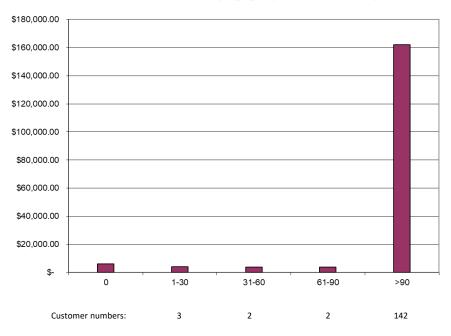
The current residential customer count is as follows:

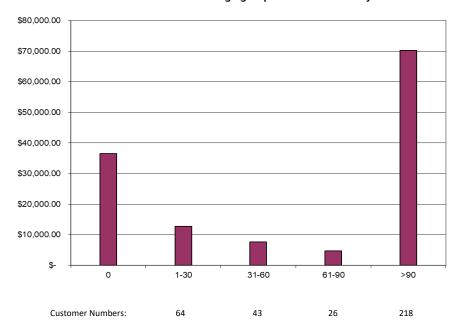
Availability Aging Report for Vance County

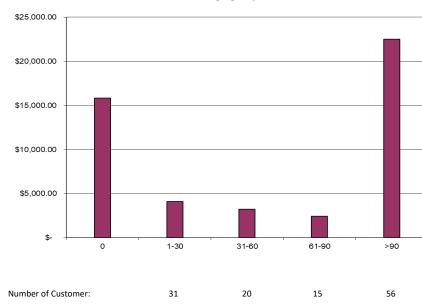

Committee Reports and Recommendations

Vance County Committee Reports and Recommendations September 8, 2020

General Government Committee

Resolution – Policy and Procedures for County Appointments to Boards, Commissions, and Committees. The committee (Feimster[C], Faines & Hester [absent]) met on Wednesday, August 19, 2020 to discuss allowing non-citizens to serve on county appointed boards, commissions and committees. The current policy requires individuals to be citizens of Vance County to serve, although there has been interest and the board has made exceptions to allow highly qualified individuals who work for businesses in or regularly serving Vance County to serve. The committee discussed the need for individuals to serve who are interested in improving the community and also mentioned concerns with choosing non-residents over residents. The committee discussed the need to ensure opportunities to serve are publicized and requested staff to provide a review of boards, commissions and committees to include a listing of current openings. Staff has included a listing of county appointed boards, commissions, and committees and current openings. The committee was agreeable and recommended approval of the revised policy. Recommendation: Approve revised policy and procedures resolution allowing employees of local businesses in or regularly serving Vance County to serve on county appointed boards, commissions, and committees.

Intergovernmental Committee

McGregor Hall Funding Request. The committee (Taylor[C], Feimster & Kelly) met on Wednesday, August 26, 2020 to review a request from McGregor Hall for funding assistance as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. The committee discussed the impact of COVID-19 on McGregor which includes a \$100,000 overall decrease in revenue compared to last year (from March 16th – July 10th) and recognized the county could not provide the requested funding level of \$250,000. The committee recognized the local economic impact of McGregor (\$2.34 million according to 2019 economic impact study) and discussed the importance of McGregor to the continued growth and success of downtown Henderson and Vance County. The committee was made aware that the City Manager has allocated \$30,000 in city coronavirus relief funds (CRF) for McGregor Hall, subject to city council approval and discussed a recommendation from the County Manager to allocate \$50,000 in onetime funding to McGregor from the County's CRF funds. Two of the three committee members were in agreement and recommended supporting McGregor with \$50,000 in CRF funds. The third committee member mentioned a concern with allocating all of the remaining CRF funds and suggested providing \$30,000 to McGregor. Based upon guidance from the committee, an allocation of \$50,000 is included on the proposed CRF budget for approval under the Finance Director's report. For Your Information.

RESOLUTION

by the

Vance County Board of Commissioners For the Policy and Procedures for Appointments to County Boards, Commissions, and Committees

- WHEREAS, it is the statutory duty of the Vance County Board of Commissioners, as the Governing Body of Vance County, to appoint citizens to various boards, commissions, or committees to assist in the operation of county government; and
- **WHEREAS**, the County Commissioners recognize and value the role of public service by citizens in the proper governance of the County; and
- WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners is desirous of appointing qualified, knowledgeable, and dedicated people to serve on these boards, commissions, or committees, and thus solicits the interest and input of citizens-residents and employees of local businesses of Vance County in making such appointments; and
- **WHEREAS,** the Board of Commissioners desires to enhance overall representativeness of the appointments to be made from time to time by the Board, to increase the public interest and awareness in the appointment process, to require attendance at meetings, and to ensure operational effectiveness of boards, commissions, and committees as appropriate.
- **NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,** by the Vance County Board of Commissioners, that:
- **Section I.** The policy of Vance County governing appointments to the various boards, commissions, or committees made by the Board of Commissioners is <u>updated and</u> <u>is</u> as follows:
 - A. Any <u>eitizen</u> resident of Vance County or employee of a local business in or regularly serving of Vance County is eligible to serve on the appointed boards, commissions, or committees of the County where such appointment is not prohibited or otherwise guided by State statute, federal regulations, or local law.
 - B. All appointments will be made according to the North Carolina Statute or County Ordinance that created that board, commission, or committee.

- C. No <u>citizen individual of Vance County</u> may serve in more than three appointed positions of Vance County Government unless exempted by nature of the position held in governmental service.
- D. No <u>citizen-individual</u> may serve more than ten (10) consecutive years on any board, commission, committee or authority unless the individual has served for less than 10 years at the time his/her term expires, then he/she shall be eligible for re-appointment of one additional term. This policy may be waived if the Board of County Commissioners determines that the removal of one or more individuals made ineligible by this ordinance would be detrimental to the functioning of that board, commission, or committee.
- E. If an appointee misses three consecutive meetings without notifying the committee chairperson prior to the meeting, the appointee will be considered to have resigned his or her appointment. The committee chairperson shall be responsible for notifying the Clerk to the Board of the vacancy and the Board of County Commissioners will be free to appoint a new individual to serve the remaining term.
- F. Appointee must uphold all applicable policies pertaining to the board, commission, or committee on which he or she serves.

