It has been my privilege to serve on the Vance County Alcohol Beverage Control Board for several years, and I have enjoyed my service on that Board. I am therefore requesting that I be reappointed to a new three-year term beginning in July, 2023.

Public Notice

The Vance County Board of Commissioners will hold a public hearing on July 10, 2023 at 6:00 p.m. or shortly thereafter in the Commissioners' Meeting Room, County Administration Building, 122 Young Street, Henderson, NC. In accordance with North Carolina General Statute 158-7.1(c), the purpose of the hearing will be to receive public input on a proposed economic development incentive expenditure to be considered for the expansion of a local company.

In return for the commitments of investing \$181,498 over the next 12 months and creating a minimum of 15 additional full-time jobs in Vance County, it is proposed that Vance County will facilitate and provide a \$75,000 Building Reuse Grant with the source of funds being appropriated from funds from the NC Department of Commerce and the Vance County General Fund Balance. The expansion of this company in Vance County will stimulate investment in the local economy and promote business, resulting in the creation of additional jobs at competitive wages, and to encourage economic growth and development opportunities which the County has determined will be made possible because of this Project.

All persons interested in this matter are invited to attend this public hearing and present their views.

EXPLANATION OF THE REQUEST

This request is to rezone 84.72Acres from GC-1 (General Commercial) to CZ-R10 (Conditional Zoning R10).

OWNER/APPLICANT

Owner: Crews Family Farm, LLC

Applicant: C3 Design and Engineering, PLLC

STAFF COMMENTS

The applicant seeks to rezone the entire parcel 0412 02007. The tract is located at 95 Old Poplar Creek Rd. The proposed request is to take the parcel from GC-1 to CZ-R10.

The planning board should consider the following factors in deciding this case

- A. The proposal will place all property similarly situated in the area in the same category, or in appropriate complementary categories.
- B. There is convincing demonstration that all uses permitted under the proposed zone classification would be in the general public interest and not merely in the interest of an individual or small group.
- C. There is convincing demonstration that the conditional proposal would be appropriate in the area included in the proposed change.
- D. There is convincing demonstration that the character of the neighborhood will not be materially or adversely affected by the proposed change.
- E. The proposed change is in accord with the County Land Use Plan and sound planning principles. In part the current land use plan has a Goal 1: To encourage development at a rate and in a pattern which can be efficiently and effectively served by existing and planned services and facilities. It has a strategy (g), Develop densities based on availability of water and sewer, soils characteristics, geological conditions, topography and biological conditions. Goal 1 also has an objective 2: Enhance property values and quality of life with a strategy (d), Require improvements appropriate to the density in all new subdivisions at time of development.
- F. Land Use Plan references are attached.

PLANNING BOARD RECOMMENDATION: On May 11, 2023 the Vance County Planning Board recommended approval of the conditional zoning as presented with a unanimous vote.

COMMISSIONERS MEETING: July 10, 2023

Whenever the Board of Commissioners makes a decision to adopt or to reject a zoning amendment, the board must approve a written statement describing whether the action is consistent with an adopted comprehensive plan. The statement must also address why the board considers the action taken to be reasonable and in the public interest. The board is not required to follow its adopted plans in zoning decisions, but must consider its reasons for deciding to follow the plan or not.

-Draft Motion and Rationale for Board of Commissioner Disapproval: Motion to deny the rezoning request on the basis that the character of the neighborhood will be materially and adversely affected by uses and dimensional requirements allowed in the proposed CZR10 zoning category.

-Draft Motion and Rationale for Board of Commissioner Approval: Motion to approve the rezoning request on the basis that the character of the neighborhood will not be materially and adversely affected by uses and dimensional requirements allowed in the proposed CZR10 zoning category. It is reasonable and consistent with the County's land use plan by promoting dimensional requirements that encourage a variety of housing types and values. Subject to the following conditions.

- 1. Permitted uses of Single Family Homes (maximum of 85), Townhomes (maximum of 120) and Patio Homes (maximum of 85).
- 2. The subdivision shall be required to connect to municipal water and sewer service.
- 3. The streets be constructed using curb and gutter.
- 4. Street lighting required and will be consistent with utility provider recommendation. Contract for street lighting to be managed through the HOA. (homeowners association)

- 5. HOA (homeowners association), to contract with a solid waste provider and each homeowner shall participate in provider's program.
- 6. Final street design to include 2 currences off Poplar Creek Rd. and 2 means of ingress/egress to all sections of the development.
- 7. Land in the subdivision site not contained in lots, streets, or utility easements shall be in one or more configures parcels dedicated or reserved as open space for the life of the development. The title to the open space shall be conveyed to the Homeowners Association that is responsible for managing the open space for its intended purpose.
- 8. The HOA as owner of the open space shall be responsible for maintaining the open space including retention ponds so they function effectively and as designed.
- 9. Retention ponds shall be fence protected.
- 10. Open Space for the subdivision shall be a minimum of 23% of the total parcel, including retention pands.
- 11. Construction of all residences shall be stick built with on site construction.
- 12. Landscape plan to include tree plantings along all streets in subdivision
- 13. Entire parcel limited to no more than 4 units to an acre.

