COUNTY OF VANCE

The Vance County Board of Commissioners met in regular session on Monday, August 4, 2014 at 6:00 p.m. in the Commissioners' Conference Room, Vance County Administration Building, 122 Young Street, Henderson, NC. Those Commissioners present were as follows: Chairperson Deborah F. Brown, Commissioners Archie B. Taylor, Jr., Dan Brummitt, Terry E. Garrison, Thomas S. Hester, Jr., Gordon Wilder, and Eddie L. Wright.

Absent: None.

Also present were County Manager Jerry L. Ayscue, Finance Director David C. Beck, County Attorney Jonathan S. Care, and Clerk to the Board Kelly H. Grissom.

Rev. Joseph Ratliff, Shiloh Baptist Church, gave the invocation.

Mr. Will Brooks, Council of Governments, was first on the agenda and presented the Henderson-Vance Recreation Parks Department Comprehensive Plan Update. He explained that this is the first Plan update since 1955 and was basically started from scratch. The planning process began in October 2013 identifying the needs of the department and forming a citizen survey for additional input. Community meetings were also held in February. The responses from the survey, in combination with the public meetings, identified three overall broad strategies: economics, programming, and environmental sustainability. Also compiled was a list of activities that the department should consider implementing over time. Some responses from the survey indicated a need for more activity-based programs, more trails and outdoor open spaces, an animal park, and permanent restroom facilities.

Commissioner Terry E. Garrison asked if the Plan addresses a need for youth programs. Mr. Brooks responded, yes. Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr. stated that it would be nice if the County could obtain the State land that is adjacent to the new animal shelter site in order for it to be used as an animal park. Commissioner Archie B. Taylor, Jr. suggested that the focus be on programs and activities that have been declining. Commissioner Dan Brummitt stated that grant resources need to be sought in order to accommodate the needs indicated in the Plan. Mr. Brooks responded that one of the original purposes of having an updated strategic plan is to be able to leverage more grant funding. Chairperson Deborah F. Brown asked that the date on the first page be corrected, that the number of youth program participants on page 11 be double checked (she stated that 1,022 seems low), and that the Plan be submitted to the Tourism

Development Authority. She also called it to the Board's attention that on page 29 of the Plan, the County is expected to develop a revenue plan in connection with the Comprehensive Recreation Plan. The Board thanked Mr. Brooks for his presentation.

Motion was made by Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr. to approve the Comprehensive Recreation Plan with the corrections noted. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Dan Brummitt and unanimously approved.

Dr. Stelfanie Williams, VGCC President, appeared before the Board and presented an activities update for the community college. The update included information on 2013-2014 selected highlights which included enrollment data, graduates, funding, the five-year strategic plan, significant challenges, and the economic impact study.

After a brief question and answer session, the Board thanked Dr. Williams for her report and commended her for her hard work.

Mr. Turner Pride, Vance County Extension Services, appeared before the Board and introduced Miss Raven Dunston as Vance County's 4-H representative for the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners' Annual Conference later this month in Asheville. Miss Dunston is a rising Sophomore at Southern Vance High School. She thanked the Board for this opportunity and stated that she is looking forward to representing Vance County at the conference.

Public comments were heard next. Mr. Michael Bobbitt noted that according to the agenda, the County Manager will ask the Board later tonight to determine if there are legislative goals that they wish to be presented in the upcoming sessions of the North Carolina General Assembly. He suggested that the Board solicit input from the voters of Vance County on this matter.

Water District Board

Chairperson Deborah F. Brown called the Water District Board to order.

Water Planning Committee Report. This committee met on July 31, 2014 and completed a review of the monthly construction and operations reports, considered three refund/appeal requests, reviewed the established base fee as requested by Chairperson Brown and reviewed/discussed a report provided by the engineer on the Rock Mill Road directional bore.

Monthly Construction and Operations Reports (Phase 1A & 2A/2B). As requested by the full board, the committee reviewed and fully discussed the reports with the engineers and

Envirolink. The committee discussed the ongoing work on Aycock Road and highlighted areas of concern for the engineer. The committee in reviewing the operations report, made a request that the customer payment policies be provided on the county website.

Chairperson Brown questioned why water lines were being installed on Kelly Road, between Stagecoach Road and Glebe Road, when there are only six sign-ups along that road? Mr. McMillen explained that the guiding principal is 12 sign-ups per mile. In this case, it is necessary to run the lines down this section of road in order to reach other areas where sign-ups are sufficient. She also asked about the status of the rock on Hicksboro Road. Mr. Tim Carpenter, LKC Engineering, responded that the contractor is working on a plan that was approved by DOT to dig a retrieval pit to retrieve the reamer head in that area. A Schedule to Complete is expected by tomorrow.

Refund/Appeal Requests. Mr. Jordan McMillen, Deputy County Manager, stated that the committee reviewed two requests for releases from wet tap water agreements (Mr. Jackson Wesley and Mr. Clinton Roberson) and one request for a bill adjustment (Ms. Florence Hicks). The Board was provided the appeal summaries. The committee also determined that the current process of reviewing appeals by the committee and approval by the full board was adequate for the time being.

