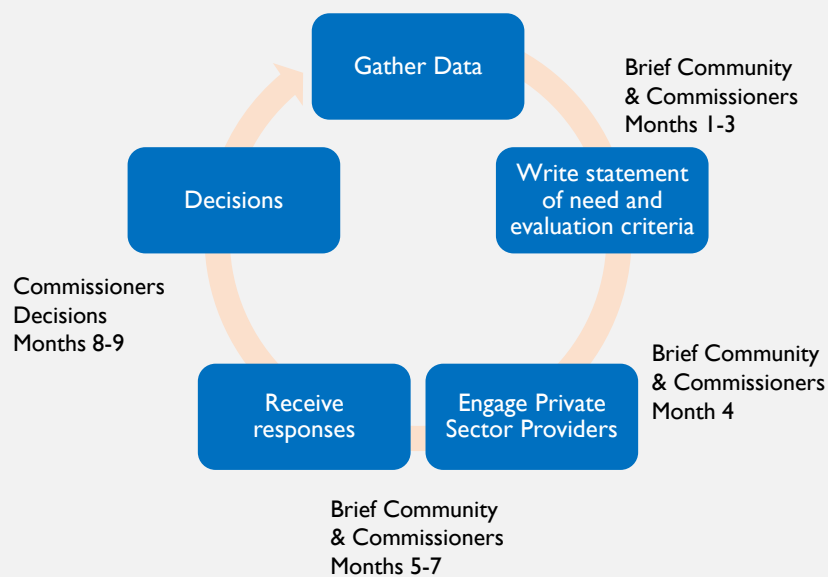

The reason she did not respond was because they were moving into their new building. The original letter asked her to go back 3 years and file her property listing. She felt this to be an overwhelming task, while moving into a new building, that she could not accomplish in 30 days. She is asking the Board to please accept her apologies for her lateness, and she takes full responsibility for her actions. She will gladly pay the Estimated Tax that is owed; however, she is requesting a waiver of the late list penalties.

STAFF REVIEW: 2014-2017 Discoveries

ASSESSOR'S RECOMMENDATION:

The Assessor's Office sent a letter to the taxpayer on 9/1/16 informing her that we have not received a listing for her business. On 9/6/16 Gail Hatchel called the tax office and spoke with a representative in our office. She informed the representative that they had been in business for 3 years and that she would list and send the form back soon. We sent another letter 11/7/16 informing the taxpayer that she needed to get in touch with us within 15 days. We did not hear back from the taxpayer. On 1/12/18 our office set up an appointment with Evans and Associates regarding their business personal property. On 2/23/18 after Evans and Associates finalized their audit, our office mailed Notice of Discovery. Assessor recommends that the penalties stand according to NCGS 105-312(h) which states that "having computed each year's taxes separately as provided in subsection (g), there shall be added a penalty of 10% of the same amount for each subsequent listing period that elapsed before the property was discovered or not timely listed.