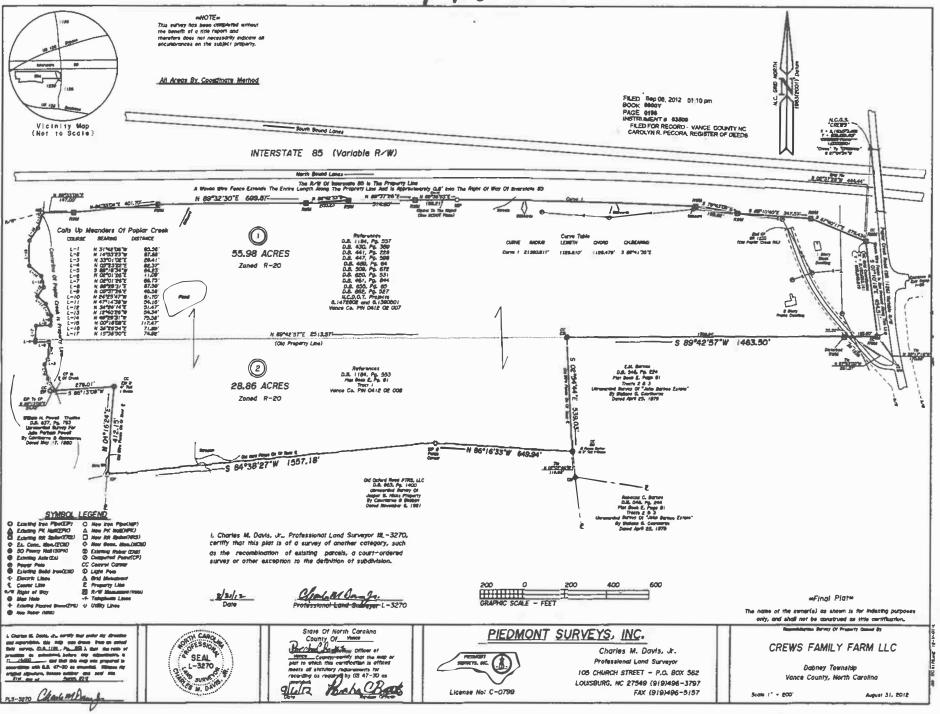
Statement of Justification

2. Have the conditions changed in the area to justify the requested amendment. Please explain below:

The area where this parcel is located has recently received a residential application for the adjacent parcel for med/high density residential and the area in general is growing east of oxford all along the Oxford Loop. Residential development is increasing in this area due to the recent completion of the East End connector. The parcel is currently zoned I-1 however no development proposals have been contemplated for this and the property's topographic features renders it towards something with smaller and flexible foot prints as opposed to a large slab for industrial use.

3. What factors justify the proposed amendment?

Factors that justify this proposal have been mentioned above regarding the changed conditions in the area. Additionally, factors such as the proximity nearby arterials and the interstate transportation network create the need to maximize the development potential of this parcel. Additionally, the proposed development would offer a variety of residential types from single family detached, to 2 unit patio / townhomes, to 4-8 unit townhomes that provide a place for more than one type of buyer/resident. Providing these residential options near to the VGCC campus will be a positive benefit to both the residents in this development as well as VGCC and other nearby businesses.

