The County was awarded \$761,040 in US Department of Commerce Economic Development Administration grant funds along with \$190,260 in matching funds for the Henderson-Vance Industrial Park in March 2022. The funds are to complete 2,800 linear feet of roadway and 2,450 linear feet of sewer force main for Phase III of the Industrial Park and are tied to job and investment commitments from Carolina Country Snacks and Versatrim. The Kerr-Tar COG is providing the grant administration, LKC Engineering is the county's contracted engineer and both the City of Henderson and NCDOT are named as co-applicants with the county. *For Your Information*.


Water Board Planning Committee

Phase 1B Bid Update. The Committee (Brummitt, Feimster, Hester/absent) met to review the bids for the Phase 1B expansion and water tank rehabilitation. Contract 1, which includes the water system expansion, had one bid at \$8,785,559 from H.G. Reynolds Company. Contract 2 received four bids, with the low bidder being Pittsburg Tank & Tower Group at \$483,235. The total of the two contracts is \$10,178,090. This amount is \$3,679,890 over the approved funding, roughly 42%. LKC Engineering has had conversations with USDA to split the project and move forward with Contract 2 as additional funding opportunities and scaling are explored for Contract 1. Recommendation: Approve a formal request to USDA to split the project and approve letting Contract 2 to Pittsburg Tank & Tower Group for \$483,235 while directing staff to continue to work with LKC Engineering and federal and state legislative delegations to research additional funding opportunities for Contract 1.





Committee Reports and Recommendations

Vance County Committee Reports and Recommendations May 1, 2023

Public Safety Committee

EMS Land Purchase. The committee (Alston, Brummitt, and Faines); Kelly attending, met on Monday April, 10 and received an update from the county attorney on the proposed amendments to the restrictive covenants on the land being considered for purchase for the central EMS station. The attorney indicated progress was being made, although slowly to amend restrictions that could impact the county's use of the property. The committee indicated they would discuss the property further in closed session.

Northern EMS Substation. Committee members noted an EMS reorganization plan called for an EMS substation in the northern part of the county. EMS Director Javier Plummer noted that repositioning a current EMS vehicle to the north could increase response time in the central portion of the county where 50% of the calls originate. Commissioner Brummitt stated the future need for a fifth EMS vehicle, a new logistics model, and asked for committee support prioritizing the purchase of land for the construction of a northern EMS substation. **Recommendation:** Direct staff to begin seeking property for purchase for a northern Vance County EMS substation.

Fire Service Districts Realignment and Reorganization. The committee discussed realignment of current fire service districts. Committee members discussed the possibility of increasing the size of the Bearpond Service District to take in the southern and southeastern portions of the current Golden Belt district and discussed the possibility for the Cokesbury district to take in the eastern portion of the current Golden Belt district; subject to the agreement of the Bearpond and Cokesbury Boards of Directors. The committee also discussed a possible reorganization of the Vance County Fire Department and recommended these two items be discussed with the Vance County Fire and Rescue Association. Staff voiced Human Resources, liability, and legal issues related to the reorganization specifically if it locates county employees within independent non-profit fire stations and requires the county employees to report and be subject to the management of non-county employees. Recommendation: Direct the Public Safety Committee to proceed with an investigation and development of a plan of the realignment of fire service districts and reorganization of the Vance County Fire Department through discussions with the Vance County Fire and Rescue Association.

Closed Session – Property Matter. The committee met in closed session under N.C.G.S. 143-318.11(a)(5) related to a property matter and further discussion will take place with the full board in closed session.

Planning/Environmental Committee

White Goods Collection Contract Renewal. The committee (Brummitt, Feimster, and Taylor) met to review the contract renewal for white goods (washers/dryers, appliances, etc.) collections at Vance County convenience sites. The current contractor, Mike's Auto Salvage, picks up from the county's four sites, twice weekly. The contractor asked for an increase of roughly \$11,000 annually for continued service to all four sites. Staff informed the committee the cost could be reduced if collections were limited to a single site. The committee voiced concerns over illegal dumping and limited disposal options for county residents. Recommendation: Approve contract renewal with Mike's Auto Salvage for \$43,160, for two pickups weekly at the county's four convenience sites.

AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into this the 1st day of May, 2023 (the "Effective Date"), by and between **VANCE COUNTY**, a body politic and corporate of the State of North Carolina (hereinafter referred to as the "County") and **MIKE FLYNN doing business as MIKE'S AUTO SALVAGE**, (hereinafter referred to as the "Contractor") and provides as follows:

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the County has chosen the lowest, responsible Bidder/Contractor as capable of performing the scrap white good removal(s) at the following properties:

- (1) Vance County Hwy. 39 Site 3453 NC 39 Hwy. N, Henderson, NC 27537
- (2) Vance County Warrenton Rd. Site 803 Warrenton Road Site Henderson, NC 27537
- (3) Vance County Aycock Site 2689 Vicksboro Road Henderson, NC 27537
- (4) Vance County Brodie Rd. Site 900 Brodie Road Henderson, NC 27536

WHEREAS, the parties wish to enter into a written agreement honoring the terms of the agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the sum set forth herein below, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. The Services: The County herby retains contractor to provide, and Contractor hereby agrees to render the proposed scope of work described in the "Removal of Vance County Owned, Scrap White Goods" (hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Services"), and as shown in the attached "Exhibit A". The Services will be performed at the project locations as discussed above and as set forth hereinabove. Contractor shall bill County monthly. This agreement shall take priority over and control in any discrepancy between the Contractor's Proposal and/or prior written communications.
- 2. Fees: The County shall pay the Contractor the quoted sum of \$830.00/week for services (ex. \$830.00 X 52 weeks = \$44,200 in annual fees which results in 416 service trips. The county will be paid weekly for the processed tonnage received at the hereinabove service locations. Vance County will pay for the removal and collection of all Freon containing units collected at the above service locations.
- 3. <u>Payment Terms</u>: The County shall pay the Contractor within 30 calendar days of receiving Contractor's invoice following completion of the Scope of work described hereinafter.

Contractor shall submit all invoices by mail to ATTN: Jason Falls, 156 Church Street, Suite 003, Henderson, NC 27536.

- 4. <u>Standard of Care</u>: Contractor shall complete the Services in a good and workmanlike manner in accordance with generally accepted industry standards.
- 5. Scope: The work covered by the agreement consists of Contractor furnishing all labor, equipment, insurance and materials to remove from the premises all white good appliances from the locations listed on page 1 of this agreement. Contractor should service said locations on every Monday and Thursday of each week during the term of this contract. All materials shall be recycled/disposed of in accordance with applicable state and federal law. At time of service, each site shall be cleared of all white goods. The Contractor shall leave the site clean and free of all debris. All loads will be weighed and pictures taken as the loads are processed. Freon containing units should be stored at Mike's Auto Salvage Yard, upright, and stored in a manner for easy serviceability by third party, Freon removal vendor. Vendor typically services once there are 70 units available.
- 6. <u>Safety Requirements</u>: The Contractor shall secure the area as is needed to protect themselves, others from harm, including but not limited to the use of cones, signs, barricades and personnel from beginning to completion.
- 7. <u>Insurance</u>: Before commencing work, Contractor shall obtain at his own expense, and agrees to keep in effect during the life of this contract as a minimum requirement, the following insurance:
 - a. Commercial General Liability (CGL) Insurance in an amount not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$2,000,000 general aggregate for bodily injury or property damage arising from premises, operations, independent contractors, products-completed operations, personal and advertising injury and liability assumed under an insured contract (including the tort liability of another assumed in a business contract); the County of Vance, its officers, officials, and employees shall be named as additional insured by ISO endorsement CG 20 10 or CG 2033 and CG 20 37. There shall be no modification of the CGL limiting the scope of coverage for liability arising from explosion, collapse, underground property damage or damage to the named insured's when those exposures exist.
 - b. Workers Compensation Insurance as required by the General Statutes of the State of North Carolina and Employer's Liability Insurance not less than \$1,000,000 each accident for bodily by accident, \$1,000,000 each employee for bodily injury by disease, and \$1,000,000 policy limit.
 - c. Commercial Automobile Insurance applicable to bodily injury and property damage, covering all owned, non-owned, and hired vehicles, in an amount not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence as applicable.

Certificates of Insurance shall be furnished prior to the commencement of Services. Contractor shall include all subcontractors as insureds under its policies or maintain certificates of insurance for each subcontractor. All coverage for subcontractors shall be subject to all of the requirements stated herein. Contractor shall be responsible for assuring that all subcontractors are properly insured.

