clean backfill. Any natural or unnatural obstructions encountered during the course of replacing the existing hydraulic elevator jack or if the existing hole is not large enough to accept the new PVC liner, will result in additional charges to the customer and a longer project duration. The Fire & Rescue Association believes purchasing a mobile air station would not only increase the safety of fire and rescue personnel, it would dramatically increase efficiency at emergency scenes. RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF VANCE COUNTY
 PROVIDING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE VANCE COUNTY FIRE COMMISSION
 AND PROVIDING FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO CERTAIN FIRE DEPARTMENTS OF THE COUNTY

Whereas, G. S. 153-9(39) empowers a board of county commissioners to provide for the organization, equipment, maintenance, and government of fire companies and fire departments, and

Whereas, the Board of County Commissioners of Vance County is of the opinion and has found and determined that it is for the best interest and necessary for the protection of the citizens of said county and their property (a) to encourage and financially aid in the equipment, maintenance, and government of fire departments in the county in order that these departments can protect public school buildings and other county buildings, as well as homes and other property, in the rural areas of the county, (b) to establish a protective fire fighting organization to work with and to supplement the Vance County Civil Defense Organization, and (c) in general to provide for the more adequate and efficient protection of life and property in the rural areas of Vance County and to provide a trained body of men to assist the urban areas of the county in case of emergency;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF VANCE COUNTY:

Section 1. There is hereby created the Vance County Fire Commission to be composed of 3 members as follows:

- (a) One member of the Board of County Commissioners of Vance County, to be appointed by the said board and to be known as the Fire Commissioner.
- (b) An active volunteer fireman, who shall be appointed by the Board of County Commissioners.
- (c) A member at large who shall be a citizen of Vance County and who shall be appointed by the Board of County Commissioners.

As soon as possible after the adoption of this resolution, the Board of County Commissioners shall appoint the members of the Fire Commission. These members will serve until the first Monday in December following the adoption of this resolution. Thereafter, on each first Monday in December, appointments will be made to the Fire Commission for terms of one year.

The Fire Commissioner shall be the Chairman of the commission, and the commission shall choose its own secretary.

The duties and powers of the Commission shall be as specified in this resolution, and the Commission shall make rules and regulations necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution.

The Commission shall, from time to time, review the provisions and requirements contained in this resolution, and it shall recommend to the Board of County Commissioners amendments or changes which the Commission may deem advisable.

Section 2. Beginning with the first day of the first month following the adoption of this resolution, Vance County will offer financial assistance for the maintenance and operation of any fire department qualifying for financial assistance under the terms of this resolution, in the amount of \$50.00 monthly, payable on or before the tenth day of each month. The monthly payment to each department shall be used for the purchase and maintenance of equipment and for the operation of the department. No individual fireman or group of firemen shall individually receive any pay or remuneration from the monthly payment herein provided for services rendered as volunteer firemen.

Section 3. A rural volunteer fire department, or a municipally-operated fire department, desiring financial assistance under this resolution, shall make application therefor to the Board of County Commissioners. Upon receipt of such application, the said board will notify the Fire Commission, and the commission shall inspect the fire department, its equipment, personnel, organization, and method of operation. As soon thereafter as possible, the commission shall file a written report with the board signifying whether such department meets the minimum standards herein contained. If the department shall be eligible for the monthly payment beginning the first of the following month.

Section 4. The Fire Commission shall make regular inspections of each fire department receiving payments under this resolution. At least one inspection shall be made annually, but the commission may make such other inspections as it deems advisable. During the course of any such inspection, the Fire Commission shall determine whether the department is continuing to meet the minimum standards as herein specified, and the findings of the commission shall be reported to the Board of County Commissioners.

Section 5. If during any inspection by the Fire Commission, the commission determines that the fire department is not meeting minimum standards as set forth in this resolution, notice of deficiency must thereupon be given in writing by the Fire Commissioner to the fire chief and at least two members of the department. This notice shall specify that a period of fifteen days shall be allowed to correct the deficiencies. At the end of the fifteen day period, an inspection shall be made by the Fire Commissioner to determine if the deficiencies have been corrected. If the deficiencies have not been corrected, the Fire Commissioner shall notify the Board of County Commissioners, and the monthly payments shall cease until such time as the department shall meet the minimum standards of this resolution. Thereafter, when the Fire department is of the opinion that it is again meeting the standards, it shall again apply for financial assistance in accordance with the provisions of Section 3 above.