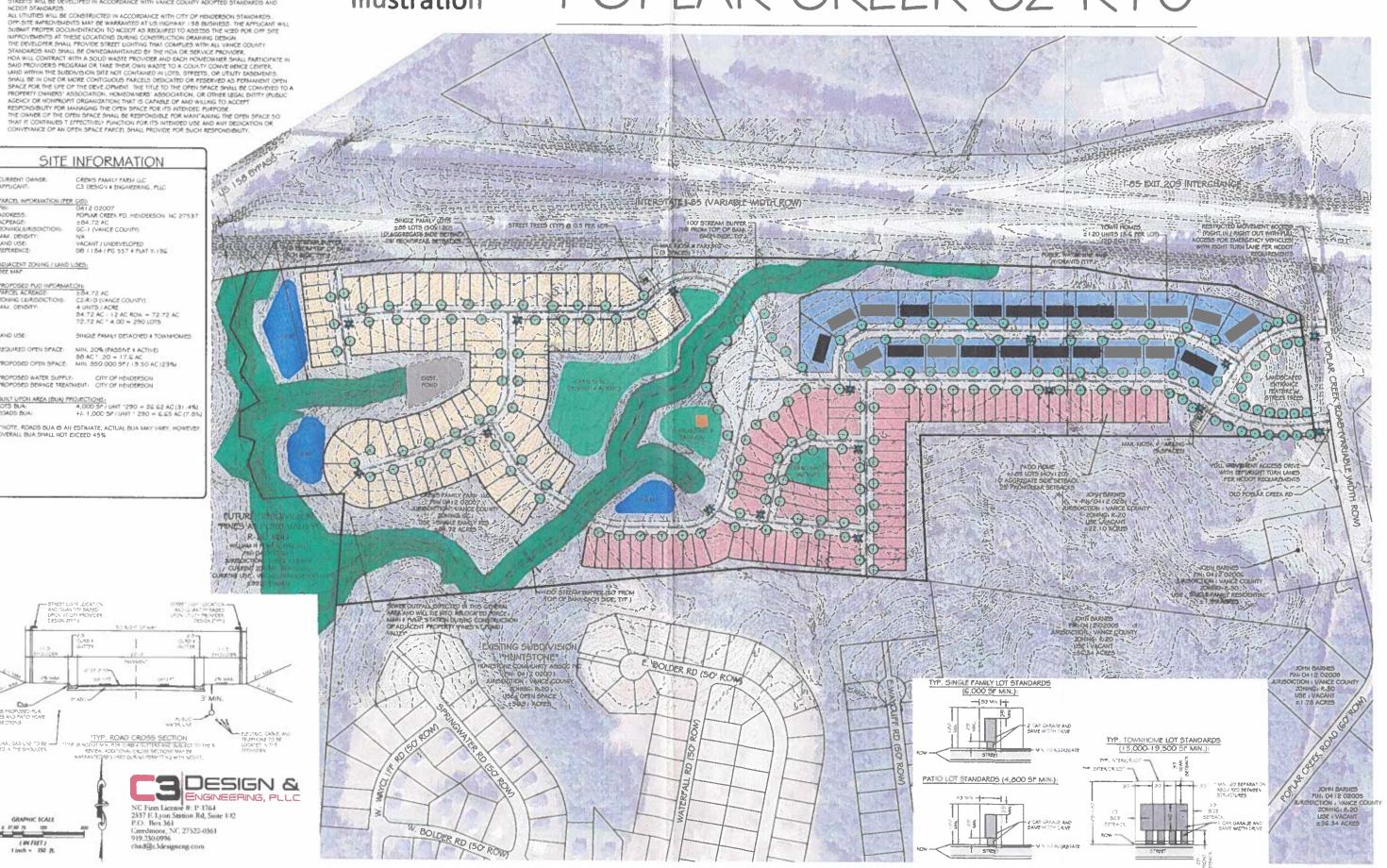

As discussed, USDA – RD has provided approval to proceed with the award process for the Contract 2 portion of the VCWD, Phase 1B project. As such, this letter is to provide a summary the bid results and provide our recommendation. The scope of work of Contract 2 includes the complete rehabilitation of the existing 100,000 gallon elevated water tank located in Kittrell, NC. All existing coatings will be removed, minor structural / mechanical repairs made, and new coating system applied to the exterior and interior of the tank. The project also includes the replacement of an existing pressure reducing valve and associated electrical work at the existing vault near US-1 and College St.

WHEREAS, the Owner intends to complete an Asset Inventory and Assessment Project, as outlined in the Project Narrative within the application for funding, and outlined in the funding approval for the NCDEQ Project No. AIA-D-ARP-0214, hereinafter called the PROJECT; and

NOW, THEREFORE, the OWNER and ENGINEER, for the consideration hereinafter named, agree as follows:

The ENGINEER agrees to perform the following tasks obligated under this Agreement:

SECTION I - RECORD DRAWING ARCHIVING

- a) Engineer shall scan and provide Owner with digital copies of all available water system drawings and as-builts records that are available.
- b) The Engineer and Owner will review available drawings and records to be archived and maintained for accuracy with the new mapping and asset inspection information. All digital records will be organized by date and name and provided to the Owner in the requested format.