Section II. Procedures for filling vacancies for appointed positions:

A. <u>Notification of available appointments</u>

- 1. A list of available positions stating terms of office, requirements for office, and duties of positions shall be available for public inspection at the Office of the Clerk to the Board of County Commissioners.
- 2. A list of available positions that will be considered by the Board of Commissioners during the year will be published in the newspaper of Vance County one time during the month of January.

B. Selection Process

- 1. Individuals interested in applying for appointment shall complete the County application and submit to the Clerk to the Board of County Commissioners.
- 2. The Clerk to the Board shall provide to the County Commissioners the names of individuals who have applied for appointment.

C. Applications

All applications for appointments shall remain active and on file with the Clerk to the Board for at least the remainder of the calendar year in which received, or for six months, whichever is longer.

Section III. The policy of the Board of Commissioners for boards, commissions, and committees under its direction and control which may not be functioning as intended, inactive, or otherwise not serving as deemed appropriate by the Commissioners is as follows:

- A. The Board of Commissioners may elect to require reports of activities and related information from boards, commissions, and committees as appropriate.
- B. The Board of Commissioners may replace any or all members of the board, commission, or committee as it deems appropriate.
- C. In accordance with existing laws, Commissioners may by resolution abolish, redirect, increase or decrease the membership of, or take any necessary actions to ensure that the board, commission, or committee is functioning according to its intended purpose.

Dear Mr. McMillen-

As is the case with many businesses and nonprofits in our community right now, McGregor Hall is reeling from the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. I'd like to enumerate some of the challenges we've faced so far in this crisis, along with some that we know are coming.

In the 2020 period from March 16 (the day we closed for the safety of our patrons and employees) through today, July 10, we've seen:

- a 75% reduction in our Business and Corporate contributions against 2019, representing a loss of nearly \$60,000
- a 91% reduction in our sales income against 2019, representing a loss of nearly \$70,000 in ticket and concessions sales
- a 100% reduction in our venue rental income against 2019, representing a loss of nearly \$20,000 against 2019
- a \$100,000 decrease in our gross revenue against the same period in 2019. The only revenue we've
 been able to generate during that period has been from three online fundraisers and liquidation of a
 small property received in an estate gift
- Because we hold our personnel costs at only 9% of our total budget, we were only able to receive \$15,500 from the Payroll Protection Program

Additionally, we have several ominous factors that will continue this trend until we are able to resume large gatherings, hopefully following the availability of a proven COVID-19 vaccine in the first half of 2021:

- We've been forced to cancel our traditional slate of ticketed programming for the 2020-2021 season which normally begins in September. Last season this represented \$207,000 in ticket sales.
- We've been forced to cancel all booked rentals and not to accept any new ones until there is a safe way for large groups to gather. In the 2020-2021 season venue rentals represented over \$59,000 in revenue.
- Because of the previously listed cancellations, we will have no income from concessions and other miscellaneous sales, which
 represented over \$47,000 in the 2019 calendar year.
- Our USDA annual mortgage payment of \$124,620 is due annually whether we are generating revenue or not!

Our primary mission is an economic one. The arts just happens to be the way we accomplish it. We have previously shared with you the 2019 NC State Municipal Research Lab study, showing that McGregor Hall has, since its opening in 2016, been responsible for 5.5% of all economic growth in Vance County. This growth has happened with no financial support from either Vance County or the City of Henderson. The NC Presenters Consortium has also confirmed that we are the only performing arts center of our size in North Carolina operating with no municipal, county, or higher education support of any kind. Let's change that! Our creation of economic stimulus helps both governments and every community around us. No one knows the future, but when we are able to reopen we anticipate substantial new safety-related sanitation expenditures we have not had in the past. \$250,000 in emergency support from Vance County and the City of Henderson would help us emerge from this pandemic in a strong position, enabling McGregor Hall to continue to have the extensive economic impact on our region that we have already proven is possible. Thank you for your support and consideration.

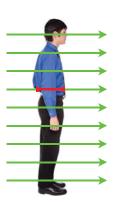

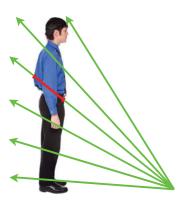

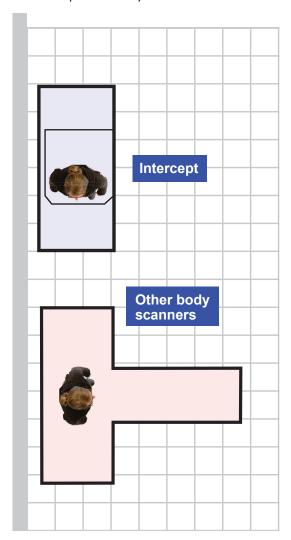

County Manager's Report

Vance County County Manager's Report to the Board September 8, 2020

- **A.** Legislative Goals. The NC Association of County Commissioners (NCACC) 2021-2022 biennium legislative goals process is underway. A listing of goals in no particular order is provided for your consideration and approval prior to submittal to NCACC.
 - 1. Tire Disposal Support legislation to restore previous year funding levels to counties within the state tire program and support legislation assisting counties with growing numbers and costs associated with tire disposal.
 - 2. Broadband Request funding, support, and flexibility within GREAT grant funds and other funds for expanding broadband access to rural communities.
 - 3. Electronics Waste Support legislation to remove computer equipment and televisions from the list of banned items from landfills or provide additional state funding to offset rising e-waste recycling costs.
 - 4. Education Lottery Funding Request General Assembly to reinstate education lottery funding back to 40% level.
 - 5. Support efforts to provide greater flexibility to local governments in the expenditure of 911 surcharge funds.
 - 6. Oppose unfunded mandates and shift of state responsibilities to counties.

Recommendation: Forward the proposed legislative goals as listed to the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners.