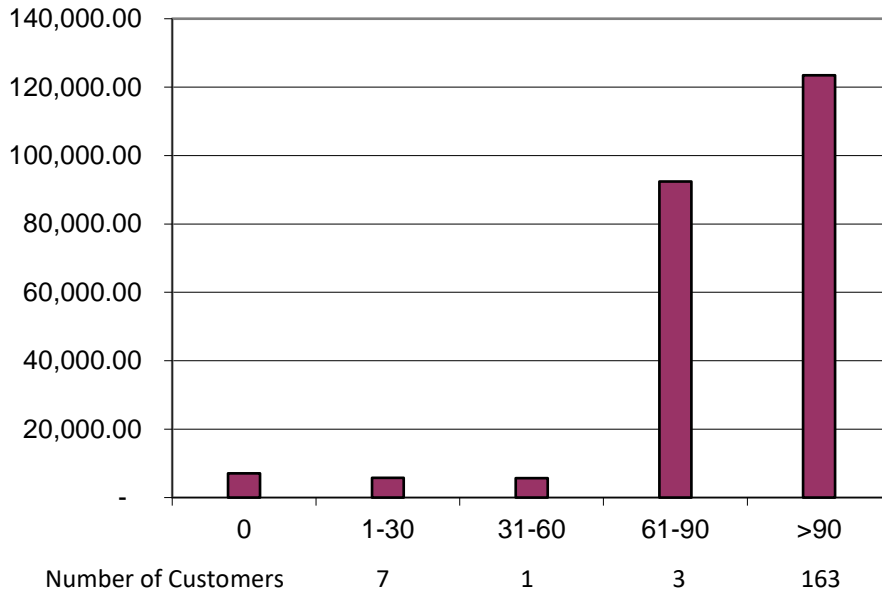

Availability Aging Report for Vance County



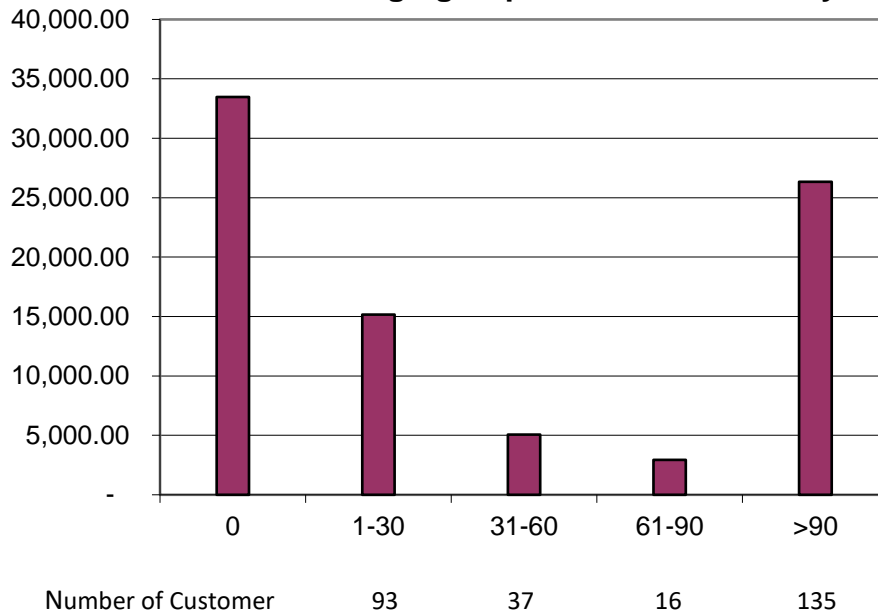

Human Resources Committee

Retirement Participation for Part-time Jail Control Booth Operator Positions. The committee (Faines[C], Taylor & Wilder) met Monday, April 2, 2018 and discussed a request from the sheriff to adjust six part-time control booth operator positions to be subject to the six percent retirement withholding once they receive 1,000 hours/year. The committee was informed this request would allow the six positions to work over 19 hours and up to 29 hours a week, would ensure better coverage of the control booths and avoid additional overtime hours for fulltime positions. This arrangement has been made in the Fire department and EMS department previously and the anticipated cost is not expected to exceed \$3,500 annually. The committee recommended proceeding with the change. *Recommendation: Approve payment of retirement system contributions for six part-time Control Booth Operator positions, effective May 1, 2018.*

Implementation of Salary Study. The committee was informed that staff intends to include the second and final phase of the salary study into the recommended budget. The estimated total cost is \$285,000 with a net county cost of \$228,000. Approximately 2/3 of county employees will have received some adjustment as a result of the study. *For Your Information.*

FY2018-19 Bonus Coinciding with Payroll Period Change. The committee was informed that recent informational meetings with county staff discussing implementation of the payroll period change in October have concluded. Based upon input from the meetings, implementation of the change will be spread over two months (September and October), and management staff recommends moving forward with an \$800 bonus for all full-time employees during the month of October to coincide with the change. Management staff intends to include the bonus in the recommended budget regardless of the payroll period change and feels that an advanced consensus from the board to proceed with the bonus will allow for communication to staff prior to approval of the budget in June. As discussed at the planning retreat, approximately 1/3 of county employees are not receiving any adjustments from the salary study which would result in them not receiving any adjustments for 3 years without a COLA or bonus for the upcoming year. The total cost of the bonus is approximately \$270,000 and would have minimal impact on the available fund balance for the upcoming fiscal year. A majority of committee members were in favor of proceeding with the bonus. *Seeking Board consensus to proceed with an \$800 bonus, subject to withholding and retirement, for all full-time employees for the upcoming budget to be implemented in October, 2018.*