SECTION II – WATER SYSTEM MAPPING UPDATE

- a) Prepare detailed water distribution system mapping update to include updates to the existing water system to include all water mains, valves, hydrants, storage tanks, and attributes of each to produce a thorough updated system map.
- b) Produce mapping update as hard copy and digital format for Owner's use. Digital mapping shall include attribute data collected in format as requested by the Owner.

SECTION III - WATER EFFICIENCY REPORT / WATER AUDIT

- a) Engineer shall coordinate details of performing a Water Audit with Owner's staff, to include developing spreadsheets and a method for tracking all water produced, billed and develop mechanism for tracking all currently unaccounted for water usage.
- b) Engineer shall utilize all collected data and formulate a report for presenting water audit results and make recommendations for addressing any water loss concerns. This shall



- include recommendations for system improvements where necessary and development of any estimates for inclusion in ongoing Capital Improvement Plan.
- c) Engineer shall assist Owner in a review of residential and commercial meter accuracy from an administrative standpoint, targeted field inspections, review of installation data and make recommendations as needed for upgrade alternatives.

SECTION IV - DETAILED HYDRAULIC MODEL UPDATE

a) Complete hydraulic model update of distribution system and calibrate through field testing. Hydraulic model shall be submitted within report with detailed recommendations for areas of concern and needed improvements. The Engineer will use 12-months of customer billing data that will be georeferenced and incorporated into the hydraulic model to simulate actual system demand.

SECTION V - ASSET INVENTORY AND ASSESSMENT

- a) Complete a comprehensive Asset Inventory and Assessment Program. The program will be completed in accordance with all NCDEQ standards and funding requirements and will be developed following the US Environmental Protection Agency's guide entitled "Asset Management: A Handbook for Small Water Systems."
- b) ENGINEER shall provide a comprehensive inventory of all system components, document the condition of all assets, and develop a system for future management of the assets.
- c) Review all existing information from other sources for inclusion in assessment.
- d) Develop report based on asset conditions including but not limited to: level of service, likelihood of failure, repercussions of failure, threat to environment, and financial ability to extend the asset life versus replacement.
- e) Provide detailed cost estimates, priorities, and recommendation for implementing the asset inventory and review into a Capital Improvement Plan.
- f) Engineer will assist the Owner by developing the initial Lead Service Line (LSL) Inventory that is required by EPA and NCDEQ by the October 16, 2024 deadline.

SECTION VI - O&M REPORT / CRITICAL ASSETS

- a) Meet with OWNER to review all critical assets within the water distribution system including the Owner's booster pump stations, system interconnections, major metering stations, storage tanks, electrical systems and related equipment.
- b) Develop comprehensive Operation & Maintenance (O&M) Report of all critical assets. During inspection of the assets, Engineer will engage and include Owner during process for educational training on operation and maintenance of assets.
- c) Prepare detailed estimates for repair, asset maintenance, and/or replacement as needed. Assets will be graded based on criticality of condition, likelihood of failure, probability of environmental concern and other factors.



d) Provide a final Operation and Maintenance report based on review of critical assets, along with operation and maintenance manual updates as necessary, and copies of pump curves and detailed data on each asset. This O&M report will be integral to the Asset Management Plan but provided as a stand-alone document for staff reference on a daily basis.

SECTION VII – CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

a) Develop a 10-Year Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) based on Asset Inventory & Assessment and other findings resulting from this project. The CIP will include financial and funding recommendations, as well as a plan for implementation. CIP will be developed and completed in accordance with NCDEQ guidelines.

SECTION VIII - ASSET MANAGEMENT PLAN

- a) All information from the project will be compiled and documented as the Asset Management Plan (AMP) for the water system. The final AMP shall serve as a living document and a guide for system operations and planning.
- b) The final deliverable of the Asset Management Plan will be provided in both printed and digital copies to the Owner.

SECTION IX – RATE STUDY & RATE EDUCATION

- a) The Engineer will assist the Owner with the selection of a Financial Consultant to complete the required rate study and rate education in accordance with the requirements of NCDEQ and Local Government Commission per the distressed system designation.
- b) The financial consultant utilize the historical data coupled with forecasted needs for capital planning, operational adjustments and other factors to develop a detailed rate schedule and related system fees to insure future sustainability of utility operations.

Additional ENGINEERING services, if required, may be arranged for and furnished by the Engineer and separately paid for by the Owner for a price to be subsequently agreed upon if the need for these services arises.