Jackson Wesley Appeal: Mr. Wesley requested release from his agreement with the Vance County Water District due to an extended illness. The committee recommended that the request be denied. While very sympathetic to his situation, the committee felt that Mr. Wesley's request would open up additional similar requests for funds that are owed to the water district and would put the board in a difficult situation of reviewing financial and medical records. It was determined that Envirolink would work with the individual property owner on payment arrangements within the limitations of the current policy.

Motion was made by Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr. to deny the request by Mr. Wesley to be released from his water agreement. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Dan Brummitt and vote was ayes - six (6), noes - one (1), with the dissenting vote being cast by Chairperson Deborah F. Brown.

Commissioner Terry E. Garrison questioned Chairperson Brown as to why she cast a negative vote. She responded that she feels that the Board has made mistakes with the water project and needs to get back on track. If a citizen wishes to opt out of the water system, they

should be allowed to do that. She distributed the initial user agreement form that she signed in 2010 when the County was promoting sign-ups. The agreement states the monthly base fee would be approximately \$20.00. Since that time, the Board voted to approve a base fee of \$30.00. She expressed her displeasure with this and stated that the initial agreement was misleading. Commissioner Terry E. Garrison asked how many residents signed the initial agreement. Mr. McMillen responded over 90%. Commissioner Garrison expressed his displeasure with this matter and stated that the County's integrity is at stake. This matter needs to be resolved and the County should honor the agreements as they were signed. Chairperson Brown echoed these remarks. Mr. McMillen noted that if the base rate were to be changed from \$20.00 to \$30.00, it would have an adverse impact of about \$117,000 per year. Chairperson Brown asked for a comprehensive background of what the Water Board has approved up to this point.

Clinton Roberson Appeal: Mr. Roberson requested to be released from his agreement with the Vance County Water District due to relocating three years ago, and the property is in the foreclosure process. The request by Mr. Roberson was recommended for denial. It was determined that no additional base bills would be sent to Mr. Roberson as long as the property remains in bankruptcy, however releasing the agreement would have the negative impact of releasing the property from any future obligations.

Motion was made by Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr. to accept the recommendation from the Committee to deny Mr. Roberson's appeal. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Gordon Wilder and vote was ayes - six (6); noes - one (1), with the dissenting vote being cast by Chairperson Deborah F. Brown.

Florence Hicks Appeal: Ms. Hicks had a water leak and requested that her bill be adjusted. The committee tabled the request and directed staff to develop a leak policy that would be reviewed by the committee and then by the full board at next month's meeting.

Review of the established base fee. This matter was discussed earlier during the meeting. The written report is as follows: This item was previously reviewed by the committee in April 2014. After careful deliberation and a discussion of the fairness between lowering the base rate and shifting the burden of the reduction to all property owners in the county, the committee decided that the base fee should remain at \$30 per month. If the monthly base fee is reduced to \$20 for everyone, it would have an adverse impact of about \$117,000 per year. The board also

discussed its desire to have the attorney and staff draft a letter of explanation regarding the base fee with the intention to inform and to gain additional customers for the water system.

Rock Mill Road Bore Report. The committee reviewed a report and analysis by the engineer comparing the Rock Mill Road bore to the other bores completed in Phase 1A. The engineer explained that the price paid for the Rock Mill Road directional bore was well within what could have been reasonably anticipated and expected regardless of whether the line was installed as designed or as it was actually installed. The committee discussed continuing future liabilities due to the shift in location of the line and determined it best for staff and the attorney to discuss with the contractor in order to correct the bore location or to have a bond provided to protect the county's future liability interests.

At this time, Chairperson Brown adjourned the Water District Board.

Commissioner Terry E. Garrison suggested that the Water Planning Committee meet again to discuss the water base rate.

Committee Reports and Recommendations

Motion was made by Commissioner Gordon Wilder, seconded by Commissioner Dan Brummitt, vote unanimous, to approve the position requests as presented.

County Line Project Committee. Mr. Ayscue reported that this committee met on Tuesday, July 22 with representatives from Granville County to discuss our mutual county boundary. Granville officials acknowledged that they have similar issues with other immediately adjacent counties. They indicated that they were going to initiate a process similar to the one that Vance and Granville are using with Franklin County. The most pressing issue to be addressed is that of voter registration lines along the border, which must be resolved by the two

county boards of elections prior to the November general election. (Kevin Kilgore, Chairman of the Vance County Board of Elections and Faye Gill, Elections Director, have indicated that they intend to use the same voter registration lines that are currently in place for the November election.) This committee will meet again in the near future to further address the issue of resolution of the location(s) of the county lines.