Manager Evaluation Format. The committee discussed the existing format utilized for annual review of the manager and requested that HR staff begin researching and compiling other formats for review. The committee asked staff to consider performance based evaluation formats that are metric or data based. *For Your Information.*

Finance Director's Report to the Board
April 9, 2018

A. Surplus Property. *Recommendation: Approve the property presented as surplus and authorize the Finance Director to dispose of said property accordingly as allowed by state statute.*

B. Adoption of Capital Improvement Plan for FY 2019-2023. The Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) is a five year planning tool used to identify capital projects and coordinate the financing and timing of those projects. The CIP has gone through its annual review and update process. A draft of the CIP was presented to the Board during the annual planning retreat for review and comments. The draft you received at that time has undergone minor changes including increasing the expense for CAD interface hardware in FY 18-19 for the general fund by \$5,000 to include mounts and installation cost as well as an increase in the fire tax fund of \$45,000 for the same purpose. Also, the annual capital outlay appropriation for VGCC was increased by \$17,500 with \$10,000 of this designated to be used for replacement of groundskeeper equipment. The first year of the CIP (FY 18-19) mirrors the manager's recommended budget you will receive in May. *Recommendation: Adopt the Capital Improvement Plan for fiscal years 2019-2023 as presented.*

A. EDC Office Space Swap. The Economic Development Director has been approached by Benchmark Bank, a neighboring tenant at 1775 Graham Avenue to request an office swap. The bank has interest in the larger, first floor space and has offered to cover all moving expenses, IT related expenses, as well as the lease for the next two years through April 30, 2020. The existing space is leased at a rate of \$1,300 a month for 768 square feet and the new lease would be \$636.50 a month for approximately 500 square feet. The Economic Development Director and I have reviewed the space and recommend proceeding with the swap. *Recommendation: Approve a new 12 month lease agreement for relocation of EDC office from Suite 105 to Suite 204 at 1775 Graham Avenue, subject to moving related costs and lease costs being covered by Benchmark Community Bank for two years and subject to final attorney review.*

B. Fireworks Permit - Tourism. The Vance County Tourism Department is requesting approval of a fireworks permit for its annual Independence Day celebration at Kerr Lake. According to Tourism Director Nancy Wilson, the work will be contracted with a professional pyrotechnics firm which has the appropriate credentials and insurance coverage. *Recommendation: Approve the request from Tourism for a permit to discharge fireworks at its annual Independence Day celebration at Kerr Lake on Saturday, June 30, 2018, contingent upon the necessary approvals from the fire marshal.*

C. FY 2018-19 Budget Update. The FY 2017-18 manager's recommended budget is scheduled to be presented to the Board of Commissioners on Monday, May 7. *For information only.*

**AGREEMENT OF LEASE
(Office Lease)**

THIS LEASE AGREEMENT, made on _____, 2018, by and between **BARNETT REAL PROPERTIES, INC.**, a Georgia corporation (hereinafter called "Landlord"), party of the first party, and **COUNTY OF VANCE**, a political subdivision of the State of North Carolina (hereinafter called "Tenant"), party of the second part.

WITNESSETH:

The parties hereto agree for themselves, their successors and assigns, as follows:

1. **Premises.** Landlord hereby leases to Tenant, and Tenant hereby accepts and rents from Landlord, that certain **Space No. 204** (hereinafter called "Demised Premises"), containing approximately **500** square feet, shown and cross-hatched on the plan attached hereto as Exhibit A and made a part hereof by reference, which Demised Premises is part of an office building known as **1775 Graham Avenue** (hereinafter called "Building"), erected or to be erected at **1775 Graham Avenue, Henderson, North Carolina**, on that tract of land described in Exhibit B attached hereto and made a part hereof by reference, together with the non-exclusive right to use all of the parking areas, driveways, entrance ways, walkways and other common facilities furnished from time to time in Building by Landlord, all subject to such reasonable and uniform rules and regulations as may be prescribed by Landlord from time to time.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said demised premises and appurtenances upon the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth.