- **B.** Request to Replace 15 HVAC units at Jail The Sheriff and Jail Administrator have requested and provided justification for replacing the 15 roof-top HVAC units at the jail (see enclosed justification). Twelve of the fifteen units are original to the building and are 30 years old with the other three over 20 years old the typical life expectancy is fifteen years. The estimated cost of replacement is \$150,000. This project is not in the Capital Improvement Plan or the current year budget, although staff believes a portion or all of the funds may be available in lapsed salaries towards the end of the fiscal year. **Recommendation:** Approve replacement of 15 rooftop HVAC units at the jail at a cost not to exceed \$150,000.
- C. Economic Development Repayment Agreement TNCP ONE, LLC. The county has an existing agreement with TNCP, ONE, LLC that outlines the repayment terms for economic development incentives related to the former Semprius project. Several state and local incentives were given to Semprius and unfortunately when Semprius filed for bankruptcy and liquidated, they were unable to pay back the county. The property owner, TNCP ONE, LLC, then negotiated with the county and we signed a forbearance agreement and the property owner has been paying the county since late 2017 of which a majority has been repaid to the state with the county recouping its incentive dollars currently. The existing agreement (enclosed) includes three additional payments and will be satisfied when the final quarterly payment is made in April 2021. The property owner has requested a modification to the agreement that would remove the 3.5% interest paid and accruing, apply the paid interest payments to principal payment and they would make one final payment in full in October 2021. Dating back to the beginning of the agreement, the interest totals approximately \$25,000. The county previously denied a similar forgiveness request from the owner. Staff has concerns with this request and recommends no changes to the current economic development grant repayment terms. For Board Discussion.

- D. Volunteer Fire Department Contracts Addendum Flexible Use of Part-time Hours. During the August meeting the board directed staff to prepare amendments to the volunteer fire department contracts allowing for flexible use of the existing part-time positions. Currently each department receives \$87,326 to provide two part-time slots Monday Friday at 60 hours per position per week Epsom is the exception which receives \$43,663 for one part-time slot. The departments are interested in expanding the use of these slots to Saturdays and Sundays as well. The enclosed addendum for the volunteer fire department contracts removes the Monday Friday requirement providing the flexibility desired by the departments. Staff would like the board to be aware that the county has requested and has not received annual financial reviews, rosters, and other items required by contract from the rescue squad and the majority of volunteer departments. Recommendation: Approve volunteer fire department contract addendum that allows for reimbursement of part-time positions used any day of the week for fire protection services.
- E. Rescue Squad Contract Addendum and Budget Amendment. As requested by the board, the enclosed contract addendum and budget amendment provides additional funds to the rescue squad from the fire tax fund for the purpose of funding two part-time positions devoted to fire protection services. The rescue squad's current contract expires June 30, 2021 and does not include fire protection services as a part of their duties and does not include language supporting the use of county reimbursed part-time positions. The contract addendum outlines the requirements for reimbursement in a similar fashion as the volunteer fire departments contracts and limits the positions' use to fire protection services to allow use of the fire tax funds this fiscal year. The budget amendment allocates \$65,494.50 from the fire fund balance for the remaining nine months of the current fiscal year for supporting the positions at the rescue squad. The annual cost for the positions would be \$87,326. The manager would like the board to be aware of the following concerns before proceeding with this item:
 - 1. The fire fund balance cannot support these additional positions beyond FY22-23 without further changes and/or a tax increase (see enclosed affordability analysis). One solution would be reducing the existing part-time slots at the volunteer fire departments from 60 to 50 hours per week.
 - 2. The rescue squad's duties are being expanded beyond their current contracted "rescue services". Their contract does not currently specify or define fire protection services and what those services include. Without receiving the rescue squad roster we are unsure of their fire qualifications as it relates to providing fire protection services.
 - 3. The level of funding currently provided to the rescue squad is far beyond what other NC counties are providing for rescue services. The rescue squad currently receives \$102,775 from the general fund and the changes being made would provide an additional \$87,326 annually from the fire tax fund.

For Board Discussion and Consideration.

F. Resolution Expanding Use of Fire Tax Proceeds to include Rescue Services. The fire protection service district and tax was approved in June 2002 for implementation with FY2002-03 budget as an equitable way to provide funding to the fire departments serving those areas outside of the city limits. Prior to the fire tax fund creation the general fund was used to fund rural fire protection. This created a social policy issue whereas city property owners were shouldering the cost of providing fire protection services for areas outside the city limits. As a result the fire protection service district and tax was established for funding rural fire protection in areas outside the city limits.

During the August meeting the board directed staff to prepare a resolution allowing the rescue squad to utilize funds from the fire tax fund for the purpose of reimbursing the cost of two part-time positions/slots. The rescue squad currently receives \$102,775 annually from the general fund and two 60 hour/week part-time slots would provide them an additional \$87,326 in annual funding. Upon approval, the expansion of the fire tax to allow for rescue services use would not be effective until July 1, 2021 as per state law. *For Board Discussion and Consideration*.

Detention Center HVAC Proposal

There are 15 roof-top HVAC units on the Vance County Detention Center. Each unit has a separate area of the building which it cools. Because of necessary security features, there is very little air exchange between segments of the building. Consequently, if a unit breaks down, there is a section of the jail that does not have conditioned air. With the population of the dorms in excess of 20 people each, combined with the outside temperatures in the 90 degree range, it becomes uncomfortable rather quickly.

The HVAC units break down on a regular basis, requiring a service call to a local repair business. On August 12, 2020, we had three units not functioning properly. A service technician came and did what he could to get them going. One unit, which conditions the air in E Dorm has a severe refrigerant leak and is operating at less than 50% capacity. The other two units had minor repairs done to make them operational. Over this summer, six other units needed servicing and had some minor repairs done to keep them operational.