County Attorney's Report

REO Property - 777 Parkway Drive. County Attorney Jonathan S. Care noted that during a previous meeting, the Board of Commissioners approved the public sale process for a tax foreclosure property – 777 Parkway Drive, Henderson, NC. The property was advertised for upset bids and none were received. The Board is now free to sell the property or reject the offer. This should be done by resolution.

Motion was made by Commissioner Thomas S. Hester, Jr. to approve the following resolution accepting the bid for the property at 777 Parkway Drive, Henderson, NC. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Eddie L. Wright and unanimously approved.

WHEREAS, the Vance County Board of County Commissioners received an offer for the purchase and sale of County owned real property, which is more particularly described below:

WHEREAS, pursuant to NCGS 160A-269, a notice was published in the *Daily Dispatch* on July 10, 2014, stating that said offer had been received and that any person wishing to submit an upset bid should do so within 10 days; and

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**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING UPSET BID PROCESS
FOR SALE OF REAL PROPERTY
306 Main Street, Henderson, NC 27536**

WHEREAS, Vance County owns certain real property with an address of **306 Main Street, Henderson, North Carolina**, and more particularly described by the Vance County Tax Department as Parcel Number **0061-05019**; and,

WHEREAS, North Carolina General Statute §160A-269 permits the county to sell real property by upset bid, after receipt of an offer for the property; and,

WHEREAS, the County has received an offer to purchase the real property described herein above in the amount of **\$750.00** subject to the terms and conditions as included in the submitted offer to purchase bid, submitted by **Roger M. Silva**; and,

WHEREAS, **Roger M. Silva** has paid the required deposit in the amount of **\$750.00** with his offer.

THEREFORE, THE VANCE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS RESOLVES THAT:

1. The Board of County Commissioners declares the real property described above surplus and authorizes its sale through the upset bid procedure of North Carolina General Statute §160A-269, after the City of Henderson agrees to convey their interest as well.
2. A notice of the proposed sale shall be published which shall describe the property and the amount of the offer and shall require any upset offer be subject to the same terms and conditions as contained therein except for the purchase price.
3. Any person may submit an upset bid to the Clerk to the Board of County Commissioners within 10 days after the notice of sale is published. Once a qualifying higher bid has been received, that bid will become the new offer.
4. If a qualifying upset bid is received, a new notice of upset bid shall be published, and shall continue to do so until a 10-day period has passed without any qualifying upset bid having been received. At that time, the amount of the final high bid shall be reported to the Board of County Commissioners.

5. A qualifying higher bid is one that raises the existing offer by the greater of \$750 or ten percent (10%) of the first \$1,000.00 of that offer and five percent (5%) of the remainder of the offer and is subject to the same terms and conditions of the previous bid.

6. A qualifying higher bid must also be accompanied by a deposit in the amount of the greater of \$750 or five percent (5%) of the bid, which may be made by cash, cashier’s check or certified funds. The County will return the deposit of any bid not accepted and will return the bid of an offer subject to upset if a qualifying higher bid is received.

7. The terms of the final sale are that the Board of County Commissioners must approve the final high offer before the sale is closed and the buyer must pay with certified funds or wire transfer the bid amount and any other amounts as required pursuant to the terms and conditions of the bid at the time of closing, which shall be no later than 30 days following the approval by this Board of the final bid. The real property is sold in its current condition, as is, and the County gives no warranty with respect to the usability of the real property or title. Title will be delivered at closing by **a Non Warranty Deed**, subject to exceptions for ad valorem taxes, assessments, zoning regulations, restrictive covenants, street easements, rights of others in possession and any other encumbrances of record. Buyer shall pay for preparation and recording of the Deed and revenue stamps.

8. The County reserves the right to withdraw the property from sale at any time before the final high bid is accepted **and the right to reject all bids at any time.**

9. If no qualifying upset bid is received, the Board of County Commissioners will accept or reject the bid submitted within 60 days after the close of the 10-day upset period.

County Manager's Report

NCACC Legislative Goals Process. Mr. Ayscue stated that the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners is beginning its legislative goals development process for the upcoming sessions of the North Carolina General Assembly and has set a deadline of September 19 for legislative goals to be submitted from the counties. The Board was provided with information that outlines the process. If the Board of Commissioners wishes to identify legislative goals to send to NCACC, there is adequate time to do so. Mr. Ayscue recommended that the Board determine if there are goals and direct the appropriate committee and/or staff to prepare them for the September Board meeting.

The Board discussed the comments that were made earlier in the meeting by Mr. Michael Bobbitt and motion was made by Commissioner Dan Brummitt to authorize the County Manager to advertise for public input on this matter with a deadline of August 25, 2014. Comments will be reviewed by the General Government Committee and any additional public comments will be heard at the September meeting. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Eddie L. Wright and unanimously approved.

September Meeting Date Change. The Board of Commissioners' next regular meeting date is September 1st, which is Labor Day. The Board needs to determine whether it prefers to meet the following day, September 2, or the next Monday, September 8. If the meeting is not held on the date following the holiday (Sept. 1), a resolution is necessary to reset the date.