2. **Term.** The term of this lease shall commence on **May 1, 2018** and shall end at midnight on **April 30, 2019**.

3. **Rental.** During the term of this Lease Tenant shall pay to Landlord for the use and occupancy of the Demised Premises and appurtenances thereto fixed minimum rent at the rate of **Seven Thousand Six Hundred Thirty-Eight and 00/100 Dollars (\$7,638.00)** per year, payable in monthly installments of **Six Hundred Thirty-Six and 50/100 Dollars (\$636.50)**, plus any Federal, State, County, City or other Sales/Rent Tax which Landlord from time to time is required by law to collect. Monthly installments of rental shall be due and payable to Landlord at **1775 Graham Avenue, Suite 201, Henderson, NC 27536** or at such other place as Landlord shall designate in writing, in advance on or before the first (1st) day of each and every calendar month, beginning on the Rental Commencement Date (as herein defined) and continuing throughout the term of this Lease. As used herein, the "Rental Commencement Date" shall be **May 1, 2018**.

4. **Improvements and Delivery of Demised Premises.** If at the time of the execution of this Lease by Tenant, the building and the Demised Premises have not been completed, Landlord shall, at its own cost and expense, construct or cause to be constructed the Building and the Demised Premises on the property described in Exhibit B, all in accordance with plans and specifications prepared or to be prepared by Landlord and incorporating therein the provisions set forth in Exhibit C, if any, attached hereto and made a part hereof, or if no Exhibit C is attached hereto, in accordance with plans and specifications approved or to be approved by both parties hereto, provided that neither party shall unreasonably withhold any such approval required of it. All such work shall be performed by Landlord in good and workmanlike manner and in accordance with all applicable government regulations; and upon completion of such work Landlord shall deliver the Demised Premises to Tenant by giving Tenant written notice of completion.

If at the time of the execution of this Lease by Tenant the Building and the Demised Premises have been completed, then Tenant acknowledges that it has examined and accepts the same in their present condition, except as expressly provided in Exhibit C, if any, attached hereto and made a part hereof; and the Demised Premises shall be deemed delivered to Tenant upon the execution of this Lease by Landlord.

At any time prior to delivery of the Demised Premises as aforesaid, Tenant shall have the right at its own risk to enter upon the demised premises for the purpose of taking measurements therein and for any other reasonable purpose expressly permitted by Landlord; provided, however, that such entry shall not interfere with any of the work then being done by or on behalf of Landlord, and Tenant shall indemnify Landlord against any loss or liability arising therefrom.

5. **Use of Demised Premises.** Tenant shall use the Demised Premises for **general office use** and for no other purpose. Tenant shall not suffer or permit the Demised Premises or any part thereof to be used in any manner, or anything to be done therein, or allow or permit anything to be brought into or kept in the Demised Premises which in any way (a) violate any law or requirement of public authorities, (b) cause structural damage to the Building or any part thereof, (c) interfere with the normal operations of the heating, air conditioning, ventilation, plumbing, electrical or other mechanical systems of the Building, or (d) constitute a public or private nuisance.

6. **Landlord Maintenance.** Provided Landlord shall have knowledge of the need thereof, Landlord shall at Landlord's own expense, make all structural repairs and maintain the roof, exterior and public areas of the Building in good order and repair and maintain in good condition and make (a) all repairs to the structure of the Demised Premises, (b) all repairs to all electric wiring, risers, plumbing, heating and air-conditioning facilities serving the Demised

Premises (other than any of the foregoing installed by Tenant), except that Landlord shall not be required to make any repairs referred to in subdivisions (a) or (b) of this sentence if Tenant is obligated to make such repairs pursuant to the provisions of Paragraph 7 hereof. Tenant shall promptly notify Landlord of the necessity of any repairs of which Tenant may have knowledge and for which Landlord may be responsible under the provisions of this Section.