Of the 15 units, 12 are 5 ton units original to the building, installed in 1990/1991. One unit is a 7.5 ton unit original to the building. The unit over the kitchen is a 7.5 ton installed in 1998. The unit over processing was installed in 1998 and the other unit over the administrative area was installed in 2000. The life expectancy of a commercial unit is around 15 years. The service technician advised that getting 20 years out of a unit is exceptional. The newest unit we have is now in its 20th year. **Twelve units are 30 years old.**

The old units require repeated maintenance to keep working. Refrigerant and capacitors have to be addressed constantly and circuit boards had to be replaced a few months ago in some units. Additionally, as the units are aging, the efficiency is declining. From a cost stand point, the maintenance fees and energy costs add up and are going to grow exponentially, as several of the units are so far gone, that the technician said he can keep coming out and adding refrigerant to get us through the summer heat, but that the units ultimately need to be changed out.

The technician in question is not licensed to replace those type of units, only to service them, so he has nothing to gain by saying that. In fact, it is in his financial interest to keep the old units so that he can continue to charge us to repair them. Because of that, and critical thinking, I believe what he is saying about the units.

He estimates that whichever contractor we use would charge less for the job if we could change them all out at once. One reason is because crane rental is over \$100 an hour with a three hour minimum. If all were replaced at once, then a crew could come on site and have the entire job complete in a couple of days. He also said that we should estimate somewhere between \$8000 and \$10,000 per unit, with the \$10,000 being a very high estimate.

Considering the information above, along with the attached photographs, I respectfully request funding in the amount of \$150,000 to replace all 15 rooftop HVAC units at the Vance

County Detention Center, with the expectation that the actual cost will likely be significantly less than that amount.



The green units are all original to the building and are 30 years old.









The liquid on this unit is refrigerant that has leaked



This is the unit over the kitchen. It was installed in 1998. One other unit was installed in 1998 and the final unit was installed in 2000.

As evidenced by these photographs and the information presented previously, capital improvements at the Detention Center have not kept pace with life expectancy of the equipment. That, combined with decades of deferred maintenance have put us in the position that we are in now, which is approaching exigency.

FORBEARANCE AGREEMENT

This FORBEARANCE AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is dated as of November 7, 2017 (the "Effective Date"), by and among TNCP ONE, LLC, a North Carolina limited liability company ("TNCP" or "Obligor"), and VANCE COUNTY, a body politic and corporate of the State of North Carolina ("Vance County" or "Lender"). Obligor and Lender are each a "Party" and collectively, the "Parties".

RECITALS

- A. Obligor is indebted to Lender pursuant to a Community Development Block Grant Loan Agreement (the "CDBG Agreement") dated February 10, 2012 by and between Semprius, Inc. ("Semprius"), Lender and Obligor whereby Lender agreed to lend Semprius up to \$750,000.00. The obligations are evidenced by a Promissory Note which is secured by a Deed of Trust recorded in the Vance County Registry on February 14, 2012, at Book 1241, Page 22. While Semprius is the borrower under the terms of the CDBG Agreement, TNCP provided its real property (located at 145 Technology Lane, Triangle North Corporate Park, Henderson, NC (the "Property" or "Collateral")) as security for Lender (as evidenced by the Deed of Trust). There is currently \$620,000.00 due and payable pursuant to the terms of the CDBG Agreement. No interest is due and payable under the Promissory Note.
- B. Obligor is indebted to Lender pursuant to a Loan/Performance Agreement ("Rural Economic Development Center Loan") dated February 10, 2012 by and between Obligor, Semprius and Lender. The obligations are evidenced by a Promissory Note dated February 10, 2012 whereby Lender (pursuant to an agreement with the Rural Economic Development Center, Inc.) agreed to lend Obligor and Semprius up to \$550,000.00. There is currently \$208,620.72 due and payable pursuant to the Promissory Note.
- C. Obligor is indebted to Lender pursuant to a Loan/Performance Agreement ("Vance County Loan") dated February 10, 2012 by and between Obligor, Semprius and Lender. The obligations are evidenced by a Promissory Note dated February 10, 2012 whereby Lender agreed to lend Obligor and Semprius up to \$550,000.00. There is currently \$208,620.72 due and payable pursuant to the Promissory Note.
- D. The documents described in recital A-C of this Agreement, as modified and amended, if applicable, together with any UCC financing statements, other security instruments or other documents, if any, executed or filed in connection therewith, are collectively referred to as the "Existing Loan Documents". The Existing Loan Documents, together with this Agreement and any documents signed pursuant to this Agreement shall be collectively referred to as the "Loan Documents". All property of any kind that serves as security for the repayment of the Promissory Notes described in recitals A-C shall be collectively referred to as the "Collateral". All indebtedness, whether now existing or hereafter arising, that is due and owing by Obligor to Lender under the Loan Documents shall be collectively referred to as the "Obligations".
- E. Obligor acknowledges that the Existing Loan Documents are in default as a result of, among other things, the failure of Semprius to pay the amounts owed under the Promissory Notes as and when due (the "Existing Default"). As a result of the Existing Default, Obligor further acknowledges and agrees that: (1) all Obligations under the Existing Loan Documents are immediately due and payable in full; (2) this Agreement satisfies any required contractual or statutory notice requirements concerning notice of default, opportunity to cure, acceleration, demand for payment and notice concerning enforcement of attorneys' fees under North Carolina General Statutes § 6-21.2 and other applicable law; and (3) Lender is presently entitled to exercise any and all remedies available to it under the Existing Loan Documents and applicable law without further notice to Obligors.