If the deficiency occurs in a department which has previously met the requirements of the North Carolina Fire Insurance Rating Bureau, the Fire Commissioner shall notify the bureau as to the conditions that exist in the department causing the deficiency.

Section 6. Each fire department desiring to qualify for financial assistance under this resolution shall meet the following minimum standards:

(a) A rural Volunteer fire department shall be incorporated under the laws of the State of North Carolina. A municipal fire department shall be organized under an ordinance of the governing body of the incorporated city or town.

(b) Each fire department shall have a fire chief, an assistant fire chief, and other necessary officers and men, with a minimum of nineteen active members. A list of all members and their addresses and telephone numbers must be given to the Fire Commissioner on or before January 1 of each year.

(c) All active members of a fire department in good standing shall have some identification, such as a card, badge, hat, or car plate to identify them as "bona fide firemen." No one other than an active member of the department in good standing shall be allowed to have this identification in his possession.

(d) Each fire department shall have as minimum equipment that equipment specified by the North Carolina Fire Insurance Rating Bureau as necessary for Grade 9-A Communities. The equipment shall be kept in good condition and operative at all times. The Fire Commission shall have authority to accept minor deviations from the specified equipment, when such minor deviations will not affect the ability of the department to fight fires.

(e) Each department shall carry liability insurance on its firemen and equipment, leaving the county free from any responsibility for damages or claims resulting from the activities of its fireman or from the operation of its equipment. Each department shall also carry workmen's compensation insurance on its active members, in order to provide those members with the benefits of the Workmen's Compensation Act. 2

(f) Each fire department shall carry out an organized training program, which shall be specified by the Fire Commission. 3 The training program shall include the training and qualifying of fire truck drivers. Each department shall participate in a minimum of one drill each month, and each fire truck shall be operated at least once each week.

(g) The fire chief of each department is responsible for stressing "safety" throughout the department and throughout all phases of the department's activities. Emphasis shall be placed on the safe driving of the firemen's own automobiles to the scene of the fire, as well as on safe practices while fighting a fire. Only qualified drivers shall drive the fire truck, and the names of qualified drivers shall be posted at the fire station and furnished to the membership of the department. Drivers shall drive with caution at all times, and they shall allow no one but active members of the fire department to ride the truck when it is on call to a fire or to other emergency.

(h) A properly manned telephone shall be available at all times during the day and night to receive fire alarms and notify members of the fire department in the event of fire or other emergency. Each member of the fire department shall be furnished a copy of the names and telephone numbers of all departments within the county, and each department shall maintain an up-to-date list of the names and telephone numbers of all members of each department within the county. An electric siren or air horn shall be mounted within the community for the adequate notification of all firemen, and it shall be installed so that it can be operated from a public place and so that it will be audible to a majority of the active members of the department.

(i) Each fire department shall respond to the call of the Fire Commissioner. It shall be the duty of the Fire Commissioner to take such steps as are necessary to make sure, in the event of such a call, that the district of a department answering a call shall not be left unprotected.

(j) The fire chief within whose area the fire is being fought will be the final authority at the scene of the fire, or where a fire occurs in an area outside of the area of any organized department, the fire chief of the department first arriving at the scene of the fire shall be the final authority. A fire chief, otherwise responsible, may grant permission to another person more qualified to assume the direction of fighting the fire, or dealing with the emergency, if such other person is willing to accept the responsibility. In such cases, other persons working under the direction of the fire chief shall be immediately informed of the change of authority.

(k) The fire chief, or the senior officer of the department having responsibility present at the scene, shall make a full investigation of each fire to determine, if possible, the cause of the fire. If any evidence of arson develops, the Fire Commissioner, and other local and state authorities, shall be notified.

(l) All fire chiefs are responsible for keeping adequate and accurate records of all fire calls, as well as other records and reports that may be required. A regulation fire record book shall be maintained by each department. The fire chief will also be responsible for filing with the Fire Commission any additional reports which are required by the Fire Commission or by the North Carolina Fire Insurance Rating Bureau.

(m) Each department shall designate a traffic section, composed of at least one captain and three members, who shall be trained in the proper handling of traffic.

