COUNTY OF VANCE

The Vance County Board of Commissioners met in regular session on Monday, September 12, 2011 at 6:00 p.m. in the Commissioners' Conference Room, Vance County Administration Building, 122 Young Street, Henderson, NC. Those Commissioners present were as follows: Chairman Eddie L. Wright, Commissioners Terry E. Garrison, Deborah F. Brown, R. Dan Brummitt, Thomas S. Hester, Jr., J. Timothy Pegram, and Gordon Wilder.

Absent: None.

Also present were County Manager Jerry L. Ayscue, Finance Director Steven C. Stanton, County Attorney Jonathan S. Care, and Clerk to the Board Kelly H. Grissom.

Commissioner Deborah F. Brown gave the invocation.

As advertised, at 6:00 p.m., a public hearing was held to gain citizen input on the proposed Rural Operating Assistance Program (ROAP) application to be submitted to the North Carolina Department of Transportation no later than September 30, 2011 by the County of Vance. Finance Director Steven C. Stanton explained that the programs included in the ROAP application are:

- 1. Elderly & Disabled Transportation Assistance Program (EDTAP) which provides operating assistance for the transportation of elderly and disabled citizens. This transportation assistance allows for the individual to reside for longer periods in their homes, thereby enhancing their quality of life. For the purpose of EDTAP, an elderly person is defined as one who reaches the age of 60 or more years. A disabled person is defined as one who has a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activity, and an individual who is regarded as having such impairment.
- 2. Work First/Employment Program is intended to provide operating assistance for transitional Work First and general public employment transportation needs. These funds are used to support the employment transportation needs of individuals that are not eligible to receive benefits from the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) Program.
- Rural General Public (RGP) funds are intended to provide transportation service to individuals who are not human service agency clients.

The amounts allocated are as follows: EDTAP \$44,052, Supplemental \$20,281; Employment \$17,625, and Rural General Public \$37,770, Supplemental \$21,474; totals to \$141,202 for the period July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012.

As there was no one present who wished to speak on the matter, Chairman Eddie L. Wright declared the public hearing closed.

Motion was made by Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr. to approve the submission of the application for the Rural Operating Assistance Program and authorize the Chairman, the County Manager, and the Finance Director to sign the certified statement. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Gordon Wilder and unanimously approved.

Mr. Ike Bunn, Enterprise Network Services and Mr. Kevin Brown, Vance County IT Director, were next on the agenda to present bid tabulations for the County's wide area network.

Before addressing the bid tabulations, IT Director Kevin Brown stated that during the review of records leading up to the wide area network, \$11,919 has been identified as an annual savings just from cancelled circuits and other services that are no longer used by the County. Also, an additional \$49,800 will be saved annually once the transition is made to a wide area network and new phone system.

Mr. Bunn explained that the County issued an RFP to multiple vendors on August 9, 2011 for Metro Ethernet circuits to create a countywide network to support the planned centralized voice and data services. Following the distribution of the RFP, the County held a mandatory pre-bid conference on August 15, 2011 attended by three vendors - CenturyLink, NCOL, and Time Warner Cable. A response was received from each of the three vendors.

The responses were received as follows and were examined for how the requirements were addressed as well as the technical content of the responses. CenturyLink and Time Warner Cable offered Metro Ethernet technology as specified in the RFP, while NCOL proposed DSL and T1 technologies.

Based upon the RFP responses, Mr. Bunn and Mr. Brown stated that the County would be justified in awarding the bid to Time Warner Cable for having the most responsive, lowest priced proposal, meeting specifications, and specifically for the following reasons: Providing a professional and well organized response; Proposing the technology sought; Offering the scalability sought; Offering the reliability sought; and Offering the most future proof solution.

Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr. stated that the lowest bid presented was from NCOL. He noted that NCOL is a local company and asked if they could not offer the DSL and the T1. Mr. Bunn responded that the Commissioners had charged him with finding the most robust solutions in several areas. For the data network and the telephone system network to perform at the level that the Commissioners charged him with, Metro Ethernet is the needed technology, and one that all companies are moving to. DSL is more of a consumer product whereas T1 is an older technology. Metro Ethernet runs on fiber which is faster and more expandable. Furthermore, the RFP requested certain band widths for County sites as well as a burst capability. Time Warner Cable and CenturyLink offered these, while NCOL does not allow the County to burst or expand.

Commissioner Dan Brummitt questioned if the proposals have adequate performance contracts within them and he was told that they do.

After further discussion, motion was made by Commissioner Dan Brummitt to award the bid for Wide Area Network services to Time Warner Cable. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Terry E. Garrison and unanimously approved.

As advertised, at 6:15 p.m., a public hearing was held to gain citizen input on the proposed NC Department of Transportation Secondary Road Construction Program.