7. **Tenant Maintenance.** Tenant shall take good care of the Demised Premises, the fixtures, equipment and appurtenances therein, except those repairs required to be made by Landlord pursuant to Paragraph 6 hereof, and Tenant shall, at Tenant's own expense, make all repairs to the Demised Premises when needed to preserve them in good working order and condition, including without limitation the interior décor, floor coverings and interior and exterior doors to the Demised Premises. All damage or injury to the Demised Premises and its fixtures, glass, appurtenances, and equipment or to the Building or its fixtures, glass, appurtenances, and equipment caused by Tenant moving property in or out of the Building or by installation or removal of furniture, fixtures, or other property, or resulting from fire, explosion, short circuits, flow or leakage of water, or by leaking of pipes or plumbing or from any other cause of any other kind or nature whatsoever, due to carelessness, omission, neglect, improper conduct, or other cause of Tenant, its servants, employees, agents, visitors, or licensees, shall be repaired, restored, or replaced promptly by Tenant to the reasonable satisfaction of Landlord at Tenant's sole cost and expense except to the extent of such cost and expense covered by proceeds of insurance recovered by Landlord. All of said repairs and any restorations or replacements required in connection therewith shall be quality and class at least equal to the original work or installations and shall be done in a good and workmanlike manner.

8. **Landlord Services and Utilities.** So long as Tenant is not in default under any of the provisions of this lease, Landlord, at Landlord's sole cost and expense, shall provide the following services and utilities:

(a) Landlord, at Landlord's expense, shall supply heat during the heating seasons, air conditioning during the cooling seasons, and ventilation from the system installed by Landlord during the hours of 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Mondays through Friday, holidays excepted, which the parties hereto agree are the hours of normal occupancy.

(b) Landlord shall furnish hot and cold water for lavatory, drinking and office cleaning purposes.

(c) Landlord shall at all times during the term of this lease regularly clean and maintain in good condition and repair the parking areas, driveways, walkways, common stairways, lobbies, common restrooms, and other common facilities of the Building.

(d) Landlord shall furnish the electric energy that Tenant shall require in the Demised Premises on a rent inclusion basis. That is, there shall be no charge to Tenant for such electric energy which shall be included in Landlord's services which are covered by the fixed minimum rent. The amount included in the fixed minimum rent was based upon the normal use of such electrical energy for lighting and the operation of the machinery, appliances and equipment normally used in Tenant's business. Tenant, however, shall furnish and install all tubes, lamps, bulbs and ballasts required in the Demised Premises at Tenant's expense.

(e) In general, during the term of this Lease, Landlord shall pay for all electricity, natural gas, water, heat, sewer, and garbage service required for the provision of Landlord's services to the Demised Premises under this Lease.

9. **Common Facilities.** All common facilities in the Building shall at all times be subject to the exclusive control and management of Landlord, and Landlord shall have the right to restrict parking by Tenants and their employees to designated areas, and to make all rules and regulations and to do such other things from time to time as in Landlord's discretion may be necessary regarding the said common facilities.

10. **Taxes.** Landlord covenants and agrees to pay promptly all taxes and assessments of every kind or nature which are now or may hereafter be imposed or assessed upon the Demised Premises, except as otherwise expressly provided in this Lease. Landlord shall not be required to pay any taxes or assessments of any nature imposed or assessed upon fixtures, equipment, merchandise or other property installed in the Demised Premises or brought thereon by Tenant or any other person, but such shall be the obligation of the Tenant, and Tenant agrees that it will promptly pay all taxes or assessments as the same become due.

11. **Landlord's Insurance.** Landlord shall maintain and pay for adequate fire and casualty insurance, with extended coverage, on the Demised Premises, and public liability insurance on the common areas in the Building. If Tenant's use of the Demised Premises causes an increase in any of Landlord's insurance costs, Tenant will reimburse Landlord the amount of the increase within thirty (30) days after receipt of written notice by Landlord of the amount due.