Section 7. The various fire departments in the county shall, by mutual agreement, determine the areas in which each will give basic fire protection, and within which

each will solicit funds. Any disagreements shall be resolved by the Fire Commission. For those departments which may be approved for insurance rate reductions, the area of basic fire protection shall be determined with reference to the requirements of the North Carolina Fire Insurance Rating Bureau.

Section 8. Each incorporated fire department desiring to qualify for county financial assistance under the terms of this resolution shall agree in the application for financial assistance to meet the standards contained in this resolution, and such application shall be signed by the president of the corporation, the secretary of the corporation, and the fire chief of the department. Each municipality desiring to provide fire protection to property outside its corporate limits and qualify for county financial assistance under the terms of this resolution shall agree to the standards contained in this resolution by proper action of the governing board, and the mayor, clerk of the municipality, and the fire chief shall sign the application for financial assistance wherein the municipality agrees to meet these standards.

Section 9. Each fire department shall prepare an annual budget, providing for the receipt and expenditure of county assistance and other income and revenue. A copy of the budget shall be presented to the Fire Commissioner in July of each year.

Section 10. Whenever a fire department has met the requirements of the North Carolina Fire Insurance Rating Bureau, for providing fire protection to a Grade 9-A or Grade 9-AA Community, a fire district may, upon application by the fire department, thereupon be designated by the Board of County Commissioners. The boundaries of the district will be fixed according to the requirements of the Fire Insurance Rating Bureau.

Mission Statement

The mission of the Vance County Fire Commission shall be to make formal recommendations to the County Board of Commissioners on fire protection and emergency services delivery applicable to those departments covered under the venue of the Fire Commission.

Objectives:

- Reviewing and making recommendations on operating budget requests.
- Reviewing and making recommendations on CIP budget requests.
- Reviewing and supporting fire and rescue volunteer retention and recruitment programs.
- Making recommendations to the Board of Commissioners for continuing improvement of fire, rescue, and 1st responder services.
- Developing and providing overview of all service district operational regulations and guidelines for the Vance County Fire Protection Service Districts.

Intentions:

Since the fire tax is for the well-being of the entire county, the Fire Commission has an obligation to deliver the best possible service within allocated resources.

It is also part of the mission to deliver services in the most cost-effective manner through the different volunteer fire and rescue departments and to do so in compliance with applicable state statutes.

