What is Reappraisal?

- Reappraisal is a process in which all real property in the county is appraised at its current market value as of a particular date.
- Real property includes both land and the improvements on it, whether residential, commercial, agricultural or industrial in nature.

Why We Reappraise Property

- State Law requires all counties to conduct a reappraisal at least once every eight years.
- Reappraisal distributes the overall property tax burden equitably across the county based on current market values.

What is Market Value?

- Market value is the most probable price a property would bring in an open and competitive market.
- Over time, most properties change in value, but often at different rates, depending on location.

The **Tax Department does not create market value**, rather we analyze market sales to determine market patterns and trends in different locations. Market value is set by the choices of buyers and sellers in the marketplace.

2024 Reappraisal

When will Reappraisal Occur?

- Reappraisal takes effect Jan. 1, 2024.
- Data collection began in 2022
- Schedule of Values complete between Sept. – Oct. 2023
- 2024 Reappraisal Notices will be mailed to all Vance County property owners March 2024.
- New market values will be used to calculate tax bills from Summer 2024 until the next reappraisal occurs.

4 Steps to Reappraisal

Data Collection: Physical characteristics are collected for each property, including condition and exterior features.

Sales analysis and modeling: Property sales are studied to determine market areas, trends, and patterns from which models that mimic the local market are created and applied at the neighborhood level.

Develop Schedule of Values: Schedule of Values are developed to help appraisers correlate physical characteristics with market values.

Appeals: Taxpayers have the right to appeal the values of their property to the Board of Equalization and Review per NCGS 105-322 (g)(2)

2024 Reappraisal

Where Our Values Come From

- Properties and sales are analyzed to determine current property conditions, market areas, and typical sale prices for areas.
- Some variations cannot be determined from the property's exterior. For example:
 - Whether a bonus room or basement is finished or unfinished.
 - Cathedral ceilings or other floor plan variations affecting the size of a second floor.
 - An unusual floor plan or other interior feature that is not typical for the market.
- The challenge, then, is to develop tables that correlate the physical property data we have on file with the sales data to help predict values for all properties, including those that did not sell.

2024 Reappraisal

Why We Do It This Way

- We are responsible for appraising about 26,000 individual properties all at one time. This is referred to as mass appraisal.
- Most major taxing jurisdictions across the country have the same sort of challenge.
- There is no practical way to appraise a large number of properties using the same methods used by single-property appraisers.
- Industry-standard methods have been developed for mass appraisal to produce property values that are reasonable and reliable.
- Unlike single-property appraisals, mass appraisal includes an appeals process to help address valuation issues that can result from limited information, inaccuracy, or even a difference of opinion.

How Do We Know It's Right?

- Mass appraisal techniques include statistical tools used to help measure the accuracy of an appraisal.
- We use a sales ratio as a common measure of how closely assessed values match up with current sale prices. The formula is: **Assessed Value ÷ Sale Price**
- A meaningful sales ratio requires considering multiple sales at typical market values. Sales of single properties or sales under non-typical conditions (foreclosures, auctions, short sales, etc.) often produce misleading results.

Disclaimer

- The data herein is our current estimation and is subject to change based on the following reasons:
 - Continual review of properties until the notices are mailed
 - Additional information may be obtained between now and the notices being mailed
 - Information and data changes are subject to the appeal process

Sales Ratio – Results

- At the outset of the reappraisal project, we set the following sales ratio goals:
- Median Sales Ratio: between 0.9 and 1.10 COD: 10-15 is typical
- These goals reflect the standards of the International Association of Assessing Officers (IAAO)
- Our actual results based on 827 2022-2023 sales:
 - Median Sales Ratio: 98.021
 - Mean (Average) Sales Ratio 99.455
 - COD: 11.52

What does this mean?

- A median sales ratio around 1.00 indicates that 2024 appraisal methods have generally followed sales in the market as a whole
- A low COD indicates that 2024 appraisal methods match up very closely with market sales of individual properties
- Both factors are important, because they demonstrate the accuracy of the appraisal methods that have been used for all properties, including those that have not recently sold

Another way to look at it

- When Change of Value Notices are mailed in March
- Overall countywide change is estimated to be between 67-72%
- 93% of properties have a value higher than in 2016
- 7% of properties have a value lower than in 2016
- 6% of all properties changed by +/-15% or less

Jurisdictional Change Estimates **(based on taxable value)**

- County Wide 67-72%
- Corporation 39-44%
- Henderson 80-85%
- Kittrell 94-99%
- Watkins 94-99%
- Dabney 46-51%
- Williamsboro 84-89%
- Townsville 59-64%
- Middleburg 53-58%
- Sandy Creek 80-85%

Different Areas, Different Changes

In broad terms, we have seen evidence that market values around the county have changed in different ways since 2016:

- Some areas of the county have seen an increase in market values, while others have experienced a decrease in value
- Some areas have changed a lot, and others by much less
- Some areas are about the same

The following are individual examples of these changes. They do not necessarily reflect market changes for all properties in that area.