PAYMENT

The OWNER agrees to pay the ENGINEER for services noted in Sections I - IX above for the following not to exceed fees:

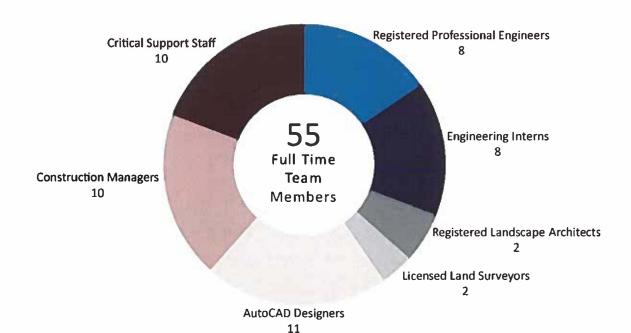

PROJECT PURPOSE AND SOLUTIONS:

Like many rural North Carolina towns, Chadbourn has specific challenges related to properly managing and maintaining aging water and sewer systems. LKC helped Chadbourn secure grant funding for both a Water and

a Sewer AIA through the State Reserve Grant program, and both AIA's are near completion. The primary purpose is to inventory and assess all current assets, assign a timeline of capital and maintenances expenses associated with each, and help the Town plan for future capital expenses.

LKC's survey group provided survey-grade mapping of all critical water and sewer assets, and Logan and Ben followed the surveyors and performed manhole assessments at the same time. Raeford's water and sewer utilities have not received much attention in recent decades. Both the water and wastewater treatment plants showed signs of deficiencies and violations, and the distribution and collection systems have far exceeded their useful life.





LKC, in partnership with McGougan Brothers Design, assisted Raeford with development of a Capital Improvement Plan and Asset Management Plan for the entire water and sewer utilities. The focus of the report was to identify deficiencies, map the entire systems, develop a hydraulic model, develop cost estimates for improvements, and identify funding solutions and financial analysis.

PROJECT PURPOSE AND SOLUTIONS:

LKC worked closely with Lumber River Council of Governments and Town Staff to conduct detailed review and assessment of the Town of Ellerbe's wastewater collection and conveyance system. The assessment included manhole condition assessments, inflow and infiltration screening and flow tracking, critical asset inspections, and general coordination and oversite of gravity sewer CCTV inspections. As part of the wastewater system evaluation, LKC identified many system deficiencies and generated a prioritized capital improvement plan (CIP) that included over \$6.8M of collections system improvements. 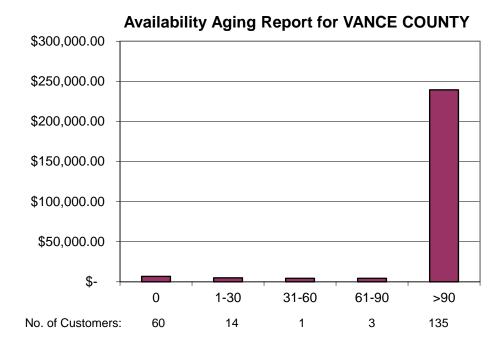

Vance County Water District Operations Report May 2023



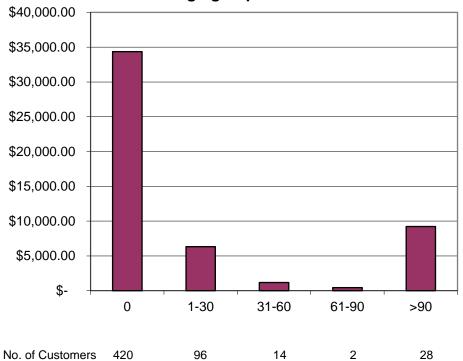

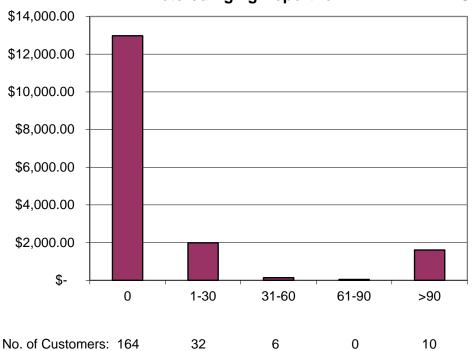

Committee Reports and Recommendations

Vance County Committee Reports and Recommendations July 10, 2023

Planning/Environmental Committee

The Committee (Brummitt, Feimster, and Kelly); Alston attending, met on Monday June 27, 2023. The Committee discussed the rezoning petition for the Poplar Creek subdivision to CZ-R10. This is the county's first conditional zoning petition. The proposed Poplar Creek subdivision will have an average density of four units per acre, including 120 townhomes, 85 patio homes, and 85 single family homes for a total of 290 residences. The proposed site plan includes conditions of the rezoning petition. Staff commented that conditions of the rezoning petition have to be contained in the ordinance and staff will present a draft ordinance to the Board of Commissioners at the July 10, 2023 meeting. There were concerns about the lack of sidewalks in the subdivision, but petitioners commented that sidewalks would be a public amenity open to all, while being maintained only by members of the Homeowners Association. County subdivision ordinances do not usually require sidewalks due to the maintenance and ownership issues. The roads will be turned over to NCDOT and maintained as state roads. The Vance County Planning Board unanimously approved the rezoning petition as is. *For your information*.