- 8. <u>Indemnification</u>: Contractor agrees to protect, defend, indemnify and hold the County, its employees and elected and appointed officials harmless from any and all claims, demands, suits, liability, judgements, and expenses arising out of or connected with the activities of the Contractor, Contractor's employees, agents, sub-contractors, and anyone else working for the contractor.
- 9. Termination: In the event that review of the Contractor's performance shows non-conformance to the terms and conditions contained herein as a result of the Contractor's errors, omissions, or negligent acts, the Contractor shall be in breach of this agreement and the County may take corrective action as it deems necessary including, but not limited to, withholding or reduction of payment. The County shall also have the right to suspend this agreement upon five (5) calendar day's written notice to the Contractor. Such written notice shall state the reasons for suspension and allow for a review period to ten (10) days during which the Contractor shall be provided with an opportunity to respond with an explanation of justification and/or shall undertake any reasonable remedial action required by the County. If, in the opinion of the County, the Contractor remains in violation of this agreement at the completion of the five (5) day suspension period, the County shall have the right to terminate this agreement whereupon all obligations of the County to the Contractor shall cease. In the event this project is terminated prior to completion of the services by the Contractor, the Contractor shall be paid for services performed to the date of termination.
- 10. <u>Iran Divestment List</u>: The Contractor does hereby certify that they are not a person identified on the Iran Divestment List as defined in North Carolina General Statues 147-96.58.
- 11. <u>E-Verify</u>: The Contractor and the Contractor's sub-contractors shall comply with the requirements of Article 2 of Chapter 64 of the North Carolina General Statutes, and shall sign the Owner's Affidavit certifying compliance therewith as requested.

12. Miscellaneous.

a. <u>Choice of Law and Forum</u>. This contract shall be deemed made in Vance County, North Carolina. This contact shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the law of North Carolina. The exclusive forum and venue for all actions arising out of this contract shall be the appropriate division of the North Carolina General Court of Justice, in Vance County. Such actions shall neither be commenced in nor removed

- to federal court. This section shall not apply to subsequent actions to enforce a judgement entered in actions heard pursuant to this section.
- b. <u>Waiver</u>. No action or failure to act by the County shall constitute a waiver of any of its rights or remedies that arise out this contract, nor shall such action or failure to act constitute approval of or acquiescence in a breach thereunder, except as may be specifically agreed in writing.
- c. <u>Performance of Government Functions</u>. Nothing contained in this contract shall be deemed or construed so as to in any way estop, limit, or impair the County from exercising or performing any regulatory, policing, legislative, governmental, or other powers or functions.
- d. <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this contract shall be unenforceable, the remainder of this contract shall be enforceable to the extent permitted by law.
- e. <u>Assignment, Successors, and Assigns</u>. Without the County's written consent, the Contractor shall not assign (which includes to delegate) any of its rights (including the right to payment) or duties that arise out of this contract. Unless the County otherwise agrees in writing, the contractor and all assigns shall be subject to all of the County's defenses and shall be liable for all of the Contractor's duties that arise out of this contract and all of the County's claims that arise out of this contract. Without granting the Contractor the right to assign, it is agreed that the duties of the contractor that arise out of this contract shall be binding upon it and its heirs, personal representative, successors, and assigns.
- f. <u>Compliance with Law</u>. In performing all of the Work, the Contractor shall comply with all applicable laws.
- g. <u>County Policy</u>. THE COUNTY OPPOSES DISCRIMINATION ON THE BASIS OF RACE AND SEX AND URGES ALL OF ITS CONTRACTORS TO PROVIDE A FAIR OPPOURTUNITY FOR MINORITIES AND WOMEN TO PARTICIPATE IN THEIR WORKFORCE AND AS SUBCONTRACTORS AND VENDORS UNDER COUNTY CONTRACTS.
- h. <u>EEO Provision</u>. During the performance of this Contract the Contractor agrees as follows: (1) The Contractor shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, political affiliation, or belief, age, or handicap. The Contractor shall take affirmative action to insure that applicants are employed and that employees are treated equally during employment, without regard to race, color, religion, sex, national origin, political affiliation or belief, age, or handicap. The Contractor shall post in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment, notices setting forth these EEO provisions. (2) The Contractor in all solicitations or advertisements for employees place by on behalf of the Contractor, state all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, religion, sex, national origin, political affiliation or belief, age, or handicap.
- i. <u>No Third Party Right Created</u>. This contract is intended for the benefit of the County and the Contractor and not any other person.