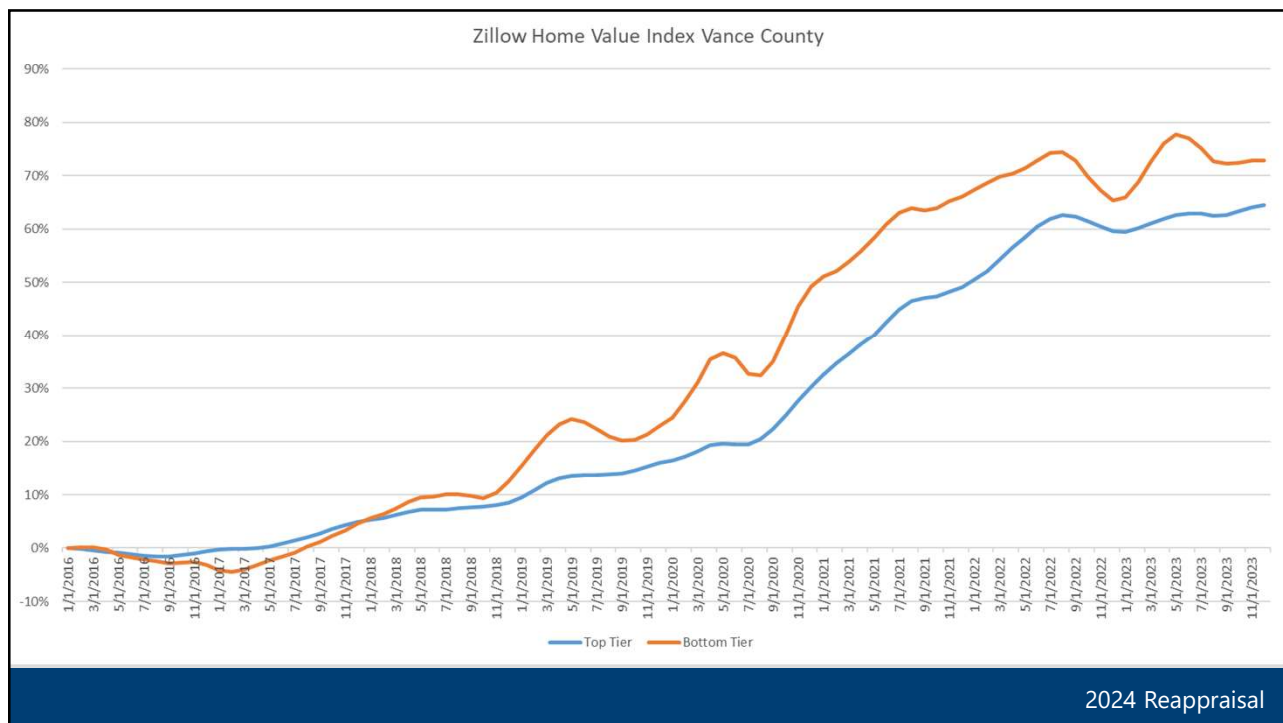

Zillow's measure of market changes between 2016 and 2023 in Vance County

- **Zillow Home Value Index (ZHVI):** A measure of the typical home value and market changes across a given region and housing type. It reflects the typical value for homes in the 35th to 65th percentile range.
- Zillow publishes:
 - Top-tier ZHVI (\$, typical value for homes within the 65th to 95th percentile range for a given region)
 - Bottom-tier ZHVI (\$, typical value for homes within the 5th to 35th percentile range for a given region).