County Manager's Report

Vance County County Manager's Report to the Board July 10, 2023

- A. Resolution Henderson Vance Industrial Park Department of Commerce Grant: Industrial Development Fund -Utility Account Funding Assistance. In order to complete the sewer and roadway work at the industrial park, additional funding is needed via the NC Department of Commerce. This is being applied for as a 100% grant through the NC Department of Commerce. Funding is being sought in the amount of \$161,700. Recommendation: Approve Resolution as drafted.
- **B.** Fire Study Selection of Firm. Vance County received six responses to its RFP (Request for Proposal) to the Fire Services Study. Staff has conducted a review of each proposal. Staff has reviewed each of these against the RFP that was sent out. The results from this will be presented to the board at your meeting. Recommendation: Consider approval of staff's recommendation so the County can enter into a professional services agreement to begin the Fire Services Study.
- **C. EMS Land Termination of Contract.** As follow-up to the County's contract to offer to purchase land for a new EMS station, this contract has now expired due to the seller not agreeing to change the restrictive covenants on the property. The County Attorney would like the board to take action in open session to enter into the record that Vance County is officially terminating the contract. **Recommendation**: Terminate land purchase contract for EMS property as previously entered into.
- **D.** Proposed Revisions to Ordinance #13 Solid Waste Collection and Disposal. Vice Chairman Brummitt would like the board to consider making revisions to this ordinance to increase penalties for illegal dumping. Section V Penalties and Remedies currently states the following:
 - "Any person who violates any provision of this Ordinance including the placing, discarding, disposing, leaving or dumping of the articles forbidden by this Ordinance for each day or portion thereof, said articles or matter are left, shall constitute a separate offense and that a person in violation of this Ordinance shall be punished by fine of \$100.00 (One Hundred Dollars) or imprisonment not exceeding 30 days or both for each offense."

Proposed amendments to the existing language could be developed and brought back to the board at your next meeting. *Recommendation:* Direct staff as to the board's desire to examine amendments to the Solid Waste Collection and Disposal Ordinance.

- 3. That the grant will be monitored quarterly to assure compliance with this proposal and the Department of Commerce regulations.
- 4. That the Chair of the Vance County Board of Commissioners, Yolanda J. Feimster is authorized to sign the Application for Utility Account Funding.
- 5. That the Interim Vance County Manager, Scott Elliott is authorized to execute the grant agreement and subsequent construction contracts after bidding and successful award of construction contracts by the Vance County Board of Commissioners.
- 6. Be it resolved, that the amount of the grant application will be \$351,960.

Ordinance: #13

RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING SOLID WASTE COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL IN VANCE COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA

As authorized by Chapter 153A of the General Statutes, the Vance County Board of Commissioners hereby adopts the following rules and regulations for the purpose of encouraging and attempting to insure an adequate and continuing service of solid waste collection and disposal outside of the incorporated municipalities of Vance County.

Section I. Definitions

The following definitions shall apply in the interpretation and enforcement of these regulations:

- A. <u>Ashes</u>: Refuse resulting from the burning of wood, coal coke, and other combustible material.
- B. <u>Bag</u>: 30 gallon capacity, 2¹/₄ Mil with reinforced seams.
- C. <u>Board of Commissioners</u>: As herein used, means the Board of Commissioners of Vance County.
- D. <u>Building Rubbish</u>: Rubbish from construction, remodeling, and repair operations on houses, commercial buildings and other structures, including but not limited to excavated earth, stones, brick, plaster, lumber, concrete, and waste parts occasioned by installation and replacements.
- E. <u>Garbage</u>: Animal and vegetable refuse resulting from the handling, preparation, cooking and consumption of food, including a minimum amount of liquid necessary incident thereto.
- F. <u>Industrial Waste</u>: Sawdust, shavings, feathers, excelsior, cartons, boxes, metal, glass, paper, wood, textiles, chemicals, plastic, or other waste materials from processing plants, factories, or manufacturing operations.
- G. <u>Industry</u>: A place of business employing more than ten individuals and engaged in the manufacture or assembly of a product or products.
- H. <u>Person</u>: Any individual, firm, governmental unit, organization, partnership, corporation or company.
- I. <u>Refuse</u>: Solid Waste, including but not limited to garbage, rubbish, ashes and trash.
- J. <u>Refuse collector:</u> Any person who collects or transports refuse or any person, firm or corporation who hauls any solid waste, other than one who removes refuse from his or her own premises, or who hauls any solid waste other than his or her own.