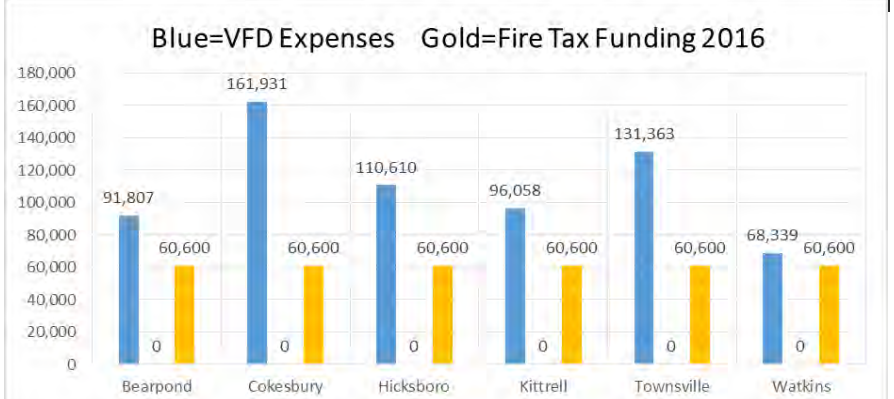
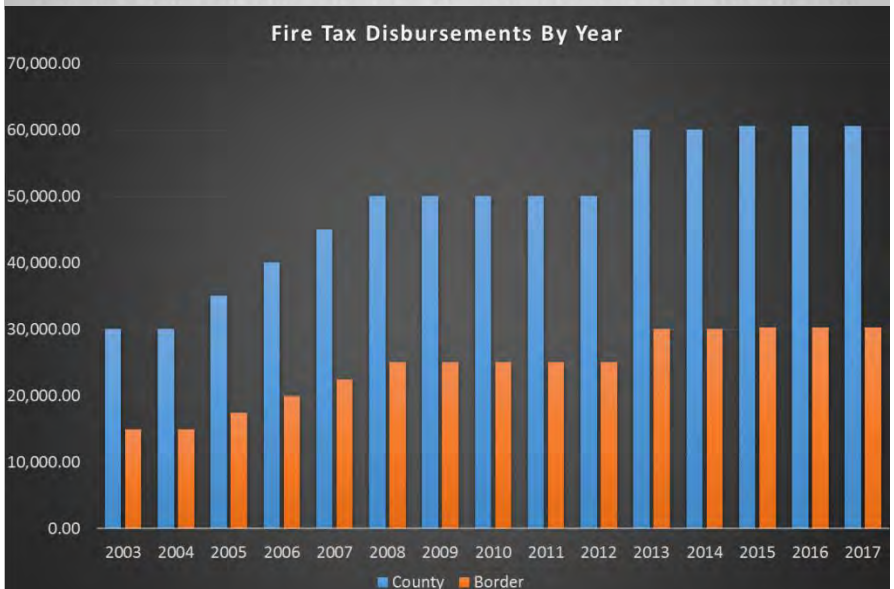
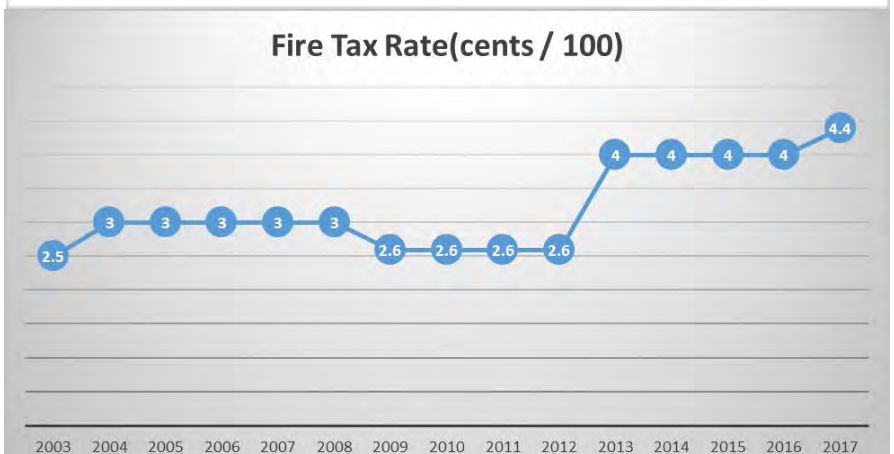
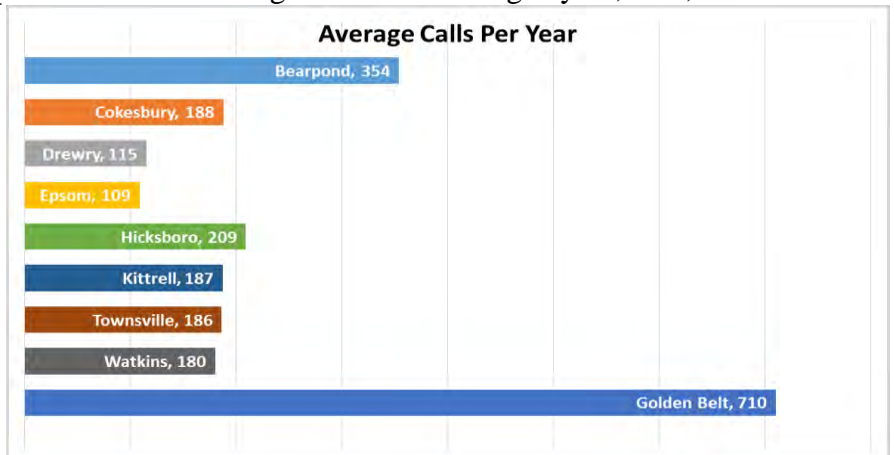
All matters related to fire protection shall first be submitted to the Commission for consideration and may then be presented to the appropriate committee or the Board of Commissioners.

Funding for Volunteer Departments. During the current budget year, \$10,000 was

added to departments that have a substation in the county. The greatest needs for the departments appear to be (1) increased funding (recurring and capital) and (2) paid part-time assistance to help with response. The fire fund currently pays for two part time positions in the North (Townsville or Hicksboro) and two positions in the south (Bearpond) during the daytime hours.