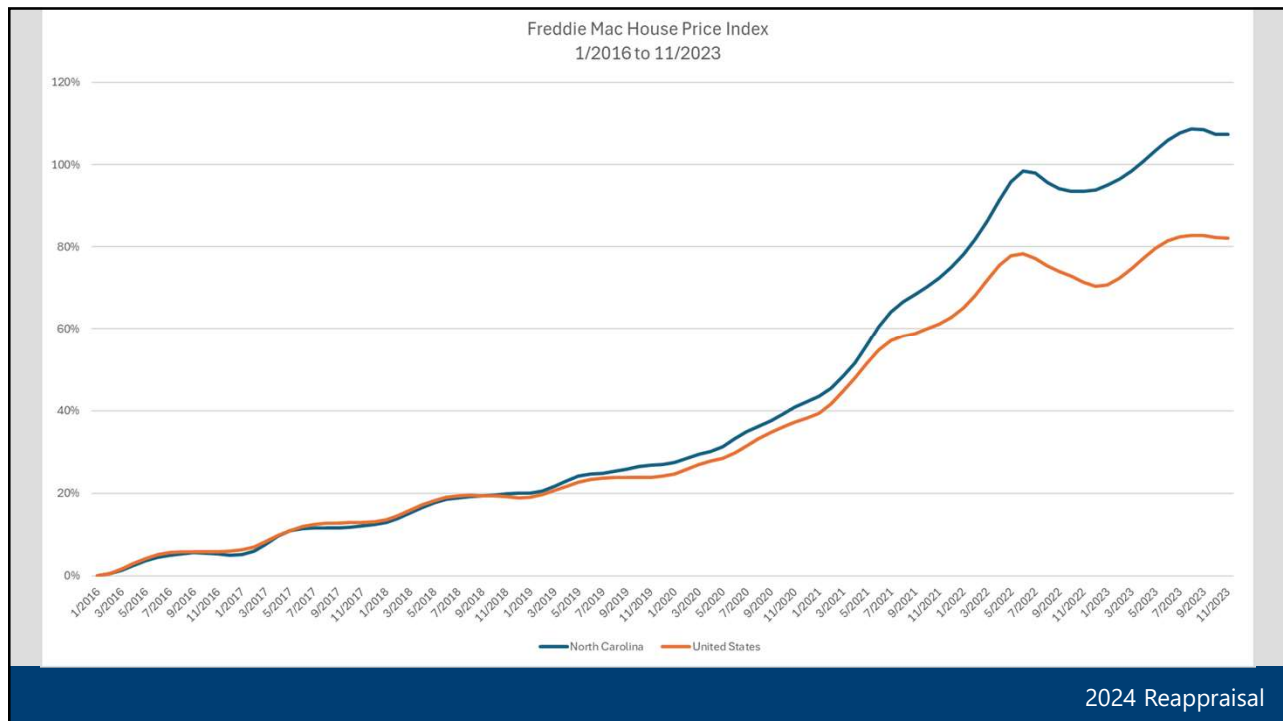

Freddie Mac's measure of market changes between 2016 and 2023 in NC and US

- The Freddie Mac House Price Index (FMHPI®) provides a measure of typical price inflation for houses within the United States.
- Values are calculated monthly and released at the end of the following month.
- Seasonally and non-seasonally adjusted series are available at three levels of geographical aggregation: Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA), state, and national.
- The FMHPI is based on an ever-expanding database of loans purchased by either Freddie Mac or Fannie Mae.