12. **Tenant's Insurance.** Tenant, at Tenant's expense, shall maintain adequate fire and casualty insurance on Tenant's leasehold improvements, fixtures, equipment, merchandise in the Demised Premises. Tenant, at Tenant's own expense, shall maintain and keep in force public liability insurance protecting and indemnifying Landlord and Tenant against any and all claims for injury or damage to persons or property or for the loss of life or of property occurring upon, in or about the Demised Premises or the public portions of the

Building used by Tenant, its employees, agents, customers and invitees; such public liability insurance shall be in the minimum amount of \$500,000.00 for bodily injury or death to any one or more persons and for property damage. All such insurance required to be maintained by Tenant shall be issued by insurance companies acceptable to Landlord. On or before the Rental Commencement Date, Tenant shall furnish Landlord with a copy or certificate evidencing the aforesaid insurance coverage.

13. **Damage or Destruction by Casualty.** If the Demised Premises are damaged or destroyed during the term of this lease by fire or other casualty covered by an ordinary fire insurance policy with extended coverage, Tenant shall give immediate written notice thereof to Landlord; and Landlord will reconstruct the Demised Premises or repair such damage as promptly as practicable, and Tenant shall meanwhile be entitled to an abatement of rental to the extent of the loss of use suffered by it; provided, however, that if the Demised Premises or the Building shall be damaged, destroyed by casualty to the extent of fifty (50%) percent or more of the replacement value, Landlord may, Landlord's option within (30) days after the occurrence, terminate this lease.

14. **Indemnity.** Tenant covenants and agrees that it will defend, indemnify, protect and save harmless the Landlord from the claims of all persons arising from or out of the use or occupancy of the Demised Premises by or under Tenant or Tenant's agents, employees or invitees.

15. **Fixtures and Personal Property.** Any trade fixtures, equipment and other personal property placed in the Demised Premises by or at the expense of Tenant shall remain the property of Tenant, and Tenant shall have the right at any time, provided it is not then in default hereunder, to remove any and all of such fixtures; provided, however, that in such event Tenant shall restore the Demised Premises to substantially the same condition in which they were at the time Tenant took possession, ordinary wear and tear and Landlord's covenant to maintain excepted.

16. **Surrender of Premises.** Upon the expiration or other termination of the term of this Lease, Tenant shall quit and surrender the Demised Premises in good order and condition, ordinary wear and tear and damage by fire or other casualty excepted, and shall remove all its property therefrom, except as otherwise provided in this Lease. Tenant's obligation to observe or perform this covenant shall survive the expiration or other termination of the term of this Lease.

17. **Landlord's Entry.** The Landlord shall have the right to enter upon the Demised Premises at all reasonable times during the term of this Lease for the purposes of inspection, maintenance, repair and alteration and to show the same to prospective tenants.

18. **Assignment and Sublease.** Tenant may not assign this lease or sublet the demised premises or any portion thereof without the prior written consent of Landlord; but such consent shall not be unreasonably withheld

19. **Default.** If Tenant shall continue in default in the payment of any rental or other sum of money becoming due hereunder for a period of ten (10) days after notice of such default has been given to Tenant, or if Tenant shall default in the performance of any other covenant of this lease and does not remedy such default within thirty (30) days after written notice thereof or does not within such thirty (30) days commence such act or acts as shall be necessary to remedy such default and shall complete such act or acts promptly, or if Tenant shall become insolvent or be adjudicated bankrupt, or file in any court a petition in bankruptcy or other debtor proceedings, or file or have filed against it a petition for the appointment of a receiver or trustee for all or substantially all of the assets of Tenant and such appointment shall not be vacated or set aside within twenty (20) days from the date of such appointment, or if Tenant makes an assignment for the benefit of creditors, or petitions for or enters into an arrangement, or if Tenant shall vacate or abandon the demised premises or any substantial part thereof, or suffer the lease to be taken or encumbered under any legal process and such taking or encumbrance is not dissolved within twenty (20) days, then in any such event Landlord shall have the right and option to terminate this lease and shall have the immediate right of re-entry to remove all persons and property from the demised premises and dispose of or store such property as it sees fit, all without resort to legal process and without being deemed guilty of trespass. If Landlord elects not to terminate this lease, Landlord may retake possession of the demised premises and relet them for the benefit of the Tenant. If Landlord elects to terminate this lease, the remaining rent for the term of this lease shall be immediately due and payable.