Overall recurring funding to the nine departments has remained level for the past five years while the fire tax rate has remained level as well (4.4 cents in FY2017 is revenue neutral rate). Departments receive \$60,600 while border departments receive \$30,300 and \$30,000 is rotated on an annual basis for capital items. Other proceeds from the tax are used to reimburse volunteer departments for financial reviews completed each year and pay for part-time positions.

Looking forward to the FY18-19 budget, it is anticipated that \$60,000 could be used from the fire fund balance to provide Mobile CAD Interface Hardware to the eight volunteer fire departments. **Any increases in recurring funding would require an increase in the fire tax rate.** A one penny increase on the fire tax rate generates \$166,336.

A. Spring Litter Sweep Proclamation/County Employee Cleanup Event. In the spring and fall of each year, the NC Department of Transportation (NC DOT) sponsors cleanup campaigns to beautify the roadsides of the state. This year, DOT is sponsoring their Spring Litter Sweep Campaign between April 14 - 28, 2018. Vance County encourages individuals and organizations to support this effort. On Friday, April 20, 2018 a volunteer crew of County employees will meet at noon at the Farmer's Market for a picnic lunch followed by a roadside litter pickup project. (A rain date will be scheduled for Friday, April 27th). ***Recommendation:** Approve the proclamation designating April 14 – 28, 2018, as Spring Litter Sweep in Vance County and approve April 20th as the county employee volunteer Litter Sweep Day.*

B. Scrap Tire Disposal Contract. The County has contracted with Central Carolina Holdings for 20+ years for our scrap tire disposal program. Central Carolina is located in Cameron, NC and is the main provider of this service for eastern NC serving nearly 60 counties and all counties in this region. They currently provide open top trailers at the old county landfill and transport, process, recycle and dispose all scrap tires loaded into the trailers. The county allows residents to bring tires to the old county landfill for no cost and the county has been reimbursed for 100% of the disposal cost from the state. The current contract term is expiring and staff has released an RFP of which Central Carolina was the only response with pricing similar to our current agreement. ***Recommendation:** Approve scrap tire recycling and disposal contract with Central Carolina Holdings for the county's scrap tire program, subject to final attorney review.*

C. Henderson Collegiate Lease Extension. Henderson Collegiate's current lease for property at 906 Health Center Road expires June 30, 2018. The property is currently being used for their high school, while a new high school building is being constructed at their new location on Old Epsom Road. The school has requested extending the lease until December 31, 2018 to allow sufficient time for transition to the new property and restoration of the 906 Health Center Road property. ***Recommendation:** Approve resolution extending the Henderson Collegiate lease of county owned property until December 31, 2018.*

D. NCWorks Nextgen Internship Program. Staff has been in conversation with NCWorks regarding their Nextgen Internship Program which works to connect North Carolina talent with North Carolina jobs. The program provides internships for young adults aged 16 - 24 for up to 12 weeks (20 - 40 hours per week) at no county cost. NCWorks handles the vetting process, provides worker's comp liability insurance, covers costs associated with background checks, and provides payment to the interns while the county interviews and selects candidates. The program has been utilized in the department of social services in the past, and staff intends to utilize this program over the coming months to staff one intern to the animal services department as a kennel attendant. This program will serve as an addition to and not a replacement to the county's summer youth employment program. ***For Your Information.***

E. Vance County School Consolidation - Qualified Zone Academy Bonds. Vance County schools are wrapping up their community meetings this month regarding consolidation of the two middle schools into one and two high schools into one. It is anticipated that the school board will discuss and decide on any potential consolidations in the near future. County finance staff has researched and confirmed that the two middle schools have remaining debt from three separate Qualified Zone Academy Bonds (QZABs) from 2003, 2005, and 2013. Each QZAB is for the purpose of renovating, modernizing and equipping various public school facilities. The 2003 QZAB has a balance of \$77,487 with a maturity of November, 2018, the 2005 QZAB has a balance of \$407,453 with a maturity of November, 2021, and the 2013 QZAB has a balance of \$1,333,333.33 with a maturity of June, 2028. Also, Henderson Middle School serves as collateral for the 2003 and 2005 QZABs. Staff is working with our bond counsel and financial advisors to discuss any debt conditions with the various banks. ***For Your Information.***

SCRAP TIRE RECYCLING & DISPOSAL CONTRACT

This Scrap Tire Recycling and Disposal Contract ("Contract") made and entered on this first day of February, 2018, by and between Vance County, a political subdivision of the State of North Carolina, hereafter referred to as "County" and Central Carolina Holdings, LLC, a North Carolina Corporation with principal business offices located at 1616 McKoy Town Road, Cameron, NC 28326, hereafter referred to as "Contractor."