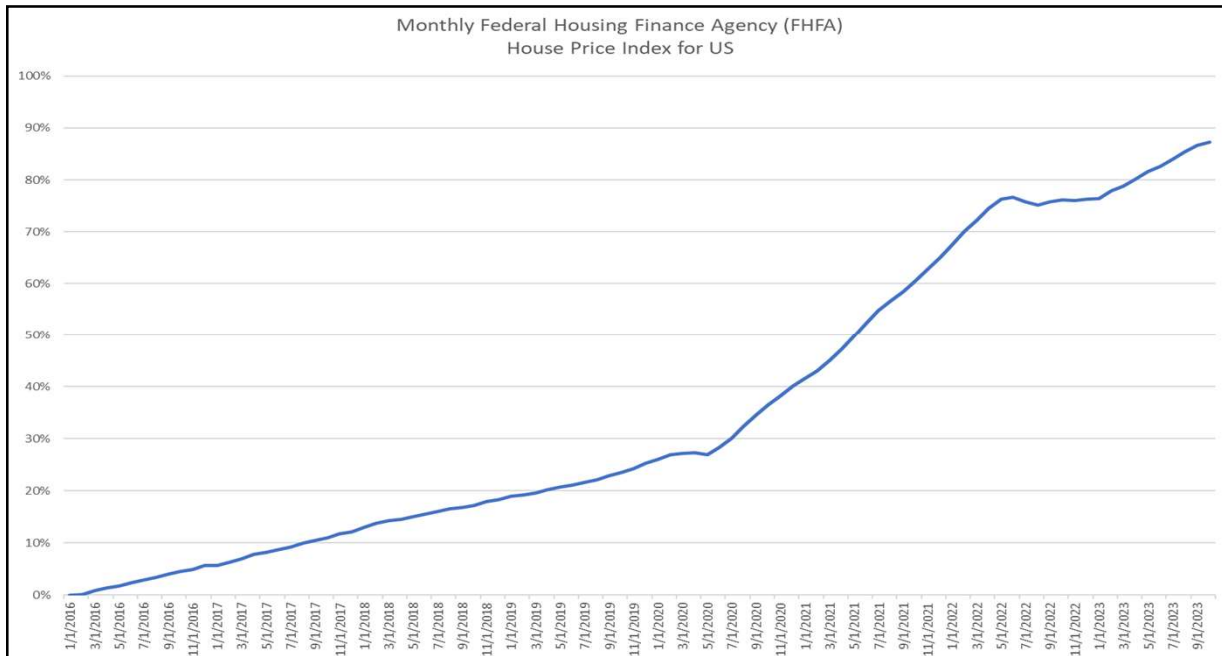

FHFA measure of market changes between 2016 and 2023 in US

- The Federal Housing Finance Agency House Price Index is a broad measure of the movement of single-family house prices.
- The FHFA HPI is a weighted, repeat-sales index, meaning that it measures average price changes in repeat sales or refinancings on the same properties.

Appraised Value Vs Tax Rates

- Appraised value and tax rates are two separate concerns.
- County tax appraisers evaluate market activity to determine appraised value, or market value.
- The tax rate is determined by the Vance County taxing jurisdictions, based on their budget needs.
- The appraised value is established well before the tax rate is set and is totally independent of the tax rate.
- The amount of the final tax bill cannot be determined until the tax rate is set.

Appeals: What to do if you Disagree

3 Steps to the Appeal Process

Review

- Review the information we have on file for your property, and report any outdated or incorrect information to us.

Compare

- Compare your property value with the sale prices of similar properties using our free online service.

Appeal

- If all information is up to date and you still disagree with the assessed value, you can file an appeal with the Board of Equalization and Review (BOER) and schedule a hearing. After the BOER hears your appeal, you will receive written notification of your property value in the mail.

Appeals

Is the question really about value?

There are often issues other than tax value that concern property owners, such as:

- The amount of change from the last reappraisal
- Affordability of the expected taxes
- Level of services provided

While these are all understandable concerns, the only issue the Tax Department can address is the appraised value.

2024 Reappraisal

How to Support Your Appeal

You will need to provide information to support your appeal.

Useful documentation includes:

- Comparable sales or comparable sale reports from the property owner, the counties online sales database or a real estate professional
- Income and Earnings Statement
- Pictures showing the property's inner and outer features and condition, including any upgrades
- **Optional:** A copy of a recent fee appraisal for the property, such as one done in connection with the purchase or refinance of the property

2024 Reappraisal

How to Support Your Appeal

- Data errors and out-of-date information about your property can be managed quickly. Our staff members are here to help if you need to correct, update, or verify your property information.
- Qualifying property owners may benefit from one of the available property tax relief programs
- Appeals must be based on value, not on the change in value or what the expected tax increase might be.
- If you know you're going to appeal your property value assessment, it is best to appeal as early as possible and before the deadline to ensure you can arrange and prepare for a hearing.

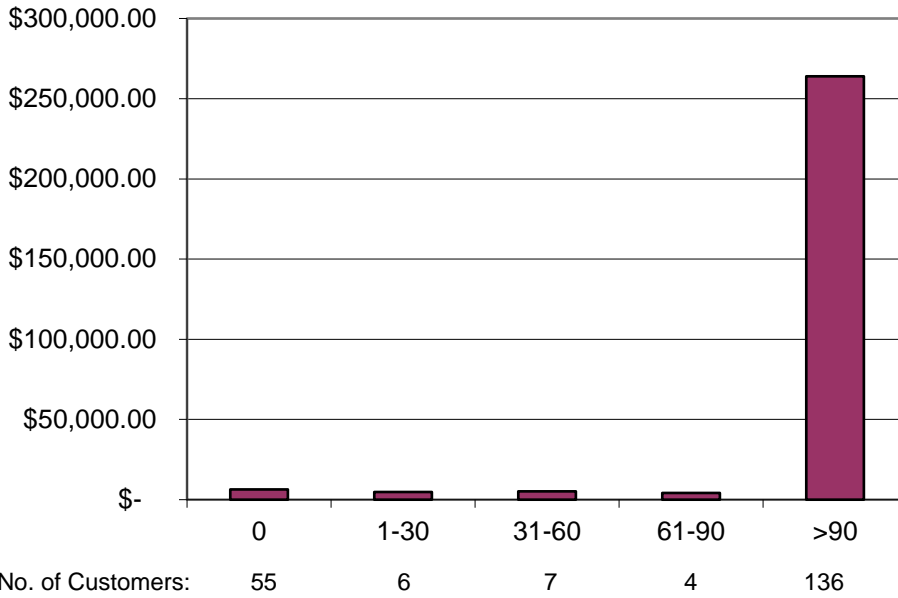
The current residential customer count is as follows:

Availability Aging Report for VANCE COUNTY

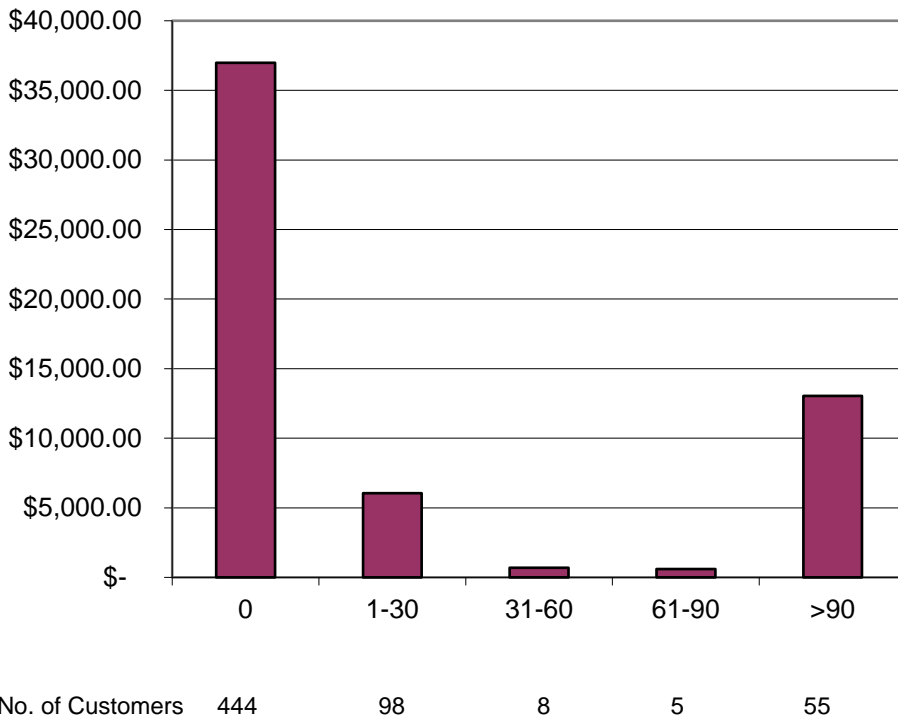

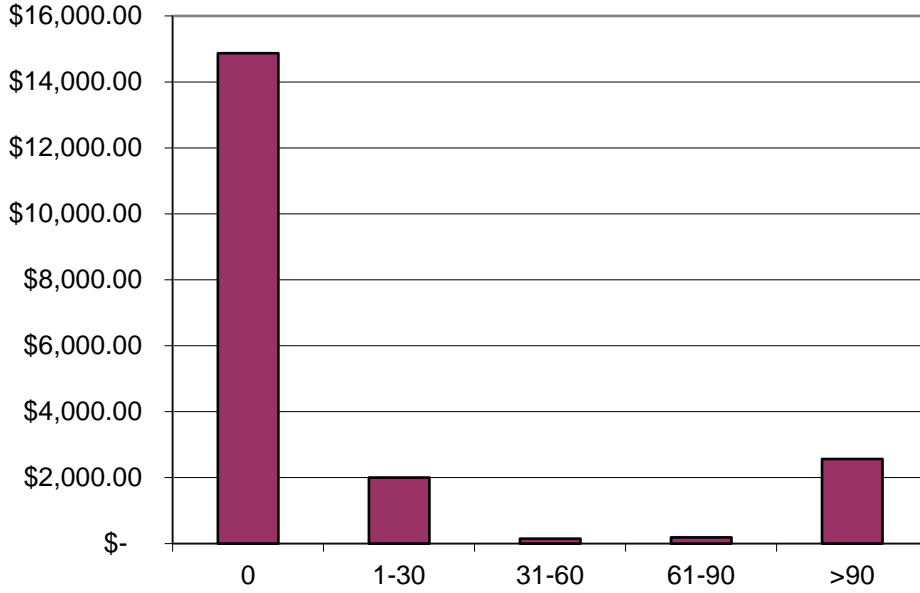

Committee Reports and Recommendations

Planning/Environmental Committee

Board of Equalization and Review. The committee (Brummitt, Feimster and Kelly/absent) met on February 26, 2024 to review GS 105-322, Article 21. This statute allows the Board of County Commissioners to appoint a separate committee to serve as the Board of E&R. Staff has already done research and found that the counties that provided data are split about 50/50 as it relates to members of their Board of E&R. The committee and the County Manager both recommend keeping the Board of E&R as the Board of County Commissioners due to timing constraints. GS 105-322, Article 21 states that the resolution would need to be passed on the first Monday of March in order to appoint new members to the Board of E&R. This does not provide sufficient time for board vacancy announcements, recruitment, and appointment of those new members by the first Board of E&R meeting, which will take place the first Monday in April.

Properties Committee

Land Donation Update. The committee (Taylor, Brummitt, and Alston) met on February 26, 2024 to review a request from Mr. Arthur Faulkner for Vance County to accept 32.63 acres of land and a farmhouse. Wykia Macon, Extension Director, presented additional documentation with data maps and other potential uses of the land. The committee has asked staff to continue to do more research. Staff has done some research with other jurisdictions and that information is below.

- **City of Havelock:** recommend getting a phase 1 environment assessment on the property before it is accepted.
- **Edgecombe County:** unless there is a specific need and use for it, they do not accept donated property.

County Office Building Safety. The committee discussed employee safety at the County Office Building. There is known unlawful activity in the area and safety is a priority for the County Manager as well as the Board of County Commissioners. The committee has asked staff to obtain a quote on cameras and keycard access relocation to the building. **\$14,869.25.** This cost includes the following:

Replace door with single acting glass door with panic hardware; relocate the existing card reader from stairwell to storefront door at main entrance; convert new panic hardware to electronic locking hardware; install door contact on new door; install a video intercom door station on the front door; install two video intercom desk stations; test door and video intercom for proper operation upon completion. *Recommendation: County Manager requests use of contingency funds in the amount of **\$14,869.25** to cover the cost of the above recommendations to the extension building.*