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- F. Obligor has requested that, notwithstanding the occurrence of the Existing Default, Lender forbear from exercising its remedies otherwise presently available under the Existing Loan Documents and applicable law. Lender, subject to the express terms and conditions of this Agreement and the documents, instruments and agreements signed and to be signed pursuant to this Agreement, has agreed to this request.
- NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the mutual covenants hereinafter contained, the Parties do hereby stipulate, covenant and agree as follows:
- 1. <u>Defined Terms</u>. Any capitalized terms used but not defined in this Agreement shall have the meaning ascribed to them in the Existing Loan Documents. The recitals of this Agreement are incorporated herein by this reference. Any inconsistency between defined terms among the Existing Loan Documents shall be interpreted in favor of Lender. This Agreement shall control as to any inconsistency between defined terms in this Agreement and the Existing Loan Documents.
- 2. <u>Representations, Warranties and Acknowledgements</u>. To induce Lender to enter into this Agreement, Obligor makes the following representations, warranties, and acknowledgements to Lender, upon which Lender is materially relying to its detriment:
- 2.1 The representations, warranties, and acknowledgements made by any Obligor under or in connection with the Existing Loan Documents, except as to the Existing Default, remain true and correct in every respect as of the Effective Date and during the Forbearance Period (as defined below).
 - 2.2 The recitals of this Agreement are true and correct in every respect.
- 2.3 The Obligor is authorized under applicable law to sign, deliver and perform this Agreement and any documents required hereunder, which, when signed and delivered to Lender, will create legal, valid, and binding obligations of the Obligor enforceable in accordance with their terms.
- 2.4 The signing and delivery of this Agreement and the fulfillment and compliance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement will not conflict with the terms, conditions, or provisions of, nor constitute a violation, breach, or default under any contract, agreement, applicable law, regulation, judgment, writ, order, or decree to which the Obligor is subject.
- 2.5 The Obligor's liabilities and obligations to Lender under the Existing Loan Documents are valid and enforceable, and no Obligor has any defense, offset, or counterclaims against Lender with respect to the Obligations.
- 2.6 The liens, security interests, and other encumbrances in favor of Lender granted under the Existing Loan Documents are duly perfected and are not subject to avoidance or invalidation for any reason.
- 2.7 There are no pending or threatened actions, litigation, disputes, suits or proceedings against or in any way relating adversely to any Obligor or its properties before any court, arbitrator, or governmental or administrative body or agency.
- 2.8 Other than the Existing Loan Documents, Obligor has received no notice of default in the performance, observance, or fulfillment of any indebtedness, covenants, or conditions contained in any agreement or instrument to which the Obligor is a party or by which the Obligor's properties are bound.

- 2.9 Neither this Agreement nor any report, schedule, certificate, agreement, or any instrument heretofore or contemporaneously herewith provided to Lender by Obligor contains any misrepresentation or untrue statement of facts or omits to state any material facts.
- 2.10 To the best of its knowledge, Obligor is in compliance in all material respects with all federal, state, and local laws, rules, and regulations applicable to the Obligor's properties, operations, businesses, and finances.
- 2.11 Obligor acknowledges and agrees that, except as otherwise specifically provided in this Agreement, Lender has no obligation under the Loan Documents or otherwise to refrain from exercising its rights and remedies, to make any additional loans, advances or disbursements under the Loan Documents, or to provide further forbearance or extensions of time for payment of the Obligations.
- 2.12 Obligor acknowledges that the outstanding balance of the Promissory Notes as of the Effective Date, is as follows:
 - a. CDBG Agreement: \$620,000.00, which consists of principal of \$620,000.00 and no interest.
 - b. Rural Economic Development Center Loan: \$208,620.72, which consists of principal of \$208,620.72 and no interest.
 - Vance County Loan: \$208,620.72 which consists of principal of \$208,620.72 and no interest.
- 3. <u>Conditions of Forbearance</u>. Lender's obligation to forbear from exercising its remedies under the Loan Documents during the Forbearance Period (defined herein) is subject to the fulfillment of the following conditions precedent (each a "<u>Forbearance Condition</u>" and collectively the "<u>Forbearance Conditions</u>"):
- 3.1 <u>No Subsequent Defaults</u>. Other than the Existing Default, no new or additional defaults or events of default under the Loan Documents or this Agreement shall arise or occur.
- 3.2 <u>CDBG Agreement Payments.</u> Obligor shall make two (2) payments to satisfy the outstanding principal owed pursuant to the CDBG Agreement with Lender. Obligor shall make a payment of \$310,000.00 upon the execution of this Agreement. A second and final payment of \$310,000.00 shall be due and payable on or before June 15, 2018. Upon payment of the second installment on or before June 15, 2018, Obligor shall have no further obligations under the CDBG Agreement.
- 3.3 Rural Economic Development Center Loan/Vance County Loan. The Rural Economic Development Center Loan and Vance County Loan will be consolidated for repayment. All payments made on these loans will be allocated one-half to the Rural Economic Development Center Loan and one-half to the Vance County Loan (collectively, the "REDC/ Vance Loan"). Obligor shall make a payment of \$67,241.44 upon the execution of this Agreement to be applied to the outstanding principal of the REDC/ Vance Loan as described in Section 2.12, leaving a balance due under the REDC/ Vance Loan of \$350,000.00. The remaining outstanding balance of \$350,000.00 shall bear interest at the rate of 3.5% per annum and shall be repaid in quarterly installments of principal and interest as set out in Schedule A attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference; provided, however, Obligor shall make no quarterly payment of principal and interest on July 1, 2018 but instead interest will continue to accrue and the next quarterly payment of principal and interest shall be due on October 1, 2018. A final payment of all outstanding principal and interest shall be due and payable on April 1, 2021. The foregoing notwithstanding, the Obligor may prepay the obligation in whole or in part and the repayment schedule

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shall be recalculated accordingly. Any partial prepayment must be made at the same time as a regular quarterly payment is due unless the parties agree to the contrary.

3.4 [Intentionally Deleted]