WITNESETH

WHEREAS the County chooses to recycle its scrap tires when possible and has determined that this service can best be provided through a service contract with a qualified firm; and

WHEREAS the Contractor is qualified to provide collection, transportation, recycling and disposal of tires and other scrap rubber and has the necessary equipment, personnel, facilities, expertise, financial resources and management skills to provide a high level of service:

1) Scrap Tire Volume Generated

It is unknown how many scrap tires that the County receives at its landfill annually. However, the Contractor understands the County does not control the scrap tire waste stream and that there is no guaranteed volume that will be received during the term of this contract.

2) Recycling and Disposal Services

a) Contractor Responsibilities

The Contractor agrees to stage two (2) forty five (45) foot open top trailers at the County Landfill and to transport, process, recycle or dispose of all scrap tires loaded in said trailers. Furthermore, the Contractor shall be responsible for hauling, processing, recycling and/or disposing of all scrap tires in accordance with all applicable state, federal and local environmental and safety laws, regulations, permits, ordinances, and standards.

b) County Responsibilities

The County shall make available ample space in a manner acceptable to Contractor to provide for efficient handling of containers and materials contained therein. County shall be responsible for contacting Contractor that trailer(s) needs to be removed.

3) Term

This Contract shall be in full force and effect for a period of Three (3) years from the date of execution, unless terminated earlier per Section 7, with two (2), 1 year automatically extended annual renewal terms at the end of each successive term

unless either party notifies the other party in writing 30 days prior to the expiration of the term of his desire to terminate this contract, in which case the term shall end as scheduled.

4) Time of Performance

Contractor shall remove each loaded trailer and replace with an empty trailer within forty-eight (48) hours of contact by the County. The notice period shall not include Saturday, Sunday, New Year's Day, Martin Luther King Day, Good Friday, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, Christmas and the day after Christmas.

5) Invoices

The Contractor shall invoice the County monthly for scrap tires collected and transported since the previous invoice. Each invoice shall be according to the fees per Section 6 and the applicable weight tickets. Each invoice shall include a dated listing of the loads collected and transported indicating the weight per load and the load origin.

6) Collection Disposal Fees

The County shall pay Contractor, for the work described in Section 2, including processing and transportation of all passenger and truck tires, the sum of \$99.94 per ton with off-road tires being assessed an additional \$0.16 per pound. A \$15.00 per load environmental fee will be assessed on each trailer of recycled tires.

The contract shall provide for an annual adjustment calculated on March 1 after the first full year for cost of business inflationary increase; the inflationary increase will be effective on July 1 of the same year. The Consumer Price Index for the South Region of The United States will be used to determine the inflationary increase and can be accessed by internet at <https://data.bls.gov/cgi-bin/surveymost?cu> .

Fuel has become very unpredictable and unusually expensive. It is important the Contractor to maintain quality and fair service, and to do this the Contractor has developed the following process to meet its drivers' needs and be fair to customers. In the event of a discrepancy between Contractor and County records, such invoice shall be paid less the amount of the discrepancy. A notice of discrepancy with supporting documentation shall be promptly sent to Contractor and the two parties shall reconcile records and invoices at the earliest possible date. Such reconciliation shall be reflected on the next invoice from Contractor

7) Termination

This contract may be terminated according to any of the following provisions:

- a) Default: If either party to this Contract claims the other is in default of any provision hereof, the claiming party shall provide written notice to the defaulting party of said default. If the defaulting party fails to correct the violating condition within twenty (20) working days of the date they receive written notice, the party claiming default may terminate this Contract immediately.
- b) Mutual Agreement: This Contract may be terminated by mutual agreement of the parties hereto at any time.
- c) The County may terminate this contract at any time if the Contractor is found to be in violation of Federal, State or Local waste management laws or allows their permits to lapse or should the Contractor's service put the County in violation of said laws.