Abbott Subdivision: The committee reviewed a request from Pastor John Miles for assistance with road repairs in Abbott subdivision. The County Manager provided information to the committee as it relates to research that was done on orphan roads back in spring 2023. Similar requests from other property owners have gone before the Board of County Commissioners

and assistance was not provided. Staff will work with those property owners to see if there are any other funding opportunities. *For Your Information.*

Administration Building Handicap Accessibility. The committee reviewed a request received from a citizen as it relates to handicap accessibility and signage for the Administration Building. Staff will get with maintenance staff to ensure proper signage moving forward. *For Your Information.*

Human Resources Committee

Background Check Policy. The committee (Faines, Feimster and Taylor) met on February 26, 2024 to consider a recommended Background Check Policy for applicants with Vance County. The county has historically processed background checks on potential new hires but without a policy in place. Information about an individual's past criminal conduct is collected to: preserve public trust; promote a safe work environment for employees and members of the public; determine their suitability for employment; and promote the protection of the County's property. The County seeks to promote a fair, consistent, confidential, and non-discriminatory method of obtaining and using criminal information for employment decisions. *Recommendation: County Manager requests approval of the policy with an effective date of March 4, 2024.*

Personnel Policy. The committee considered review of the current personnel policy. Vance County currently contracts with Catapult who provides HR employment law related assistance to the county. Catapult will review the current policy for Federal, State, and local compliance. *For Your Information.*

Vance County Criminal Background Check Policy

Effective Date: March 4, 2024

The County believes that employing and retaining a well-qualified, diverse workforce is essential to the overall success of this organization. Criminal background checks are an important tool in determining the suitability of an individual for initial employment with the County.

PURPOSE

Information about an individual's past criminal conduct is collected to: preserve public trust; promote a safe work environment for employees and members of the public; determine their suitability for employment; and promote the protection of the County's property. The County seeks to promote a fair, consistent, confidential, and non-discriminatory method of obtaining and using criminal information for employment decisions.

SCOPE

This policy applies to all applicants of Vance County.