- K. <u>Rubbish</u>: Refuse (exclusive of garbage and ashes) including but not limited to paper, rags, cartons, boxes, wood, excelsior, rubber, leather, tree, bush and hedge branches, cutting and trimming, year trimming, grass, leaves, tin cans, small mineral matter, glass, crockery, dirt, earth and trash.
- L. Self-Unloading Vehicle: Any vehicle which does not have to be unloaded manually.
- M. Solid Waste: Refuse, including but not limited to garbage, rubbish, ashes and trash.
- N. <u>Waste</u>: Useless, unused, unwanted, or discarded materials resulting from natural community activities, including solids, liquids, and gases.

LANDFILL ADMINISTRATION

Supervision of the County Landfill(s) shall be the responsibility of a Landfill Supervisor. The Landfill Supervisor's duties shall include but not be limited to operating the landfill according to the rules and regulations contained in the ordinance, designing fill locations, monitoring loads of solid waste, controlling the speed and operation of vehicles at the facility, and conducting the activities of the landfill in the interest of public health, safety, and protection of the environment. The Supervisor shall see that all solid waste is covered daily with a 6" layer of compact earth. In addition to the Landfill Supervisor, such additional personnel and equipment may be authorized for the operation of the landfill as may be determined by the County Commissioners.

LIABILITY

As a public service, the County's landfill(s) may be used by private citizens at the time and under the conditions set forth in this Ordinance. While the County offers this convenience, the County shall not be responsible for damage to private property nor personal injury which may occur on the site. Neither the County nor its employees shall be liable for damage to private vehicles or personal injury to persons using the County's landfill.

HOURS OF OPERATION

The landfill(s) shall normally be open eight (8) hours, Monday through Saturday. The landfill shall not be open for public use on Sunday or any holidays except by specific authority of the Board of Commissioners.

Section II. Solid Waste or Refuse Collection

The owner, occupant, tenant, or lessee of any premises upon which garbage is stored shall remove, or cause to be removed, all garbage from the premises at least once a week. Refuse collector shall remove all refuse from the premises, when they receive compensation for this service. The work shall be done in a clean and orderly manner. Any refuse that is spilled shall be cleaned up, and the premises left in a sanitary condition.

Section III. Solid Waste or Refuse Transportation

No refuse collector shall transport refuse in a conveyance that has not been approved by the Health Director. The conveyance shall be leak proof, and covered with a canvas, or other substantial material, unless it is constructed in such a manner as to prevent leakage or spillage of the refuse. Truck beds in which garbage is hauled shall be cleaned daily.

Section IV. Solid Waste or Refuse Disposal

- (A) No refuse collector, or other person shall dispose of refuse, except by one of the following methods; provided that this section shall not be construed to prevent any person from properly disposing of refuse from his own residence, or business establishment, by:
 - (1) Burying it in a safe and sanitary manner approved by the Health Director.
 - (2) By burning refuse in an incinerator of type approved by the Health Director as safe and sanitary.
 - (3) By burying refuse in a sanitary landfill that is designed, operated, and equipped in accordance with the recommendations in Special Bulletin No. 479 of the North Carolina State Board of Health, Refuse Disposal by Sanitary Landfill. This bulletin is hereby incorporated by reference pursuant to authority granted by Article 4 of Chapter 130 of the General Statutes of North Carolina, and becomes a part of these regulations as fully as if set out verbatim herein. A copy of said bulletin is on file in the office of the Clerk of Superior Court of Vance County, and in the office of the Health Director.
- (B) This section shall not be construed to prevent any person from properly disposing of refuse from his or her own residence or business establishment.

MINIMUM VEHICLE REQUIREMENTS

No vehicle shall be allowed to deposit waste at the landfill unless the waste is enclosed in the vehicle or otherwise covered by some effective means. "Effective means" shall mean durable, heavy plastic or canvas with tie-downs and grommets in order to hold the covering in place. The Landfill Supervisor shall determine the adequacy of the covering and his decision shall be final.

All vehicles used to collect, transport, and deposit waste in the county's landfill may be required to supply information giving the name and address of the owner of the vehicle, the source and type of waste to be deposited, and the weight and size of the vehicle.