20. **Eminent Domain.** In the event that all or a material part of the Building shall be taken under the power of eminent domain (including any conveyance made in lieu thereof), this Lease shall cease and terminate as of the date of vesting of title. In the event that a portion of the Demised Premises is taken by eminent domain (including any conveyance made in lieu thereof) and the portion of the Demised Premises not so taken will not, in the reasonable business judgment of both Landlord and Tenant, be suitable for the operation of Tenant's business, notwithstanding Landlord's performance of restoration as hereinafter set forth, then and in such event, Tenant shall have the right to terminate this Lease by giving Landlord written notice of such termination within thirty (30) days after notice of such taking; and if Tenant does not elect to terminate this lease, Landlord at its own expense will repair and restore the Demised Premises to a tenantable condition, the rental to be paid by tenant hereunder shall be proportionately and equitably reduced, and Tenant's right to cancel will be waived thereafter.

If more than ten (10%) percent of the floor area of the Building is taken, or if more than ten (10%) percent of the common facilities is taken, Landlord shall have the right, at its option, to terminate this Lease by giving Tenant notice in writing within sixty (60) days after notice of such taking.

In the event that only a part of the Demised Premises shall be so taken and this Lease and the term hereby granted area not terminated as hereinabove provided, Landlord, will, at Landlord's expense, restore with reasonable diligence the remaining structural portions of the Demised Premises as nearly as practicable to the same conditions as it was in prior to such taking.

If this lease is terminated under the provisions of this Paragraph, rent shall be apportioned and adjusted as of the date of termination, Tenant shall have no claims against Landlord for the value of its leasehold estate or for the value of the unexpired term of the lease. All compensation awarded upon a taking of the Demised Premises or the remainder of the Building shall belong to the Landlord without any participation by Tenant. However, nothing herein contained shall be construed to preclude Tenant from prosecuting any claim directly against the condemning authority for loss of business, damage to or cost of removal of trade fixtures, furniture and other personal property belonging to Tenant; provided that no such claim shall diminish or adversely affect Landlord's award.

21. **Notices.** All notices provided for in this Lease Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed to be given when sent by prepaid registered or certified mail to the parties as follows: to the Landlord in care of Barnett Properties, Inc., 1775 Graham Avenue, Suite 201, Henderson, North Carolina 27536, and to the Tenant at **c/o County Manager, Vance County Courthouse, 122 Young Street, Suite B, Henderson, NC 27536.** Either party may, from time to time, by notice as herein provided, designate a different address to which notices to it shall be sent.

22. **Holding Over.** If Tenant remains in possession of the Demised Premises or any part thereof after the expiration of the term of this Lease with Landlord's acquiescence and without any written agreement of the parties, Tenant shall be only a tenant at will and there shall be no renewal of this Lease or exercise of an option by operation of law.

23. **Subordination.** Tenant will, upon request by Landlord, subject and subordinate all or any of its rights under this lease agreement to any and all mortgages and deeds of trust now existing or hereafter placed on the property of which the demised premises are a part; provided, however, that Tenant will not be disturbed in the use or enjoyment of the Demised Premises so long as it is not in default hereunder. Tenant agrees that this Lease shall remain in full force and effect notwithstanding any default or foreclosure under any such mortgage or deed of trust and that it will attorn to the mortgagee, trustee or beneficiary of such mortgage or deed of trust, and their successors or assigns, and to the

purchaser or assignee under any such foreclosure. Tenant will, upon request by Landlord, execute and deliver to Landlord, or to any other person designated by Landlord, and instrument or instruments required to give effect to the provisions of this paragraph.