DEFINITIONS

- Background Check – Process of acquiring records related to an individual's past criminal conduct.
- Background Check Release Form – A form completed by an applicant for any eligible position that authorizes a background check prior to employment.
- Fair Credit Reporting Act (FCRA) – Federal law that regulates the collection, dissemination, and use of consumer credit information, including criminal background reports.
- Disciplinary Action – An action initiated by a supervisor to address and correct an employee's unacceptable behavior and/or performance.
- Legal Actions/Proceedings – Any criminal proceedings including, but not limited to, arrests, convictions, guilty pleas, no contest pleas, restraining orders, warrants, and criminal charges.
- Safety Sensitive Position – A position where an essential function of the job includes safety sensitive responsibilities. Safety sensitive responsibilities are those that pose a risk to the safety of the employee or others under which a momentary lapse of attention or judgement could have disastrous consequences without the opportunity to rectify the mistake. This definition also includes any position that meets the Federal Highway Administration's definition in 49 CFR Part 382 for CDL operators and those that maintain CDL required equipment.
- Security Sensitive Position – A position where the employee's duties involve handling cash or sensitive financial information.

ORGANIZATIONAL RULES

All applicants for employment are subject to a criminal background check.

An arrest, in and of itself, does not establish that criminal conduct has occurred. Accordingly, the fact that an individual was arrested should never be the sole basis of an adverse employment action. The County may take adverse employment action based on information showing that the individual actually committed

the conduct underlying the arrest. A conviction, guilty plea or no contest plea shall serve as sufficient evidence that the individual engaged in the alleged criminal conduct.

The County shall not treat background check information differently for individuals based on their race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, national origin, political affiliation, marital status, citizenship status, disability, genetic information, veteran status, age, or other legally protected status.

The County recognizes that the use of background check information may disproportionately impact some individuals based on their membership in a protected class. Accordingly, the County will take steps to ensure that any use of background check information will be job related and consistent with business necessity. The County finds that reporting convictions for nonviolent, drug-related offenses such as possession, manufacture, or distribution of controlled substance to only be job related and consistent with business necessity for those positions that are deemed safety-sensitive.

PROCEDURES

Pre-Employment Background Checks

The hiring department or human resources will only have applicants who have received a contingent offer to sign a background check release form during the post interview paperwork process.

Any applicant refusing to authorize the background check will have their contingent offer rescinded.

If the background check does not reveal any prior criminal activity, the applicant will remain eligible for hire pending the results of other pre-employment requirements. However, if the background check reveals a conviction, guilty or no contest plea, the HR Director in conjunction with the Department Head and the County Manager or his/her designee shall determine the degree to which the criminal conduct is related to the position.

When determining whether to reject an applicant because of prior criminal activity, the HR Director and County Manager shall consider the:

- nature and gravity of the criminal activity;
- time that has passed since the criminal activity;
- duties that the applicant will perform;
- applicant's opinion on the accuracy of the background check;
- facts surrounding the criminal activity;
- number of criminal offenses;
- age of the applicant at the time of the criminal activity;
- applicant's employment history before and after the criminal activity;
- applicant's rehabilitation efforts;
- applicant's employment or character references; and
- applicant's participation in a bonding program

If the decision is to reject the applicant because of their prior criminal activity, the County shall comply with the requirements of the Fair Credit Reporting Act. First, Human Resources will send the applicant a "pre-adverse action" letter. This letter must contain a copy of the background check relied on by the County. Also, the letter must provide the applicant with a summary of their rights under the Fair Credit Reporting Act. HR must give the applicant five (5) business days to review and dispute any inaccurate information in

the background check. After the five (5) business days have passed, HR must provide the applicant with an “adverse action” letter. This letter should provide the applicant with: the contact information of the agency performing the background check; a statement notifying them that the agency performing the background check did not make the adverse employment decision; a notice that the applicant is entitled to receive a free copy of the background check; and a notice that the applicant has a right to dispute the information in the background check with the agency.

WHEREAS, Vance County (hereafter ‘the County’) and the City of Henderson (hereafter ‘the City’) have a long history of coordination with respect to economic development efforts and joint planning initiatives in several identified industrial areas in and around the extraterritorial jurisdictional boundary of the City; and

WHEREAS, there are two (2) parcels of property, further identified utilizing Vance County Parcel Identification Numbers 0403 02018 (75.19 acres) and 0413 02017 (118.5 acres) owned by the Kerr Tar Regional Economic Development Corporation (hereafter ‘the Property’) located within both the planning jurisdictions of the County and the City; and

WHEREAS, the Property is split zoned between Vance County and the City of Henderson as follows:

- PIN 0413 02018: Approximately 62.29 acres (83%) of the Property is subject to County zoning regulations while 17% (12.9 acres) are subject to City of Henderson zoning regulations,
- PIN 0413 02017: Approximately 95.02 acres (81%) is subject to County zoning regulations while 19% (23.47 acres) are subject to City of Henderson zoning regulations; and