- 3.5 <u>Representations and Warranties</u>. All representations and warranties contained in this Agreement and in the Loan Documents shall be true, correct, and complete as of the Effective Date and shall remain so during the Forbearance Period.
- 4. <u>Forbearance Period</u>. Subject to compliance by Obligors with each and every of the Forbearance Conditions, and every other term and condition of the Loan Documents, from and after a period commencing on the Effective Date and ending on the earlier to occur of (a) April 1, 2021, or (b) the date that any of the Forbearance Conditions are no longer satisfied (the "Forbearance Period"), Lender agrees that it will not exercise any remedy available to it under the Loan Documents or under any applicable law arising from the Existing Default to enforce collection from Obligors of any Obligations.
- 5. <u>Tolling / Waiver of Statute of Limitations</u>. Obligor hereby agrees to toll and suspend any applicable period of limitation, repose, or time, within which any cause, claim, action, cause of action or suit must be made or commenced by Lender. This tolling period shall be effective as of the Effective Date and shall expire upon the expiration of the Forbearance Period. Moreover, Obligor hereby waives any defense they may have as to the enforcement of the Obligations on the grounds that any such claim may be barred by the applicable statute of limitations and/or repose.
- 6. Waiver and Termination of Rights. Following failure to satisfy any Forbearance Condition, Obligor understands, acknowledges, and agrees that the Forbearance Period shall, at Lender's option, terminate, and all Obligations shall be immediately due and payable in full. In such event, Lender may enforce any and all rights and remedies available under the Loan Documents and applicable law without notice, and Obligor expressly waives any contractual or statutory notice requirements concerning notice of default, opportunity to cure, acceleration, demand for payment and notice concerning enforcement of attorneys' fees under North Carolina General Statutes § 6-21.2 and other applicable law.
- 7. <u>No Novation</u>. The execution of this Agreement constitutes a forbearance arrangement in respect of the Existing Default and is not a novation. Accordingly, Obligor stipulates and agrees that the liens and security interests granted under the Existing Loan Documents continue to secure payment of all Obligations, as modified pursuant to this Agreement, in accordance with their original priorities.
 - 8. [Intentionally Deleted]
- 9. <u>Additional Covenants</u>. In addition to the Covenants contained in the Existing Loan Documents, Obligors covenant and agree that until payment in full of all Obligations:
- 9.1 <u>Affirmative Covenants.</u> Obligor will, unless Lender shall otherwise consent in writing:
 - (a) Additional Documents. Sign and deliver such other and additional documents, instruments, and agreements as Lender may reasonably request to accomplish the purposes of this Agreement and the Loan Documents.
 - (b) <u>Taxes and Insurance</u>. When due, pay all taxes, assessments, insurance premiums, and other amounts due with respect to the Property.
 - (c) <u>Compliance</u>. Remain in material compliance with all applicable statutes, laws and regulations; maintain, preserve and keep all property and assets (including

but not limited to the Collateral) in good repair, working order and condition; and make all needed replacements, additions, improvements and renewals thereto, to the extent allowed by the Loan Documents.

- (d) Additional Liability. Provide Lender with written notice within thirty (30) days of accepting or obtaining any additional liability (direct or contingent) to any party other than Lender, other than liabilities incurred in the ordinary course ("Additional Liability"). Such notice shall provide the details of the Additional Liability including the name of the involved parties, the nature of the liability, the amount of the liability, the repayment terms, the collateral securing the liability, and any other information requested by Lender.
- (e) Notice of Default and Other Notices.
 - (i) Notice of Default. Furnish to Lender immediately upon becoming aware of the existence of any condition or event that constitutes an Event of Default or any event which, upon the giving of notice or lapse of time or both, may become an Event of Default, written notice specifying the nature and period of existence thereof and the action which Obligors are taking or propose to take with respect thereto.
 - (ii) Other Notices. Promptly notify Lender in writing of (i) any material adverse change in any Obligor's financial condition or business; (ii) any default under any material agreement, contract, or other instrument to which any Obligor is a party or by which any Obligor's properties are bound, or any acceleration of the maturity of any indebtedness owing by Obligor; (iii) any material adverse claim against or affecting Obligor or any part of its properties; (iv) the commencement of, and any material determination in, any litigation with any third party or any proceeding before any governmental agency or unit affecting Obligor; and (v) any change in any Obligor's name or address.
- 9.2 <u>Negative Covenants</u>. In addition to the covenants contained in the Existing Loan Documents, Obligor covenants and agrees that from the date hereof until payment in full of all Obligations unless Lender shall otherwise consent in writing, Obligor will not:
 - (a) <u>Liens and Encumbrances</u>. Permit any encumbrance on title or lien to attach to the Collateral after the Effective Date. Obligor shall be responsible for keeping the Collateral free from any liens arising out of work performed, materials furnished, or obligations incurred by or on behalf of Obligor. If any claim of lien or other lien is filed against the Collateral, then Obligor shall cause such claim or lien to be canceled and discharged of record by bond or otherwise within ten (10) days after the filing thereof. Any advance of funds made by Lender under the Loan Documents after the Effective Date to protect the Property shall constitute an event of default. This paragraph does not apply to the refinancing of any debt owed to Obligor's existing first position lender provided such a refinancing shall not result in an increase in the amount owed to the first position lender.
 - (b) <u>Additional Financing</u>. Request or obtain secondary or junior financing in any form including unsecured or secured loans.
 - (c) <u>Insider Loans</u>. Repay any principal, interest, late charges, or other amounts due under any loans owed by corporate Obligors to their members, shareholders,

- officers, and directors whether the obligations are evidenced by promissory notes or otherwise.
- (d) <u>Insider Transactions</u>. Make loans to, guaranty any debts of, or invest any money with any members, shareholders, officers or directors of corporate Obligors.
- (e) <u>Dividends and Distributions</u>. Pay any dividends or make any other distributions to the members, owners, or shareholders of Obligors.
- 10. Expenses. Obligor shall, upon demand by Lender, pay or reimburse Lender for all costs and expenses incurred by Lender in connection with a future default under the Loan Documents. Notwithstanding any other provisions contained in the Loan Documents, if Lender retains an attorney to enforce, defend, or protect Lender's rights and/or remedies under the Loan Documents, or if Lender retains an attorney in connection with any default of any stated or accelerated maturity of Obligations to collect any debt due Lender, or if Lender retains an attorney in connection with any lawsuits, reorganization, bankruptcy, or other proceeding involving the Loan Documents, then in any such instance Obligors agree to pay Lender in addition to all principal and interest, including periodic payments, late charges, fees, and other amounts payable by Obligors or any of them, all of Lender's reasonable costs and expenses, including reasonable attorneys' fees incurred by Lender.
- 11. Reporting. All reporting requirements contained in the Existing Loan Documents shall apply during the Forbearance Period.

12. <u>Miscellaneous</u>.