Mr. Steve Winstead, DOT District Engineer, along with DOT representatives, presented the following Proposed Secondary Road Program for Vance County for FY 2011-2012:

Mr. Mack Bobbitt spoke and stated that Flemingtown Road was recently widened, but was not widened continuously, only in certain areas. There are areas of the road where the widened portion abruptly stops. This road is heavily traveled by boaters, and the condition of the road has caused boat trailers to drop off and break axles.

As there was no one else who wished to speak on the matter, Chairman Eddie L. Wright declared the public hearing closed.

After a brief discussion, motion was made by Commissioner Gordon Wilder to approve the 2011-2012 Secondary Road Program as presented. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Deborah F. Brown and unanimously approved.

As advertised, at 6:30 p.m., a public hearing was held to gain citizen input on the proposed zoning ordinance and map.

Planning Director Jordan McMillen began and stated that as directed by the Board, he and his staff have undertaken the update of the land development (zoning) ordinance. He stated that the draft ordinance and map are complete. A budget and proposed fee schedule have also been developed. Several public meetings have been held, informational sessions have been conducted, several community group presentations have taken place, as well as the involvement of a Citizen Advisory Committee. The Vance County Planning Board has unanimously recommended the adoption of the proposed ordinance.

Mr. McMillen stated that zoning is a land use tool as well as a regulation. The central idea of zoning is to separate uses which are incompatible or harmful to each other. Zoning creates a

process where projects are reviewed and the public is given an opportunity to participate. Zoning requires that surrounding property owners be made aware of any development taking place. It creates a public forum and allows local decisions to be made. All existing uses are grand-fathered, meaning they are allowed to continue as they are.

The following people spoke in favor of the proposed zoning ordinance: David Bowen, Robert Tatum, Richard Brand, John Price, James Kearney, Bill Edwards, Talmadge Burgess, Rick Palamar, Mitch Wyatt, and Sam Watkins.

The following people spoke in opposition to the proposed zoning ordinance: Michael Bobbitt, Ruth Jones, Mack Bobbitt, Deryl Von Williams, Tim McAllister, and Margaret Jeffers.

As there was no one else who wished to speak on the matter, Chairman Wright declared the public hearing closed. Chairman Wright thanked everyone that came out to share their thoughts and opinions on the proposed ordinance.

Mr. Timmy Baynes, Council of Governments, was next on the agenda and presented an update on the Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP). He reminded everyone that the NSP is a program that is designed to assist communities with high concentrations of foreclosed, abandoned, and/or blighted structures. Vance County was one of 23 counties in the state that was deemed eligible for this funding, and as a result of the application, was awarded a grant in the amount of just under \$2 million. Through that grant, the County acquired 18 properties that were mostly tax foreclosures and/or abandoned properties. There are currently eight homes available for sale to the public. Mr. Baynes provided information on each of the eight houses. Marketing tasks include brochures, homebuyers education seminars, and open houses. Open houses will be scheduled in the near future.

Eligibility requirements include: Participants must live in the home; Buyers' income may not exceed 120% of the median income; Down payment assistance is based on household income; Buyers must attend an eight hour home-buyer education class.

Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr. asked if the Board of Commissioners would be deciding whose offer is accepted (in a case of multiple offers). Mr. Baynes responded that offers must be brought before the Board of Commissioners because it is held as real estate by a local government. County Attorney Jonathan S. Care stated that the most qualified offer under this grant program should be considered rather than the price of the offer.

After a brief question and answer segment, the Board thanked Mr. Baynes for his report.

Motion was made by Commissioner Dan Brummitt, seconded by Commissioner Gordon Wilder, vote unanimous, to declare the above mentioned items as surplus and allow the Finance Director to sell said items and/or dispose of the items as necessary.

County Attorney's Report

Foreclosed Property Matter. County Attorney Jonathan S. Care stated that the property located at 1262 Walter Street is a tax foreclosure property that is jointly owned by the County and the City of Henderson. Currently, there is a squatter living in the home and refuses to leave. The squatter claims to have a lease. The best plan of action is to take this matter before the District Courts and ask them to have the person removed. Attorney Care asked for authorization to move forward with a trespassing charge against the squatter.

Motion was made by Commissioner Dan Brummitt to allow the County Attorney to move forward with trespassing charges against the squatter at 1262 Walters Street. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Deborah F. Brown and unanimously approved.

Enforcement of Junkyard Ordinance. Attorney Care stated that a piece of property located at 2575 North Lynnbank Road is being used as a junkyard. The property owner, Mr. Ed Bowen, has been asked to clean up his property numerous times but has not complied. He has also not registered his property as a junkyard. Attorney Care stated that he must comply with the County's Junkyard Ordinance or, if he fails to do that, the County may obtain a court order to have him clean up his property.

Commissioner Dan Brummitt stated that this has been an ongoing problem for over a year.

Motion was made by Commissioner Dan Brummitt to authorize the County Attorney to seek enforcement of the Junkyard Ordinance on the property located at 2575 North Lynnbank Road. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr. and unanimously approved.