All vehicles which are not self-unloading shall arrive at the county's landfill no later than one hour before the close of the normal operating day. Vehicles with bodies greater than ten feet length or capacity of more than one and one-half tons which are not self-unloading may be required to be equipped with a cable pull-out unloading method. Vehicles which are not self-unloading will be subject to control by the Landfill Supervisor so as to minimize vehicle congestion and provide easy access to the fill site for self-unloading vehicles.

RESTRICTIONS, PROHIBITIONS AND INSPECTION

- (A) No open burning of materials deposited in the landfill(s) will be permitted. Waste brought to the county landfill shall be observed and inspected for prohibited materials. The hauler may be required to remove unacceptable materials at the discretion of the landfill supervisor.
- (B) The following shall not be acceptable for deposit in the landfill(s):
 - (1) Sludges and other semi-solid fluids;
 - (2) Containers containing unacceptable waste;
 - (3) Logs and large limbs of four inches or more in diameter and more than six feet in length.
 - (4) Automobile and truck bodies;
 - (5) Metal drums of more than 30 gallons capacity unless the top and bottom have been removed.
 - (6) Poison of any nature;
 - (7) Hot ashes;
 - (8) Explosives of any kind;
 - (9) Nuclear waste or waste containing radioactive substances;
 - (10) Tires which are not sliced or quartered
- (C) Harmful materials must be separated so they can be disposed of in the proper manner by the producer.

LANDFILL DISPOSAL FEES

- (A) Landfill disposal fees are as follows:
 - (1) 45¢ per cubic yard; and
 - (2) Minimum Charge: Cars or Trucks ½ ton or less (handling personal refuse): \$0.50 per load
- (B) These fees may be changed from time to time by the County Commissioners to reflect

actual cost of disposal.

SECTION V - PENALTIES AND REMEDIES

Any person who violates any provision of this Ordinance including the placing, discarding, disposing, leaving or dumping of the articles forbidden by this Ordinance for each day or portion thereof, said articles or matter are left, shall constitute a separate offense and that a person in violation of this Ordinance shall be punished by fine of \$100.00 (One Hundred Dollars) or imprisonment not exceeding 30 days or both for each offense.

SECTION VI - SEVERABILITY

Any provision or clause of these regulations with application thereof to any person or circumstances, is held invalid, such a declaration shall not invalidate such provisions to other persons or circumstances.

SECTION VII - EFFECTIVE DATE

These rules and regulations shall be in full force and effect from and after the $\underline{5}^{\underline{\text{th}}}$ day of July, 1978.

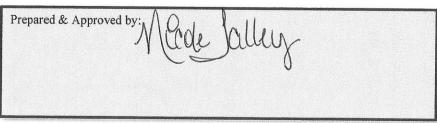

06/05/23- The Military Times media outlet recently issued a warning to veterans to be careful of people offering their services to help them file disability claims, with big fees attached.

Under federal guidelines, a veteran using an accredited representative can't be charged for help filing the initial claim. If they want to appeal a decision, then there are limits on how much an approved representative can charge. Unaccredited companies don't face these restrictions. According to the report published by Military Times, these companies might go by names like "medical consultants" or "coaches." They're businesses that advertise fee-based services to veterans, with the promise they can provide faster turnaround times on claims and higher benefit amounts compared to a veteran choosing to work with a representative approved by the VA.

The assistant director of the Office of Service-member Affairs at the federal Consumer Financial Protection Bureau recently spoke about these companies. He said that he's seen people signing away a portion of their due benefits in advance.

Veterans group like the VFW and Disabled American Veterans are pushing for the passage of the Guard VA Benefits Act. The legislation would put some controls in place for certain business practices by letting VA secretary impose criminal penalties on companies and individuals who charge fees to help veterans file disability benefit claims without VA authorization.

Accredited VSOs and representatives have to meet a set of requirements. These include passing an exam and background check, and participating in continuing education courses to make sure they're always providing the most up-to-date information. A non-recognized organization or individual can provide information, but can't be a representative.



VETERANS SERVICE OFFICE

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Trained professionals can help with financial support and monthly payments, education, Veteran Readiness and Employment, home loans, life insurance, pension, healthcare and burial benefits. They can help with gathering supporting documents like medical test results, file a claim or appeal on behalf of a veteran, and provide additional support like helping arrange transportation to medical appointments.

06/22/23- Today, the Department of Veterans Affairs announced that veterans, their families, caregivers and survivors can now report incidents of sexual assault or sexual harassment at VA facilities by calling 1-800-MyVA411 (800-698-2411 option 9).

Whenever someone calls the hotline, they will be able to confidentially report incidents of sexual assault or harassment that occur at VA facilities. The call center will be ready to answer the phones 24/7, and follow-up health care and support will also be made available to those in need.