- 12.1 <u>Cumulative Rights</u>. No right, power, or remedy conferred upon or reserved to Lender in the Loan Documents is exclusive of any other right, power, or remedy conferred upon the Lender thereunder or at law or in equity. Each remedy shall be cumulative and may be exercised by Lender concurrently or consecutively in its discretion.
- 12.2 <u>No Waiver</u>. Lender may, in its discretion, from time to time waive or forbear from enforcing any provision contained in the Loan Documents, and no such waiver or forbearance shall be deemed a waiver by Lender of any other right or remedy provided herein or by law or be deemed a waiver of the right at any later time to enforce strictly all provisions contained in the Loan Documents and to exercise any and all remedies provided herein and by law.
- 12.3 <u>Headings</u>. The headings of the articles, sections, and subsections of this Agreement are for the convenience of reference only, are not to be considered a part hereof, and shall not limit or otherwise affect any of the terms hereof or thereof.
- 12.4 <u>Admissions</u>. Obligors expressly acknowledge and agree that the waivers, estoppels, and releases contained in this Agreement shall not be construed as an admission of wrongdoing, liability, or culpability on the part of Lender or an admission by Lender of the existence of any claims of any Obligor against Lender.
- 12.5 <u>Construction of Agreement</u>. Each Party acknowledges that it has participated in the preparation and negotiation of this Agreement, and no provision of this Agreement shall be construed against or interpreted to the disadvantage of any Party hereto by any court or other governmental or judicial authority by reason of such Party having or being deemed to have structured, dictated, or drafted such provision. Obligors acknowledge that at all times they have been represented by an attorney in the negotiation of the terms of and in the preparation and signing of this Agreement, or have voluntarily decided not to be represented by an attorney, and have had the opportunity to review and analyze this Agreement for a sufficient period of time prior to the signing and delivery thereof. No representations or

warranties have been made by or on behalf of Lender, or relied upon by any Obligor, pertaining to the subject matter of this Agreement, other than those set forth in this Agreement. This Agreement and the Loan Documents embody the entire agreement and understanding among the Parties to the subject matter hereof and supersede all prior proposals, negotiations, agreements and understanding relating to such subject matter. The words "include," "includes," and "including" are to be interpreted as if they were followed by either the phrase "without limitation" or "but not limited to."

12.6 <u>Notices</u>. Any notice required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed given on the third day following the date deposited in the United States mail, postage prepaid, sent by first class mail and, alternatively, shall be deemed given on the next day following the date such notice is delivered to a nationally recognized overnight delivery service such as Federal Express and addressed as follows:

- 12.8 <u>No Assignment by Obligor</u>. The rights and obligations of the Obligor may not be assigned or transferred to any person or entity without the express written consent of Lender.
- 12.9 <u>No Modifications</u>. The terms of the Loan Documents may only be changed, modified, waived, discharged, or terminated by an instrument or instruments in writing, signed by the Party against whom the enforcement of the change, modification, waiver, discharge or termination is asserted.
- 12.10 <u>Severability</u>. If any provisions of this Agreement shall be held invalid, then such provision only shall be deemed invalid, and the remainder of this Agreement shall remain operative and in full force and effect.

12.11 <u>TIME IS OF THE ESSENCE</u>. TIME IS OF THE ESSENCE WITH RESPECT TO THE PERFORMANCE OF ALL OBLIGATIONS UNDER THIS AGREEMENT.

12.12 <u>Preservation and Limitation of Remedies</u>. Lender and Obligor shall have the right to proceed in any court of proper jurisdiction or by self-help to exercise or prosecute the following remedies, as applicable: (i) all rights to foreclose against any Collateral or other security by exercising a power of sale granted under Loan Documents or under applicable law or by judicial foreclosure and sale,

including a proceeding to confirm the sale; (ii) all rights of self-help including peaceful occupation of real property and collection of rents, set-off, and peaceful possession of personal property; (iii) obtaining provisional or ancillary remedies including injunctive relief, sequestration, garnishment, attachment, appointment of receiver and filing an involuntary bankruptcy proceeding; and (iv) when applicable, a judgment by confession of judgment.

Obligor and Lender agree that no Party shall have a remedy of punitive or exemplary damages against the other in any Dispute and hereby waive any right or claim to punitive or exemplary damages they have now, or which may arise in the future, in connection with any Dispute.

- 12.13 <u>Closing</u>. The Closing (as defined below) of this Agreement must occur on or before November 7, 2017.
- 12.14 Conditions Precedent to Closing. Lender's obligation to close the transaction(s) contemplated by this Agreement shall be subject to the Obligors, as applicable, delivering and/or satisfying each of the following conditions precedent in a form and content satisfactory to Lender ("Closing Conditions"). "Closing" shall occur when Lender declares the Closing Conditions have been satisfied.
 - (a) Delivery of signed duplicate originals of this Agreement; and
 - (b) Performance of all actions required by this Agreement.

Addendum to the Rescue Services Contract dated July 1, 2016 between Vance County and The Vance Life Saving and Rescue Squad, Incorporated.

WHEREAS Vance County (hereinafter County) and The Vance Life Saving and Rescue Squad, Incorporated (hereinafter Rescue Squad) entered into a Rescue Services Contract on July 1, 2016, with a term of extending through June 30, 2021; and,

WHEREAS the parties hereto desire to amend their existing contract to provide for the funding of additional part time positions to serve in a **Fire Protection Services** capacity only.

Now therefore be it resolved that the below additions are hereby added to the above referenced agreement, and that the prior agreement is hereby ratified in full except as may be amended hereinafter.