Commissioner Deborah F. Brown asked if the County Attorney could provide a monthly report showing the number of legal cases the County has, broken down by department. Attorney Care stated that he could do this, but noted that his concern would be putting this information on public record. Not all items would qualify for an executive session matter, but yet it is not something that you want the other side's legal representative to have access to.

The Board asked the County Attorney and the County Manager to look into this and provide a way to keep the Board informed without jeopardizing any cases.

County Manager's Report

Library Card Sign-up Month Proclamation. Mr. Ayscue stated that in order to promote usage of its resources by school students, the H. Leslie Perry Memorial Library has requested that the Board of Commissioners designate September as Library Card Sign-up Month in Vance County.

Motion was made by Commissioner Gordon Wilder, seconded by Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr., vote unanimous, to approve the following proclamation for the month of September, 2011 to be Library Card Sign-up Month in Vance County:

Hicksboro VFD Resolution. Mr. Ayscue stated that the Hicksboro VFD wishes to consolidate some of its current and future debt through BB&T and obtain a more advantageous interest rate. The bank requires that the County approve a resolution that indicates it is aware of the financing transaction. There is no financial obligation on behalf of the County. He recommended that the Board adopt the proposed resolution on behalf of Hicksboro VFD to consolidate its financing of assets, unless the Board wishes to delay the matter until October.

The Board discussed this request and motion was made by Commissioner Deborah F. Brown, seconded by Commissioner Terry E. Garrison, vote unanimous, to table the matter until the October meeting, when Fire Chief Henrich is to present procedures and guidelines for volunteer fire departments.

Pending Business

County Water Project. Phase 1A. Mr. Ayscue stated that the County's engineer has redesigned the initial part of 1A according to sign-ups. Sign-ups continue to be received. A site for an overhead water tank has been located and a formal agreement is being processed (per previous Water Board action). The formal water agreement between the County and City was approved by both entities on March 14, 2011. USDA Rural Development has reviewed the agreement and responded with comments. A response has been submitted to USDA. USDA RD has informed the engineer that the County can go to the bidding phase and ultimately to construction. The Phase 1A only agreement is for up to 150,000 gallons of water per day and does not include any provisions for operations and maintenance. The staff and engineer are currently reviewing those requirements and developing a water system management plan. An RFP for operations and maintenance services has been developed and is in the process of being distributed. Local permits have been obtained. Permits are currently being reviewed by NC DENR and highway right of way encroachment agreements are currently being reviewed by NC DOT. It is expected that these should be complete in the next 30 to 45 days. *Phase 1B*. The Kittrell Water Association and USDA continue to work together to seek funding for Phase 1B, consistent with action taken by the Commissioners in December 2009. *Phases 2A & 2B*. Funding from USDA Rural Development has been established for both of these phases. Phase 2A will be funded with \$2.2 million in loans and \$1.62 million in grants. Phase 2B has \$3.94 million in loans and \$1.99 million in grants. Highway right of way encroachment agreements with the NC Department of Transportation have been prepared for execution. Sign-ups continue to be received for the two phases. Per previous action taken by the Water Board, the engineering firm, Dewberry & Davis, carried out additional door-to-door sign-ups during the end of June. The majority of their work took place in the Thomas Road area and in other areas designated by Hobbs & Upchurch. Initial indications from that work show that additional signups are essential in order to have enough customer base to redesign the project. Due to the nature of the funding of Phases 2A & 2B, it will be important that work on these phases begin as soon as possible after Phase 1A work is underway.

Commissioner Dan Brummitt stated that he has repeatedly asked for information from the engineer on the progress of the project. He has also asked to be in the email and communication loop. Commissioner Brummitt asked for copies of any emails between staff and the engineer in regards to the project.

Land Use Planning. As directed by the Board in its February meeting, work has taken place and continues on the update of the Land Development Ordinance (Zoning Ordinance). Recent updates have involved the inclusion of the Junkyard and Shooting Range Ordinances into the existing DRAFT document and have also included provisions that address electronic/sweepstakes gaming. Revised permit applications are being developed to better explain the application process and guide applicants through the process. Work has been completed by the staff on the development of a proposed fee schedule that would accompany the document if approved. Funds are included in the FY 2011-12 Budget. The proposed zoning map update has been completed by staff as well. Atlas Geographic Data, Inc. is currently updating tax mapping parcels and has been able to provide previewed data that has allowed for the early completion of the proposed zoning map. As requested by the board, a report was made to the Planning and Environmental Committee by the Planning and Development staff and a report was made to the full Board on August 1, 2011. The Planning Board has also considered and recommended the ordinance as is required by law. The proposed zoning ordinance and zoning map is posted on the County's website.

Commissioner Deborah F. Brown asked what the next step should be in regards to the proposed zoning ordinance. The Board decided to hold a work session and scheduled it for Monday, September 26, 2011 at 3:00 p.m. in the Commissioners' Meeting Room.