8) Force Majeure

- a) Definition: Force Majeure – For purposes herein, Force Majeure shall be termed as any event or occurrence of any nature or kind in respect to the duties herein

that is beyond the control of and occurs without the negligence of the party invoking the same, including without limitation: acts of God or of a public enemy, acts of government or Governmental authority in its sovereign or contractual capacity, wars, riots, fires floods, explosions, epidemics, boycotts, blackouts, strikes, labor disputes, equipment breakdowns, and any transportation problem directly affecting or inhibiting pickups.

- b) Suspension of Performance: The duties and obligations of the parties to this Contract shall be suspended to the extent that such performance becomes impracticable as a result of Force Majeure.
- c) Notice: In the event that either party hereto determines that a Force Majeure has occurred, or it is likely to occur, such party shall promptly furnish to the other party notice in writing of such Force Majeure, setting forth the nature of the problem, the anticipated effect thereof on that party's performance under this Contract and an estimate of when normal performance may be expected to resume. In the event of excessive fuel prices for over the road diesel, Contractor and County will negotiate satisfactory terms for both parties involved.
- d) No Unreasonable Delay: Any party hereto whose performance hereunder is delayed or prevented by a factor of Force Majeure, and said party subsequently invokes Force Majeure, shall take all reasonable steps to resume, with the least possible delay, Compliance with its obligations hereunder, provided that said party shall not be required to settle any strike or labor dispute on terms not acceptable to it.

9) Representation

9.1 The Contractor represents warrants and covenants to County that:

- a) It is an entity duly organized, validly existing and in good standing under the laws of the State of North Carolina, and is duly and validly qualified to conduct business and is in good standing in all jurisdictions in which such qualification is necessary.
- b) The execution, delivery, and performance of this Contract have all been duly and validly authorized by all corporate action required to be taken and will not result in a breach of, constitute a default under, or violate the terms of Contractor's organizational agreement, or any rule, regulation, judgment, decree, order, or agreement to which Contractor is a party or by which it may be bound.
- c) Contractor has valid rights of control with respect to its plant size.
- d) Contractor shall comply with all environmental and other applicable governmental permits, guidelines and actions during the term hereof, and

has paid and will pay all valid charges and assessments in connection therewith. Contractor hereby agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the County against any punitive or other action resulting from or associated with Contractor's failure to do so.

- 9.2) County represents, warrants and covenants to Contractor that the execution, delivery and performance of this Contract by County have all been duly and validly authorized by all government action required to be taken and will not result in a breach of, constitute a default under, or violate the terms of decree, order, contract or agreement to which County is a party or by which it may be bound.

10) Insurance

Contractor does hereby warrant that it has general liability insurance coverage (which covers all its operations including but not limited to motor vehicle transportation) in the minimum amount of one million (\$ 1,000,000.00) dollars. A "Certificate of Insurance" affirming said coverage is attached hereto as an integral part of this Contract. County shall be listed as an additional insured under said Certificate of Insurance and a copy of said endorsement shall be provided to the County within ten (10) days of signing Contract. Contractor shall at all times during the existence of this contract maintain liability insurance coverage in the amount not less than one million (\$1,000,000.00) dollars.

11) Hold Harmless

The Contractor does hereby agree to indemnify and hold the County free and harmless from liability on account of injury or damage to persons or property which may result from the negligent conduct or operations arising out of the business of collection, removal and transportation of tires in accordance with the terms of this contract. In the event that any suit or proceeding is brought against the County at law or in equity, either independently or jointly with the Contractor, or either of them, on account of such negligent acts, the Contractor will defend the County in any such suit or proceeding at the cost of the Contractor, and in the event of a final judgment of decree being entered against either of them, the Contractor will comply with such decree and/or pay such judgment in full, together with all costs and expenses of whatsoever nature associated therewith and hold the county harmless therefrom.

12) Disputes

Any matter that arises hereunder that cannot be settled in negotiations between the parties hereto shall be handled according to the laws, legal processes and courts of the State of North Carolina. Any final decision therefrom shall be valid and binding upon the parties hereto and enforceable at law. Venue for any action arising out of this contract shall be the general court of justice Vance County, NC.

- 13.10) This Contract shall be binding upon and insure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors and permitted assigns, but neither this Contract nor any of the rights, interests, or obligations hereunder shall be assigned by either party hereto without the prior written consent of the other party hereto, which consent shall not be unreasonable withheld or delayed.