24. **Transfer of Landlord's Interest.** In the event of the sale, assignment or transfer by Landlord of its entire interest in the Building or in this Lease (other than a collateral assignment to secure a debt of Landlord) to a successor in interest who expressly assumes the obligations of Landlord hereunder, Landlord shall thereupon be released or discharged from all of its covenants and obligations hereunder, except such obligations as shall have accrued prior to any such sale, assignment or transfer; and Tenant agrees to look solely to such successor in interest of Landlord for performance of such obligations. Any securities given by Tenant to Landlord to secure performance of Tenant's obligations hereunder may be assigned and transferred by Landlord to such successor in interest of Landlord; and, upon acknowledgment by such successor of receipt of such security and its express assumption of the obligation to account to tenant for such security in accordance with the terms of this Lease, Landlord shall thereby be discharged of any further obligation relating thereto. Landlord's assignment of the lease or of any or all of its rights herein shall in no manner affect Tenant's obligations hereunder. Tenant shall thereafter attorn and look to such assignee, as Landlord, provided Tenant has first received written notice of such assignment of Landlord's interest.

The term "Landlord" as used in the Lease means only the owner for the time being of the Building in which the premises are located. Landlord shall be under no personal liability with respect to any of the provisions of this Lease and if Landlord is in default with respect to its obligations under this Lease, Tenant shall look solely to the equity of the Landlord in the premises for the satisfaction of Tenant's remedies.

25. **Warranty.** Landlord warrants that it has full right and authority to lease the Demised Premises upon the terms and conditions herein set forth; and that Tenant shall peacefully and quietly hold and enjoy the Demised Premises for the full term hereof so long as it does not default in the performance of any of its covenants hereunder.

26. **Short Form Lease.** Upon the request of either party, the parties hereto shall execute a memorandum or short form lease, in recordable form, specifying the commencement and termination dates of the term hereof and including any such other provisions hereof as both parties may agree to incorporate therein.

27. **Estoppel Certificate.** Within ten (10) days after request therefor by Landlord or any mortgagee or trustee under a mortgage or deed of trust covering the Demised Premises, or if, upon any sale, assignment or other transfer of the Demised Premises by Landlord, an estoppel certificate shall be required from Tenant, Tenant shall deliver in recordable form a statement to any proposed mortgagee or other transferee, or to Landlord, certifying any facts that are then true with respect to this Lease, including without limitation (if such be the case) that this Lease is in full force and effect, that Tenant is in possession, that Tenant has commenced the payment of rent, and there are no defenses or offsets to the Lease Agreement claimed by Tenant.

28. **Security Deposit.** At the time of execution of this Lease, Tenant has paid to Landlord, and Landlord hereby acknowledges receipt of **N/A** as advance payment of the Guaranteed Minimum Rental for a period of **N/A**.

29. **Rules and Regulations.** Tenant, its servants, employees, agents, visitors and licensees shall observe faithfully and comply strictly with the rules and regulations set forth in Exhibit D attached hereto and made a part hereof by reference. Landlord shall have the right from time to time during the term of this Lease to make reasonable changes in and additions to the rules thus set forth, provided such changes and additions are applicable to all of the office tenants in the Building.

30. **Nature and Extent of Agreement.** This instrument contains the complete agreement of the parties regarding the terms and conditions of the lease of the Demised Premises, and there are no oral or written conditions, terms, understandings, or other agreements pertaining thereto which have not been incorporated herein. This instrument creates only the relationship of Landlord and Tenant between the parties hereto as to the Demised Premises; and nothing herein shall in any way be construed to impose upon either party hereto any obligations or restrictions not herein expressly set forth.

31. **Binding Effect.** This Lease shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns.

32. **Existing Lease Termination.** The existing lease between Landlord and Tenant dated September 17, 2015, shall terminate on the Rental Commencement Date.

33. **Option to Renew.** The Tenant shall have two one-year options to extend the term of the Lease. The option may be exercised by Tenant by providing written notice to Landlord ninety (90) days prior to the Lease expiration date. The fixed minimum rent for the option period shall be three percent more than the prior period rent.

34. **Relocation of Office.** Tenant will be relocating from Suite 105 to Suite 204. For the move, Tenant will be responsible for coordinating the move with the existing tenant in Suite 204. In the event the move occurs prior to May 1, 2018, Landlord will prorate the rents from Suites 204 of \$636.00 per month and Suite 105 of \$1,300.00 per month based on the number of days in each suite, as submitted and approved by both tenants. Without notice from tenants to the contrary, the rent commencement for Suite 204 will be May 1, 2018.
