COUNTY OF VANCE

The Vance County Board of Commissioners met in regular session on Tuesday, January 30, 2018 at 8:45 p.m. in the Commissioners' Conference Room, Vance County Administration Building, 122 Young Street, Henderson, NC. Those Commissioners present were as follows: Chairman Thomas S. Hester, Jr., Vice-Chairman Archie B. Taylor, Jr., Commissioners Dan Brummitt, Carolyn Faines, Yolanda J. Feimster, Leo Kelly, Jr., and Gordon Wilder.

Absent: None.

Also present were County Manager Jordan McMillen, Finance Director David C. Beck, and Clerk to the Board Kelly H. Grissom.

The purpose of the special meeting was to approve a resolution in support of keeping Vance County in Judicial District 9.

County Manager Jordan McMillen explained that the NC General Assembly is currently working on redistricting judicial districts throughout the state, and they are proposing to move Vance County from Judicial District 9 to Judicial District 8. Mr. McMillen read the following resolution aloud:



**RESOLUTION**  
by the  
**Vance County Board of Commissioners**  
*In Support of Keeping Vance County in Judicial District 9*

**WHEREAS**, the North Carolina General Assembly is currently working on redistricting judicial districts for the State of North Carolina; and

**WHEREAS**, one of the options currently being considered is to move Vance County from Judicial District 9 into Judicial District 8 with Warren, Halifax, Northampton, Hertford and Bertie Counties; and

**WHEREAS**, Vance County has a long history of being closely tied with Granville and Franklin Counties and is commonly referred to the Tri-County area; and

**WHEREAS**, a joint water authority operated by the Cities of Oxford, Henderson and Warren County provides the public water supply for Granville, Vance and Warren Counties, and a significant portion of Franklin County; and

**WHEREAS**, Vance Granville Community College provides the residents of Franklin, Vance, Granville and Warren Counties with excellent educational programs, and is funded by each of the county governments; and

**WHEREAS**, Granville and Vance Counties have a combined Health Department for our two counties, currently share one person for our Solid Waste Department, and are currently discussing further joint endeavors. Also, the law enforcement officers between all of our counties have years of mutual, joint operations, and continue to benefit from these operations; and



As there was no further business, at 9:15 a.m., motion was made by Commissioner Gordon Wilder, seconded by Commissioner Dan Brummitt, vote unanimous, that the meeting be adjourned.