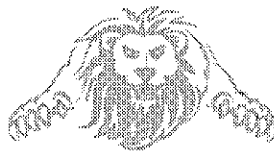

DECLARING THE OPIOID CRISIS A PUBLIC NUISANCE

WHEREAS, Vance County Board of Commissioners has the authority to adopt resolutions with respect to county affairs of Vance County, North Carolina, pursuant to N.C. General Statutes § 153A-121; and

WHEREAS, the Vance County Board of Commissioners has the authority to take action to protect the public health, safety, and welfare of the residents and citizens of Vance County; and

WHEREAS, there exists a serious public health and safety crisis involving opioid abuse, addiction, morbidity, and mortality in Vance County; and

WHEREAS, the diversion of legally produced controlled substances into the illicit market causes or contributes to the serious public health and safety crisis involving opioid abuse, addiction, morbidity, and mortality in Vance County; and

WHEREAS, the opioid crisis unreasonably interferes with rights common to the general public of Vance County; involves a significant interference with the public health, safety, peace, comfort, and convenience of citizens and residents of Vance County; includes the delivery of controlled substances in violation of State and Federal law and regulations; and therefore constitutes a public nuisance; and

WHEREAS, the opioid crisis is having an extended and far reaching impact of the general public, health, and safety, of residents and citizens of Vance County and must be abated; and

WHEREAS, the violation of any laws of the State of North Carolina, or of the United States of America controlling the distribution of a controlled substance is inimical, harmful, and adverse to the public welfare of the residents and citizens of Vance County constitutes a public nuisance; and

WHEREAS, the Vance County Board of Commissioners has the authority to abate, or cause to be abated, any public nuisance including those acts that unreasonably interfere with rights common to the general public of Vance County and/or involve a significant interference with the public health, safety, peace, comfort, and convenience of citizens and residents of Vance County; and

WHEREAS, Vance County has expended, is expending, and will continue to expend in the future County funds to respond to the serious public health and safety crisis involving opioid abuse, addiction, morbidity, and mortality within Vance County; and

WHEREAS, the Vance County Board of Commissioners have received information that indicates that the manufacturers and wholesale distributors of controlled substances have distributed in Vance County, North Carolina, and surrounding areas, and may have violated Federal and/or State laws and regulations that were enacted to prevent the diversion of legally produced controlled substances into the illicit market.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Vance County Board of Commissioners, assembled on this day at which a quorum is present, that based upon the above the Vance County Board of Commissioners are declaring the opioid crisis a public nuisance which must be abated for the benefit of Vance County and its residents and citizens.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all resolutions that are inconsistent with this resolution are rescinded.

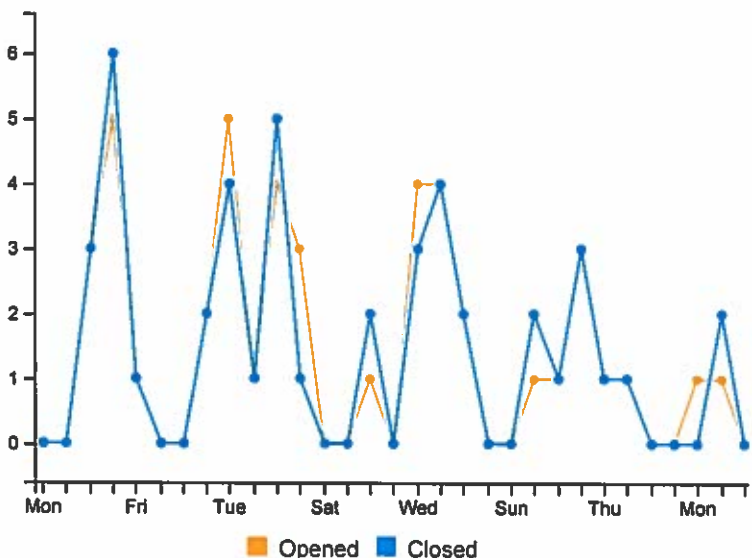





-  Visually Impaired Program (VIP) - this program works with visually impaired citizens. Volunteers help provide recreational activities that included for the month a support group meeting, bingo and a trip to the bowling alley. There was a monthly attendance of 22 participants for the month.