15) Part Time Positions

- a. The Rescue Squad shall receive reimbursement funding as determined by the County Budget for Paid Part time Positions. The budget will determine the number of positions, maximum pay rate and the total hours per week for the Rescue Squad, and can be amended by the County each budget year. The reimbursement shall be based on the number of hours worked multiplied by the lesser of the rate of pay to the employee or the rate adopted in the County Budget. A total dollar amount will be appropriated for the Rescue Squad, which will include amounts for the Rescue Squad's portion for Federal and State withholding taxes and estimated Workman's Compensation Insurance. It will be the responsibility of the Rescue Squad to make these payments, on time, and in the required amounts. Reimbursement for expenses for hours or days worked outside of these requirements, or at a rate higher than budgeted will not be eligible for reimbursement. An initial amount may be provided to the Rescue Squad to deposit into a separate account/fund for the purpose of paying for the part time Positions. This funding will be conditioned upon the following;
 - i. Part time employee funds will only be spent on paying part time employee wages, federal and state withholding taxes and workman's compensation insurance for hours worked in Fire Protection Services only and not for Rescue Services (as defined and set forth in July 1, 2016 Agreement).
 - ii. Any funds improperly spent or spent in excess of the allotted pay rates and hours, from previous payments of part time employee funds shall be reimbursed by the Rescue Squad in the month following this determination by the County. Any funds remaining at the termination of this agreement shall be returned to Vance County.
 - iii. Monthly submittal to the Fire Marshal of a certified report of the previous month's part time wages and other permissible employment expenses paid, dates and times worked, the names and amounts of the individuals it was paid to, on or before the 10th of each month, and a statement that all individuals paid performed only Fire Protection Services for the times paid as set forth in this amendment.

- iv. Any amount expended by the Rescue Squad not in compliance with this agreement will not be allowed to be credited against the Vance County funds provided for part time employees.
- b. Rescue Squad will be responsible for hiring and retaining their own part-time employees in accordance with the following requirements.
 - i. Develop an application process in order to recruit qualified and dependable part-time employees that meet the minimum standards as established by the VFD Association for the Fire Protection position.
 - ii. Insure all part-time employees achieve a minimum 36 hours of training and are listed on their North Carolina State Firefighters Association roster as required.
 - iii. All employees shall be employed by the Rescue Squad, and will not be treated as, represented to be, or attempted to be classified as Vance County Employees.

This amendment shall become effective after the execution thereof by authorized representatives of both parties, but not before October 1, 2020.

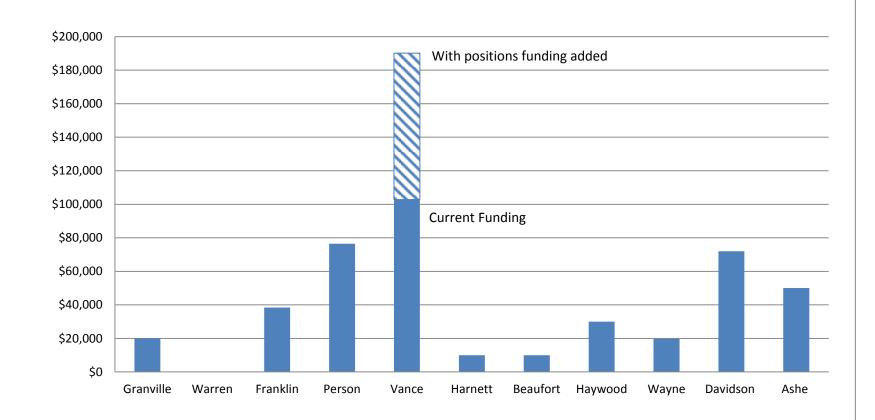

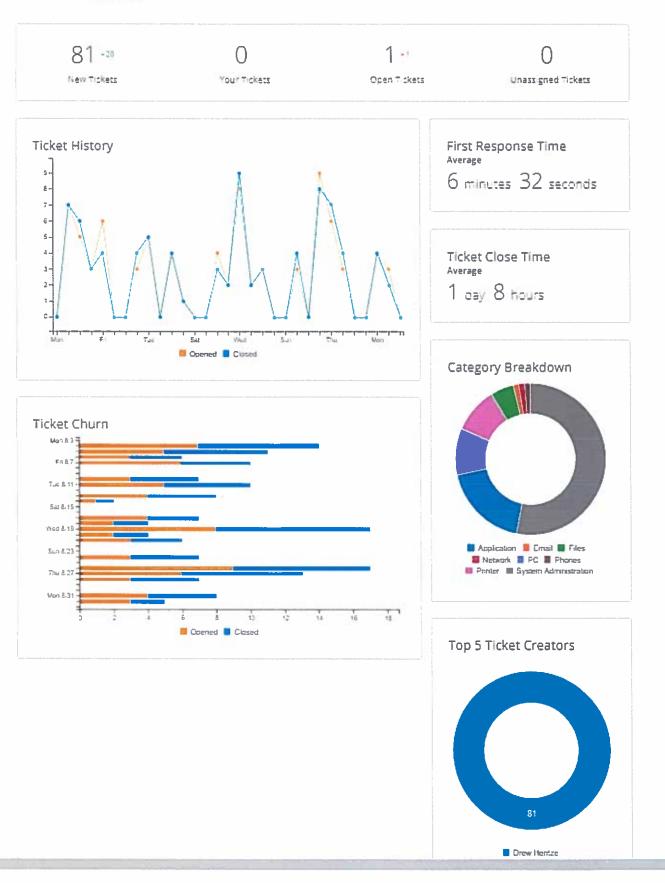

- All Virtual Programs are assisted and/or participated in by all Executive Team Members of the Henderson Vance Recreation and Parks Department.

YOUTH ATHLETICS

- ♣ All games and practice were cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- ♣ Athletic registrations have been postponed due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

RECREATION PROGRAMS

- ♣ Darius Pitt, Recreation and Parks Program Specialist, hosted a Facebook Live "Paint with DP" session on Saturday, August 8, and Tuesday, August 18, 2020. There were 961 views of the two sessions.
- ♣ Darius Pitt, Recreation and Parks Program Specialist, led Facebook Live Body Blast exercise program each Wednesday in August to demonstrate how participants can exercise safely using social distancing. All the Henderson-Vance Recreation full-time staff participated in this program. There were more than 700 views in August.
- ♣ Darius Pitt, Recreation and Parks Program Specialist, has worked with local coaches to put together "Elite Skills & Drills", different videos that youth athletes can watch every Friday on Facebook live. Every week a different skill is introduced that they can practice right at home to safely stay active during the pandemic. Those videos had 168 views in August.

- ♣ Crystal Allen, Recreation Program Supervisor, coordinated Visually Impaired Program (VIP). This program works with visually impaired citizens and volunteers.