- j. <u>Principles of Interpretation</u>. In this contract, unless the context requires otherwise: The singular includes the plural and the plural the singular. The pronouns "it" and "its" include the masculine and feminine. Reference to statutes or regulations includes all statutory or regulatory provisions consolidating, amending or replacing the statute or regulation. References to contracts and agreements shall be deemed to include all amendments to them. The word "person" includes natural persons, firms, companies associations, partnerships, trusts, corporations, governmental agencies and units, and any other legal entities.
- k. Modifications, Entire Agreement. A modification of this contract is not valid unless signed by both parties and otherwise in accordance with requirements of law. Further, a modification is not enforceable against the County unless the County Manager or other duly authorized official signs it for the County. This contract contains the entire agreement between the parties pertaining to the subject matter of this contract. With respect to that subject matter, there are no promises, agreements, conditions, inducements, warranties, or understandings, written or oral, expressed or implied, between the parties, other than as set forth or referenced in this contract.

Finance Director's Report

Vance County Finance Director's Report to the Board May 1, 2023

A. KARTS Funding Request. KARTS is a transportation authority created by joint resolution of the Boards of Commissioners of Granville, Vance, Warren, and Franklin Counties. Their board includes one commissioner as well as one human service organization representative from each county. KARTS has been without a finance director for several months and has requested emergency funding from each of the counties to get through the remainder of the fiscal year. According to the interim director, they are in need of \$75,000 to close out the fiscal year plus the \$19,127 (requested 56,588 and we provided \$37,461) that the county did not provide in the current year budget which serves as a match for their other federal and state funding. In total the request is \$94,127 to close out the month of June. For preventative purposes we would like to ask for this conditional funding in the amount up to \$94,127 so that KARTS will be able to keep their doors open and make payroll. Requirements: See actuals, bank statements, etc. *Recommendation: Authorize the Finance Director to disperse conditional funding in an amount up to \$94,127 to KARTS subject to the other counties agreeing and subject to KARTS showing the need for funding.*

County Manager's Report

- **A.** Resolution of Appreciation Brian Short. Brian Short is retiring on May 31st after 32 years of service to the County. The enclosed resolution is to be provided to Brian at his retirement reception on May 19th. Recommendation: Approve Resolution of Appreciation to Brian Short for his 32 years of service to Vance County.
- **B. Fireworks Permit Tourism.** The Vance County Tourism Department is requesting approval of a fireworks permit for its Independence Day celebration at Kerr Lake on Saturday, July 1, 2023. According to Tourism Director Pam Hester, the TDA has obtained the necessary permits and approvals from NC State Parks and the Corps of Engineers and the show will be contracted with a professional pyrotechnics firm which has the appropriate credentials and insurance coverage. **Recommendation:** Approve the request from Tourism for a permit and fee waiver to discharge fireworks at its Independence Day celebration at Kerr Lake planned for Saturday, July 1, 2023, contingent upon the necessary approvals from the fire marshal.
- C. Presentation of FY 2023-24 Recommended Budget. The FY 2023-24 recommended budget will be presented on Monday evening. The manager recommends setting budget work sessions for Monday, May 8 and Wednesday, May 10 as needed to review the budget in detail and suggests the board consider daytime work sessions to support and accommodate staff. The public hearing on the budget will be set for the evening of June 5th, which is the date of the board's regular meeting. Recommendation: Receive the FY 2023-24 recommended budget, schedule budget work sessions, and schedule budget hearing for the June 5th regular meeting.



04/04/23- The Sergeant First Class Health Robinson Promise to Address Comprehensive Toxins Act (PACT Act) expands access to VA services and benefits for veterans exposed to toxic substances, making it easier for many survivors to receive VA Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC). There are more periods of service and over 20 additional presumptive conditions that qualify. Presumptive conditions are the conditions VA presumes are service-related.

Veterans can now access disability benefit claim decision notice letters electronically on the VA.gov site. Before the option recently became available, veterans had to wait for paper copies of decision notices to be mailed.