WHEREAS, NC General Statute 160D-202(h) allows for property within the planning and development regulation jurisdiction of more than one local government to be assigned exclusive planning and development jurisdiction by mutual agreement of the local jurisdictions and with the written consent of the landowner; and

WHEREAS, both County and City officials are in receipt of a written request by the Kerr Tar Regional Economic Development Corporation to assign exclusive planning and development jurisdiction of the Property to the County for development review purposes; and

WHEREAS, both County and City officials have determined, by mutual agreement, the Property should be developed under County land use and development regulations. This agreement has been reached pursuant to the provisions of NC General Statute 160D-202 and the available authority pursuant to Article 20 of Chapter 160A of the General Statutes; and

WHEREAS, this mutual agreement shall be evidenced by a resolution formally adopted by each governing board and recorded with the Vance County Register of Deeds upon final adoption by the County and City.

NOW BE IT ORDAINED by the Vance County Board of Commissioners:

1. The County is in receipt of a resolution adopted by the City of Henderson Council formally relinquishing planning and development authority over the relevant portion of the Property having Parcel Identification Numbers 0413 02018 and 0413 02017, consistent with the written request of the owner, Kerr Tar Regional Economic Development Corporation;
2. Vance County shall extend existing Light Industrial (LI) general use zoning over the Property previously within the extraterritorial jurisdiction (ETJ) of the City of Henderson and will now treat the tracts of land as whole tracts for Planning purposes as if a portion of the tracts were never split and under the extraterritorial planning jurisdiction for the City of Henderson.
3. Directs staff to initiate, if necessary, any formal Zoning Map Amendment proceedings to update the Official Zoning Map for Vance County such that development of the Property shall abide by development standards associated with the LI general use zoning district as detailed in the Vance County Zoning Ordinance;
4. With this adoption of this RESOLUTION, the Vance County Board of Commissioners formally acknowledges and accepts the transfer of development authority for the Property under the authority of NCGS 160D-202(h).

Beginning the second week in February students created Chicken Club Salad for the Fuel with a Purpose lesson.

EFNEP addresses overweight and obesity by helping families to prepare and eat more meals at home. Chicken Club Salad

Ingredients:

- 1 cup pasta (uncooked whole wheat, small, such as macaroni or rotelle)
- 6 cups Romaine lettuce (well washed and torn, or spinach)
- 2 cups green peppers, fresh, chopped (or choose a combination of bell peppers, celery, cauliflower florets, cucumber, carrots*)
- 2 cups tomatoes (chopped)
- 1 1/2 cups cubed cooked skinless chicken (1/2 pound skinless, boneless chicken)
- 1/2 cup Italian dressing
- 1 egg (hard cooked, optional)
- 1/4 cup cheese (shredded, or cheese crumbles)

Directions:

1. Wash hands with soap and water.
2. Cook pasta according to package directions; drain and cool.
3. Place 1 1/2 cups of the Romaine lettuce in each of 4 large bowls or plates.
4. Combine chopped vegetables, chicken, and pasta.
5. Add dressing; toss lightly to coat. Divide evenly among the 4 bowls.
6. Top each serving with a few egg slices, if desired, and 1 tablespoon of the shredded cheese.

02/01/24- A widow was awarded a monthly tax-free VA compensation payment of \$1,955.21 starting February 2024 and received a retroactive payment of \$12,061.06.

02/07/24- On March 13, 2024, Bailey and I will participate in the 2nd Annual Community Resource Festival at Vance-Granville Community College Civic Center from 10 am-3 pm.

Also, Bailey and I will attend the North Carolina Department of Military and Veterans Affairs Conference from March 18th - 22nd, 2024.

02/09/24- In mid-January, the VA announced that its new guaranteed-acceptance life insurance program, VA Life has issued more than \$950 million in coverage to 31,400 veterans in its first year.

VALife was launched in January 2023, becoming the first new VA life insurance program for veterans in more than 50 years, extending access to life insurance for millions of veterans. VALife provides up to \$40,000 in whole life insurance to veterans. For all veteran age 80 or under with service-connected disabilities from 0-100%, acceptance in the program is guaranteed, and no medical underwriting is required. Veterans can apply online through VA.gov, and receive an instant decision.

02/16/24- Around one million people with Uniformed Services Identification cards will now be able to renew their ID cards online instead of having to visit an office in person. Most USID cardholders, which include military retirees, reservists, spouses and dependents of U.S. service members, can file their requests online and receive new IDs by mail, according to defense officials.
